Introduction to the day

“The last enemy to be destroyed is death,” Paul writes. Today Christ is risen, and we gather together with astonishment and joy. Christ is risen, and we have been set free from the bonds of death. Christ is risen, and we are forgiven. Christ is risen, and with the women at the tomb and Peter, we are amazed. Let us rejoice: Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

GOSPEL MESSAGE: Memory and Hope

Of all the Sundays for Jesus to be absent from the gospel story! How can he be missing on Easter? Go figure.

Since Jesus is nowhere to be found, the women who go to the tomb have no evidence of the resurrection but only the testimony of two mysterious figures: “Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again” (Luke 24:5-7).

And they remembered.

The women’s memory is more than simple recall. Their sudden recollection of Jesus’ prophecy implies a deeper level of comprehension. And with new insight into the bewildering events they have witnessed comes a stirring of hope for what is to come.

The Akan people of Ghana in West Africa give us the wisdom of *sankofa*, the principle that by reaching back, we may move forward. The *sankofa* proverb teaches, “It is not taboo to go back and fetch what you forgot.” We face the future by grasping the past.

That is a good way to describe Christians’ confession of faith. We are all like the women at the tomb on Easter morning. We have no evidence of the resurrection, but only the testimony we have received from others, all the storytellers and saints throughout the generations. Recalling their witness, we proclaim the Easter promise again today. Memory and hope go hand in hand.

So remember, beloved. Remember: where even two or three of you are gathered, the living Christ will be there with you. Remember: blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh. Remember: if Christ has gone to prepare a place for you, he will come again and take you to himself, so that where he is, there you may be also.

CHILDREN'S CHAT: *A Different Kind of Bulb*

P: WORD

God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.

FIRST LESSON INTRODUCTION

To appreciate today's first lesson, we need to understand what has preceded it. First of all, this is a time in the early church when the first Christians were all

Jewish converts. Gentiles were still considered to be outside the covenant God made with His people. This is before Paul began his outreach to non-Jews. In the village of Caesarea, there was a Roman centurion, Cornelius. We don't know the basics of his beliefs but Luke does record for us that he was a devout, reverent man. One afternoon, he has a vision, telling him to send to the city of Joppa for a man called Peter.

At the same time, Peter is on the roof of the building where he is staying. He has a vision of a large sheet coming down, filled all kinds of animals that Jews were prohibited from eating. He protests when a voice tells him to kill and eat. The voice tells him, "What God has made clean, you must not call profane." (Acts 10: 15,16).

At the same time, Cornelius' agents arrive and Peter goes with them. He meets the centurion who explained that he was instructed to send for Peter to learn what God has to say to them. Peter interprets his vision with the statement, "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who reveres him and does what is right is acceptable to him (vv. 34,35). So it is that the story of Easter becomes *everyone's* story.

LECTOR: FIRST READING: Acts 10:34-43

³⁴ Peter began to speak to [Cornelius and his household]: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, ³⁵ but in every people anyone who fears him and practices righteousness is acceptable to him. ³⁶ You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. ³⁷ That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: ³⁸ how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. ³⁹ We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree, ⁴⁰ but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, ⁴¹ not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. ⁴² He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³ All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

PSALM INTRODUCTION

This psalm may have had its origin as a song of gratitude for deliverance from a tight spot. This song of victory may have been composed to celebrate some unknown military triumph. This psalm shows us how to read the Bible. It is a song of victory. Jesus embodies this psalm of victory.

²² The stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone.

²³ **By the LORD has this been done; it is marvelous in our eyes.**

SECOND LESSON INTRODUCTION

If you want to convey the significance of Christ's death and resurrection for all the baptized at Easter, it is important to add an Epistle reading to the Gospel. The Epistles are where death and resurrection cease to be only something about Jesus, and become real for the lives of Jesus's followers. This short reading from Colossians offers a beautiful companion to either of the Gospels chosen for this year. Colossians makes the bold claim that believers in Jesus have died with Christ in baptism and have also been raised with him as a present reality.

LECTOR: SECOND READING: Colossians 3:1-4

¹ If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ² Set your minds on the things that are above,

not on the things that are on earth, ³ for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴ When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

Word of God, word of life.

Thanks be to God.

Please stand for the gospel

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION (ELW p. 151)

Alleluia. Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. Alleluia.

GOSPEL INTRODUCTION

Just as the crucifixion narrative echoes Jesus' temptation in Matthew, so the resurrection highlights themes first raised at Jesus' birth. Herod reacted to the threatening announcement that a new king had been born by trying to exterminate him, sending soldiers to kill all the babies in the region.

After the crucifixion, when the religious and civil authorities have at last succeeded in their quest to kill Jesus, they react to the possibility of his resurrection by sending soldiers to seal the tomb and guard his dead body but the God who shakes the earth cannot be stopped by armed guards and an official seal. The story that begins with fear ends with overwhelming joy. Jesus' birth is shadowed by many deaths, but Jesus' death brings the promise of resurrection life for all.

P: GOSPEL: Matthew 28:1-10

The holy gospel according to Matthew.

Glory to you, O Lord.

¹ On the first day of the week, at early dawn, [the women] came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. ² They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³ but when they went in, they did not find the body. ⁴ While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. ⁵ The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. ⁶ Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, ⁷ that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again." ⁸ Then they remembered his words, ⁹ and returning from the

tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. ¹⁰ Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. ¹¹ But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. ¹² But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened.
