

Skeels Dress Code

Our goal is be Godly and Modest
1 Timothy 2:9-10 and 1 Peter 3:3-4

- ALL Clothing(tops and bottoms) must be clean, no rips or tears.
- Tops- tops, dresses and blouses are required to cover the top of the shoulders (straps must be 3" wide) and the midriff (no crop tops). They must not be form fitting, low-cut, backless or have any slits.
- Small logos such as UnderArmor, Nike, Addidas, etc, are acceptable but no graphics with large images, slogans or designs.
- Plain shirts or repeated patterns, with or without a collar are acceptable.
- No hooded sweatshirts.
- Bottoms- Jeans, athletics shorts and pants are acceptable. Athletic bottoms are described as thinner, moisture wicking fabrics. Sweatpants, with thicker material such as fleece are not acceptable.
- Leggings and biker shorts, or any other form fitting pants are not acceptable.
- Shorts, dresses and skirts must be mid-thigh. (The school standard for mid-thigh is one-half of the measured distance from the top of the inseam to the middle of the knee. * Please make allowance for growth. Shorts must be worn underneath dresses if the student is to play on the playground.)
- Christian clothing is encouraged! Skeels apparel may also be worn as long as it meets the above requirements!
- Extreme fashions which call undue attention to the individual or any part of the anatomy in an unwholesome way, are not acceptable
- Shoes must be worn at all times. All shoe types are acceptable except t-post flip flops.
- Hats/Caps are allowed outside but must be removed indoors.
- Hair/Hairstyles must be clean, neatly groomed, and within the normal range of natural hair colors (black, brown, brunette, blonde, and red). No extreme hair styles will be allowed. Hair must not block the eyes and not be a distraction to others or themselves. The School Administration or staff will determine when hair has become extreme or a distraction and expect a parent to take measures to alleviate the distraction. During sports or games, a student with hair longer than below the collar will be required to wear it up so that the student is kept safe from the possibility of the hair being unexpectedly pulled.
- *Please note that parents and volunteers that participate in school events such as field trips or volunteering for SCS must follow these same guidelines*
