Introduction to the day

A little faith goes a long way is Jesus' point in the gospel. A mustard seed's-worth of faith has miraculous potential. The patience, tenacity, and endurance required for the life of faith are the blessings received in holy baptism, holy communion, and the word read and proclaimed in this assembly. Anticipate them. Receive them with thanksgiving.

GOSPEL MESSAGE: Faith beyond Measure

Matters of faith are sometimes tricky to comprehend. Faith is a relationship of trust in God. But how do we measure it? It is, by definition, unquantifiable. Of course, that does not stop us from trying. We want to grade our faith, and we look on the outside for signs of a high faith score.

How often do we mistake material success for God's blessing? It is tempting to look at other people and think they must be more faithful than we are because they have or do more than we do. But there is a flaw in that logic. Quite often, looks can be deceiving. We have all suffered disappointment a time or two (or ten!). Life sometimes deals us more than we can handle. We could have faith the size of a bowling ball, but sometimes things just don't work out.

Jesus' understanding of faith seems different from his disciples' or our own. He teaches the apostles that even the tiniest amount of faith possesses transformative power capable of altering entire realities. The "size" of faith is irrelevant.

God gives every one of us a seed of faith. It is a gift freely given, nurtured through baptism and communion. We build confidence in that faith through worship, prayer, and community. While we struggle to measure our faith, we can increase our confidence and willingness to act on it. When that confidence is low, we can lean on those around us. When it is high, we can strive to build up others, encouraging them in their own relationship with God.

God is calling all of us to be willing and confident servants, sending us out into the world to act on our faith. Like a giant, wild bush that grows from the tiniest seed, our faith can grow, spread, and thrive beyond measure.

FIRST LESSON INTRODUCTION

We have here a lament by a prophet of the final period prior to the fall of Jerusalem to the Babylonians in 586 BCE. Unlike earlier prophets, Habakkuk addresses himself directly to God, not to the people. In the second passage, he sets himself up on a watchtower on the city's ramparts to hear God answer to wait for the impending disaster. The irritated prophet poses a series of questions marked with interrogative particles like "how long" or "why." He is not seeking information. A lament is under construction that contains a petition for God's intervention. The cry of "how long" implies that it has been awhile since he started his complaint in vain, and the lack of response from God gives birth to the specter of divine apathy.

LECTOR: FIRST READING: Habakkuk 1:1-4; 2:1-4

¹ The oracle that the prophet Habakkuk saw. ² O LORD, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not listen? Or cry to you "Violence!" and you will not save? ³ Why do you make me see wrongdoing and look at trouble? Destruction and violence are before me; strife and contention arise. ⁴ So the law becomes slack, and justice never prevails. The wicked surround the righteous; therefore judgment comes forth perverted. ^{2:1} I will stand at my watchpost and station myself on the rampart; I will keep watch to see what he will say to me and what he will answer concerning my complaint. ² Then the LORD answered me and said: Write the vision; make it plain on tablets, so that a runner may read it. ³ For there is still a vision for the appointed time; it speaks of the end and does not lie. If it seems to tarry, wait for it; it will surely come; it will not delay. ⁴ Look at the proud! Their spirit is not right in them, but the righteous live by their faithfulness.

PSALM INTRODUCTION

(Please note that our hymnal has the words to all the psalms, beginning on page 335.) In this season of unceasing breaking news in the United States, the phrase “do not fret” may feel impossible for many. This psalm is not starry-eyed advice from one who is out of touch with the realities of the world. It is not meant to deny the validity of people’s emotions or their good desire to do something about the wickedness they see. This exceptional psalm encourages the faithful to put their trust entirely in God and, while waiting patiently for God’s purpose be accomplished, keep their commitment to God’s way.

LECTOR: PSALMODY: Psalm 37:1-9

- ¹ Do not be provoked by evildoers; do not be jealous of those who do wrong.
 - ² **For they shall soon wither like the grass, and like the green grass fade away.**
 - ³ Put your trust in the LORD and do good; dwell in the land and find safe pasture.
 - ⁴ **Take delight in the LORD, who shall give you your heart’s desire.**
 - ⁵ Commit your way to the LORD; put your trust in the LORD, and see what God will do.
 - ⁶ **The LORD will make your vindication as clear as the light and the justice of your case like the noonday sun.**
 - ⁷ Be still before the LORD and wait patiently. Do not be provoked by the one who prospers, the one who succeeds in evil schemes.
 - ⁸ **Refrain from anger, leave rage alone; do not be provoked; it leads only to evil.**
 - ⁹ For evildoers shall be cut off, but those who hope in the LORD shall possess the land.

SECOND LESSON INTRODUCTION

Second Timothy begins—as New Testament letters often do—with a greeting, an expression of gratitude, and a prayer. What follows in the case of 2 Timothy is an exhortation not to be ashamed of the testimony about Jesus, which Paul, in a sense, embodies. There is a clear progression in how Paul frames up that testimony: 1. God saved us. 2. God calls us to a holy calling. 3. God has a grace-purpose: to abolish death, and to bring life and immortality to light.

LECTOR: SECOND READING: 2 Timothy 1:1-14

- ¹ Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, for the sake of the promise of life that is in Christ Jesus,
- ² To Timothy, my beloved child: Grace, mercy, and peace

from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord. ³ I am grateful to God—whom I worship with a clear conscience, as my ancestors did—when I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day. ⁴ Recalling your tears, I long to see you so that I may be filled with joy. ⁵ I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that lived first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, lives in you. ⁶ For this reason I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you through the laying on of my hands, ⁷ for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline. ⁸ Do not be ashamed, then, of the testimony about our Lord or of me his prisoner, but join with me in suffering for the gospel, in the power of God, ⁹ who saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works but according to his own purpose and grace, and this grace was given to us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, ¹⁰ but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior Jesus Christ, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. ¹¹ For this gospel I was appointed a herald and an apostle and a teacher, ¹² and for this reason I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know the one in whom I have put my trust, and I am sure that he is able to guard until that day the deposit I have entrusted to him. ¹³ Hold to the standard of sound teaching that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. ¹⁴ Guard the good deposit entrusted to you, with the help of the Holy Spirit living in us.

GOSPEL INTRODUCTION

Faith like a mustard seed and commending servants for doing their job do not seem to fit well together in these two brief sayings of Jesus. So what is Luke driving at? The example of the slaves who should not be invited to be seated at the master's table (vss.7-10) warns against the possibility of achieving the spiritual goal meeting God's demands through human effort. Spirituality does not operate with a bookkeeping mentality. Merit has to be abandoned in our

approach to God. Thus the two brief pericopes do point to the same conclusion: have faith above all.

P: GOSPEL: Luke 17:1-10

The holy gospel according to Luke.

Glory to you, O Lord.

¹ Jesus said to his disciples, "Occasions for sin are bound to come, but woe to anyone through whom they come! ² It would be better for you if a millstone were hung around your neck and you were thrown into the sea than for you to cause one of these little ones to sin. ³ Be on your guard! If a brother or sister sins, you must rebuke the offender, and if there is repentance, you must forgive. ⁴ And if the same person sins against you seven times a day and turns back to you seven times and says, 'I repent,' you must forgive." ⁵ The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith!" ⁶ The Lord replied, "If you had faith the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you. ⁷ "Who among you would say to your slave who has just come in from plowing or tending sheep in the field, 'Come here at once and take your place at the table'? ⁸ Would you not rather say to him, 'Prepare supper for me; put on your apron and serve me while I eat and drink; later you may eat and drink'? ⁹ Do you thank the slave for doing what was commanded? ¹⁰ So you also, when you have done all that you were ordered to do, say, 'We are worthless slaves; we have done only what we ought to have done!' "
