Introduction to the day

Elijah finds the presence of God not in earthquake, wind, or fire, but in the sound of sheer silence. When the disciples face a great storm on the sea, they cry out with fear. Jesus says: “Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid.” Amid the storms of life, we gather to seek the calm presence of Christ that soothes our fears. In comforting words of scripture and in the refreshing bread and cup of the eucharist, God grants us peace and sends us forth to be a sign of God’s presence to others.

GOSPEL MESSAGE: Take Heart

Can you recall a time in your life when something happened that was so strange or out of place that your initial reaction was fear? Maybe you doubted what you were experiencing or seeing and even thought, *This is not possible. This can’t be.*

The disciples must have been terrified when they saw something so strange that it should have been impossible—someone walking on water, toward their boat, during a storm. They thought they were seeing a ghost until Jesus said, “Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid” (Matthew 14:27).

Some say seeing is believing, but sometimes belief comes through experiencing. So, with Jesus’ encouragement, Peter stepped out of the boat and began to walk on the water. But when he realized how hard the wind was blowing, Peter started sinking and shouted, “Lord, save me!” Jesus reached out, steadied Peter, and said, “You of little faith, why did you doubt?” (vv. 30-31). Then the storm ended.

We may be more like Peter than we realize. Maybe there are times when it’s relatively easy to trust in God—until we face something unexpected, frightening, or out of our control. Then doubts immediately overwhelm us.

The good news is that Jesus hears our cries and saves us. He is with us in our weakest moments, holding us even as our spirits sink. Take heart—Jesus is always with you, bringing peace amid the storms, faith amid your doubts, and new life out of death.

God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.

FIRST LESSON INTRODUCTION

Elijah quickly plummets from the precipice of victory to the pit of defeat. He defeats the prophets of Baal but quickly flees from the wrath of Queen Jezebel. Finding a cave in the wilderness he battles a deep depression. In the stillness, he

hears God's voice of calm and assurance. Elijah the prophet traveled all the way to Horeb, otherwise known as Mount Sinai, the mountain where Yahweh gave Moses the stone tablets on which were engraved the Ten Commandments. There, Elijah is confronted by God as to why he has deserted God's people. There he had an unusual revelation: he found that he was in the wrong place at the wrong time. Despite his plaintive, self-pitying prayers, Yahweh would not let him cringe in fear for his life but challenged him to undertake a new mission and assured him of assistance from Elisha, his understudy, and others in what he was to do.

LECTOR: FIRST READING: 1 Kings 19:9-18

⁹ At [Horeb, the mount of God,][Elijah] came to a cave and spent the night there. Then the word of the LORD came to him, saying, "What are you doing here, Elijah?" ¹⁰ He answered, "I have been very zealous for the LORD, the God of hosts, for the Israelites have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking my life, to take it away." ¹¹ He said, "Go out and stand on the mountain before the LORD, for the LORD is about to pass by." Now there was a great wind, so strong that it was splitting mountains and breaking rocks in pieces before the LORD, but the LORD was not in the wind, and after the wind an earthquake, but the LORD was not in the earthquake, ¹² and after the earthquake a fire, but the LORD was not in the fire, and after the fire a sound of sheer silence. ¹³ When Elijah heard it, he wrapped his face in his mantle and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave. Then there came a voice to him that said, "What are you doing here, Elijah?" ¹⁴ He answered, "I have been very zealous for the LORD, the God of hosts, for the Israelites have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking my life, to take it away." ¹⁵ Then the LORD said to him, "Go, return on your way to the wilderness of Damascus; when you arrive, you shall anoint Hazael as king over Aram. ¹⁶ Also you shall anoint Jehu son of Nimshi as king over Israel, and you shall anoint Elisha son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah as prophet in your place. ¹⁷ Whoever escapes from the sword of Hazael, Jehu shall kill, and whoever escapes from the sword of Jehu, Elisha shall kill. ¹⁸ Yet I will leave seven thousand in Israel, all the knees that have not bowed to Baal, and every mouth that has not kissed him."

PSALM INTRODUCTION

The psalmist finds assurance that God's steadfast love and human faithfulness will solve problems that confront God's people. It is thought that the psalm was written during the period when Israel's return from exile was imminent or has already occurred. Later, after the exile had ended, it may have had a liturgical function at some national celebration. The psalm consists of three rather distinct parts. Vss. 1-3 celebrates Yahweh's initiative in Israel's history. Vss. 4-7 plead for forgiveness based on the covenant relationship between Yahweh and Israel. Vss. 8-13 recite the blessings that come from the mutual faithfulness of the covenant - forgiveness, righteousness, peace and prosperity.

LECTOR: PSALMODY: Psalm 85:8-13

⁸ I will listen to what the LORD God is saying; for you speak peace to your faithful people and to those who turn their hearts to you.

⁹ **Truly, your salvation is very near to those who fear you, that your glory may dwell in our land.**

¹⁰ Steadfast love and faithfulness have met together; righteousness and peace have kissed each other.

¹¹ **Faithfulness shall spring up from the earth, and righteousness shall look down from heaven.**

¹² The LORD will indeed grant prosperity, and our land will yield its increase.

¹³ **Righteousness shall go before the LORD and shall prepare for God a pathway. Amen.**

SECOND LESSON INTRODUCTION

In this passage Paul clarifies the distinction between the legalism of Judaism to which he himself had once been so fervently dedicated and the living faith as he had found it in Christ. He presents this contrast much as a witness in a law court would testify. To do so he used several quotations from Jewish scriptures to prove his point, thereby virtually turning Judaism on itself.

We must remember that Paul's purpose as an apostle was to declare the saving action of God in Christ and to tell how those who believed could participate in that action. His own bitter experience as a Pharisee had led him to a dead end: total obedience to the law of Moses, however rigorous and sincere, did not give a life of friendship with God. In fact, it did just the opposite, making him realize how far he had failed to achieve that goal. No one could put oneself in a relationship with God through obedience to the law. In Christ, God done for him

and for all humanity what no one else could do. By faith in Christ, right relationship with God is now available to all.

This is the message Paul puts into these few, crisp sentences and quotations from Leviticus 18:5 (vs.5); Deuteronomy 30:12-14 (vss. 6-8). More than that, he says that this life of faith in fellowship with God is for everybody, Jew or Gentile (vs. 12). He quotes two other scripture texts from Isaiah 29:16 and Joel 2:32 to reiterate the point twice over.

LECTOR: SECOND READING: Romans 10:5-15

⁵ Moses writes concerning the righteousness that comes from the law, that “the person who does these things will live by them.” ⁶ But the righteousness that comes from faith says, “Do not say in your heart, ‘Who will ascend into heaven?’ ” (that is, to bring Christ down) ⁷ “or ‘Who will descend into the abyss?’ ” (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). ⁸ But what does it say? “The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart” (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim), ⁹ because if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For one believes with the heart, leading to righteousness, and one confesses with the mouth, leading to salvation. ¹¹ The scripture says, “No one who believes in him will be put to shame.” ¹² For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all and is generous to all who call on him. ¹³ For “everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.” ¹⁴ But how are they to call on one in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in one of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone to proclaim him? ¹⁵ And how are they to proclaim him unless they are sent? As it is written, “How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!”

GOSPEL INTRODUCTION

Vicious storms quickly boil up the waves of Lake Galilee, without warning, as in our text. The disciples were being overcome by the wind and the waves. Jesus

came to their aid. We all experience such storms in our lives. Jesus watches out for his own and is already there, even before we cry out to him. He may or may not quell the storm without but will always subdue the storm of fear within. Faith is never constant; it comes and goes with the varying circumstances of our lives. Peter thus becomes the all too human representative of us all - daring, then doubting, and finally dependent on the Lord for what we need most, our salvation.

P: GOSPEL: Matthew 14:22-33

The holy gospel according to Matthew.

Glory to you, O Lord.

²² [Jesus] made the disciples get into a boat and go on ahead to the other side [of the Sea of Galilee,] while he dismissed the crowds.²³ And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone,²⁴ but by this time the boat, battered by the waves, was far from the land, for the wind was against them.²⁵ And early in the morning he came walking toward them on the sea.²⁶ But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, saying, "It is a ghost!" And they cried out in fear.²⁷ But immediately Jesus spoke to them and said, "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid." ²⁸ Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." ²⁹ He said, "Come." So Peter got out of the boat, started walking on the water, and came toward Jesus. ³⁰ But when he noticed the strong wind, he became frightened, and, beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" ³¹ Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him, saying to him, "You of little faith, why did you doubt?" ³² When they got into the boat, the wind ceased. ³³ And those in the boat worshiped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God."

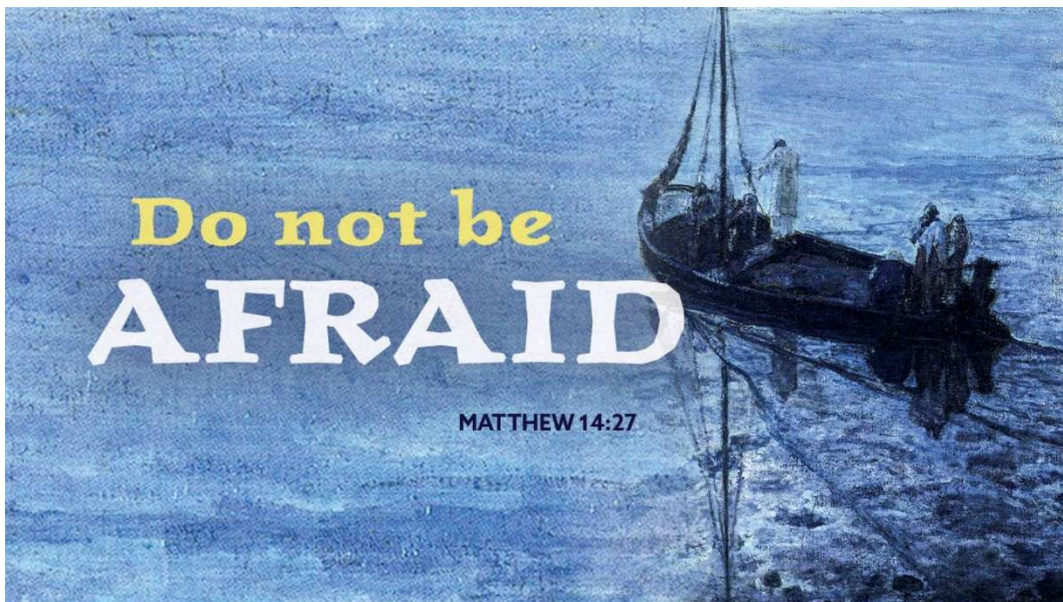
