Here at Clovie we believe that Jesus is in the business of restoring all things, bringing life and freedom to all people through the power of His death on the cross and His resurrection. The Apostle Paul speaks of Jesus this way in Colossians 1:19-20: "For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross."

This focus on restoration has seen us participate with God in seeing the following in 2022: 28 people putting their trust in Jesus for the first time; 9 people being baptised and going public with their faith; 164 Bibles being given out to people in our community who are seeking God; an education trainer being funded in Nepal for a year; 11 slaves being freed through the work of IJM; the Clovie Gawler partnership moving forward in


faith; and our ongoing commitment to serving the local community through Pathway Community Centre and Quench Café.

SAYING YES TO JESUS!

In the middle of 2021, I was called by God as a non-Christian to the church, at a time when I was lost and seeking answers and understanding. I felt I needed to ask for forgiveness as I thought I must've done something terribly wrong to have been faced with so many challenges in my life at that time. I was fortunate that Roger was here and was able to hear me, comfort me, and pray for me. The solace provided by Roger left a lasting effect. I really considered choosing faith on this day and left with a Bible.

SAYING YES TO JESUS!

It has been a joy to see God continue to draw children to Himself. We have seen 7 kids say "Yes" to Jesus for the first time this year! We have also handed out several Kids Bibles, devotions, and next steps packs that will help kids to continue their faith journey. We celebrate the 2 children that were baptized this year, as they went public with their faith.

Each week, one year 5 is dropped off to church as her family doesn't yet attend Clovie. It is a joy to see her now inviting friends along to Clovie Kids. During this term we were able to give her a Bible and Devotion. When she arrived one Sunday, she shared with us that she prayed for the first time during the week! It is wonderful to be part of her faith journey.



REACHING COMMUNITY FAMILIES

In 2022 we hosted several outreach events with a focus on reaching and connecting with people who might not yet know Jesus. In March we had a Father and Son Night, with 60 Dads and their sons. They came together for a night of fun and building relationships with their kids and with other dads. Mark and Ben Heard shared a Gospel message and encouraged our dads to be real, humble and loving.

In October we had Mother Daughter Night, led by 'Miss Scribbles', who stepped us through painting a work of art. Over 50 people attended, which included 9 families from the local community. One grandma from the Heights School community came along with her beautiful granddaughter who has been coming to Clovie Kids. The Inglis girls shared from Psalm 139:13-14 about how we are fearfully and wonderfully made.

In November we had our Gingerbread Night, with a record attendance of 125 women! Over

70 of these were from the local community. It was a night of creativity and fun, including a Gospel message shared by Bronwyn Harvey. Her focus was the true hope we can find in God.







REACHING BEYOND CLOVIE

The planting of a seed creates an opportunity to Reach others! Our Life Group Seminar in 2021 gave Richard Hawke time to share with leaders about a Reaching Beyond opportunity in the prison ministry he is involved with. This led to a great connection with one of our Groups in 2022.

Bob's* story: Bob came to Christ at Adelaide Remand Centre soon after being incarcerated in 2021. After reading the "Word For Today" devotional, he realised God wanted to have a relationship with him. He was followed up by a chaplain and received a Bible. Bob was hungry to read from the outset, especially the Bible and Christian biographies. He began sharing his faith early on with other inmates, and was dubbed "the priest" by other prisoners in his unit. Bob continues to be a great influence for the gospel in the environment God has placed him.

Bob was accepted into the Breaking Free program and as part of that program has been steadily engaging with Peter Ochse.

As a result of Peter's business background, and the connection made with Richard in the LG Seminar in 2021, Peter was approached in 2022 to connect with Bob. After some correspondence early on, they connected on the phone. Richard successfully introduced Peter to Bob at the regional prison on a public visit. Peter's comment after meeting Bob for the first time was "I'm very impressed". His Life Group pray for Bob on a regular basis.

QUENCH CAFÉ BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS

A key focus for us at Quench has been building relationships with our volunteer team, particularly those who are from the local community. Through relationship, we have been able to bless them and show them what our personal relationship with Jesus looks like. Some of our volunteers regularly join us to pray for the day. We've noticed a general openness towards talking about God and receiving prayer, which is significant. We are celebrating that at least one volunteer will be attending the next Alpha Course!



A FRIEND WITH PURPOSE

Kids COACH (Creating Opportunities and Casting Hope) is a mentoring program where volunteers serve as a friend with purpose for one hour, once a week, in our local state school. Kids COACH has continued to make a difference in the life of each student. 9 Mentors served this year, with one Mentor taking on a second student. Many connection stories come out of Kids COACH. Teachers who have a Mentor coming to their classroom to connect with a student, often let us know about the difference the Mentors make. We also have the opportunity to phone many Kids COACH families to offer further support. Through COACH we continue to have Mentee children going to Blast; a lunch time program where they hear about Jesus' love and acceptance for each one of them. We celebrate that some COACH Kids have come to JAM, our outreach program that runs once a month here at Clovie for year 5 and

6 children. We are also celebrating a Mentee who is about to graduate from our Kids COACH Program and is now coming each Friday to Echo Youth. He has built friendships with other students and is starting to build trust with his new youth leaders for 2023.

Through Kids COACH, we continue to grow trust, connection, and relationships. We have been successful in gaining a grant from Baptist Care to expand into Family COACH in 2023.

SIMEON'S BAPTISM TESTIMONY

Quite simply, I don't know why it's taken me this long to get here.

My life has been a series of blessings. I have been incredibly blessed to know the goodness of God almost all my life, as the by-product of two parents who know and love God

They were and are flawed human beings pressing into God despite divorce, death, mental health issues, family conflict, and financial concerns. My parents' own seemingly consistent faith showed me how God's goodness leads us through easy, comfortable times and difficult, painful times.

There is no one moment that I can pinpoint where I first heard the Gospel or reacted to it. Maybe there was one but I don't remember it. When I look back, I was consistently trying to better understand the faith of those around me, including family and friends.

Again, I have been incredibly blessed to know an array of intelligent and intellectuallygifted people of faith

throughout my life who have shown me that God doesn't just appeal to our hearts but also to our heads. This group were particularly formational as I reached high school and traversed university - eager to question everything I knew with the arrogance of youth. It's only as a result of these individuals that I continued to take my faith seriously, during this intellectual and cultural awakening. This sound foundation has empowered me to take my faith into my professional life.

Finally, my life to this point comes full circle. I get to be the parent who does their best to try and model faithfulness, love and discipline to my 3 beautiful kids. God continues to challenge and convict me - to be a better person, a better father and a better husband. I've come to learn to appreciate this. Despite my contrarian nature, I find myself here submitting to His example. If Jesus can submit to baptism in his early 30's, I should feel blessed to do the same.

ADDITIONAL NEEDS MINISTRY

We know all people hold a special valuable place in the body of Christ, regardless of their ability. Jesus and His church are for everyone. We have started an Additional Needs ministry called "Cherish". These children and their families are a treasured gift to our church community, and we want to find ways to help and walk alongside them. So far, we have 11 families who participate in Cherish. In 2022 we shared a meal together, and we hosted a conversation on Zoom with Robyn Campbell, mother of three boys on the autism spectrum, who has a passion for Additional Needs ministry. She runs workshops to increase awareness about disability, autism and neurodiversity. The journey of raising three neurodiverse children has not always been easy, although with God by her side, she was able to share some breakthroughs and lessons along the way. We currently have 6 children partnered with a 1:1 carer when they attend Clovie Kids on a Sunday. We are excited to see where God will grow this ministry in 2023!





2022 PING-PONG-A-THON

In 2022, we raised \$17,760.50, reaching a new record for Clovie! These funds will be used to free and protect 11 people from slavery and exploitation.



JOINING THE FIGHT AGAINST SLAVERY

In January this year, God stirred my heart for Ping-Pong-a-Thon. As part of Pong this year, I was going to challenge myself to do 12 hours; however, in the early part of the year, I tore my ACL, and underwent a knee reconstruction. Despite this injury, I still wanted to continue to raise funds and awareness. I leveraged a variety of my online communities, such as YouTube and LinkedIn, to let people know about slavery in our world

today. I also spoke to people off the cuff in my workplace, strangers and even people at the gym. Through Pong this year, I was personally able to raise \$2,800. Since Pong ended, I have continued to have conversations about how it went, and I have connected with others who want to address the issue of slavery in our world today.

UPSKILLING OUR SENIORS

In Term 3, Clovie hosted a series of Seniors Tech and IT Support Lessons for people who needed to upskill or learn more about the use of technology. Our trainer was extremely patient and able to help with different questions and problems. We had a small but enthusiastic group of people who improved their skills and became more confident in using this technology.

A NEW INVESTMENT IN MARRIAGES

This year we launched The Alpha Marriage Course. We ran it on Zoom for 7 weeks, with a purpose to invest in and grow healthy marriages. 14 couples attended, all at various ages and stages, each valuing the excellent content presented each week. We are looking forward to running this course again in 2023, as it is such a valuable investment into a lifelong relationship. One of this year's couples shared this:

"The leadership led in such a 'real' and 'open' way that often helped to lighten the mood for us and opened a door to have similar or more frank conversations about sometimes difficult topics. Being on Zoom meant we didn't feel awkward about having to be with the whole group in person, as many of the topics were quite personal. We appreciated the regular



encouragement to keep the conversation going and being open about seeking support from our Pastors or other supports. Knowing our Pastors were praying for us as a couple, was so appreciated. We both really valued this time and have already agreed to keep regular date nights. We have also discussed ways we can be more honest in our conversations around certain things we need to share moving forward."



SEEING LIVES RESTORED

In 2022 we launched Restore ministry, with a heart to see people facing big life challenges find healing and restoration to the abundant life that Jesus offers. This year we introduced the Bereavement Journey and the Marriage Course and again ran Valiant Man and Divorce Care, with a total of 40 participants. Each course saw people deeply impacted by the opportunity to come together with others who were facing the same life challenges around addiction, relationships, grief, loss, and pain. One participant in Divorce Care said "I no longer feel so condemned and isolated."

Another reflected, "Divorce Care helped me heal faster than I would have otherwise." An attendee of The Bereavement Journey experienced a significant breakthrough with her anger. Two people from the general community appreciated the time so much that they plan to return next year. Across each course, we observed people making very significant progress in their healing journey and relationships.



Pathway Community Centre exists to give hope to those experiencing tough times.

We support those in our community facing relationship breakdown, domestic violence, drug abuse, homelessness, unemployment, grief, addiction, bankruptcy and illness.

We work collaboratively with other churches, ministries, and organisations who directly support vulnerable and marginalised people. We offer financial support with No Interest Loan Schemes (NILS) and provide counselling support and inclusion for people experiencing hardship in the community.

According to Food Bank's 2022 Hunger Report, in South Australia in 2022, more than 130,000 households do not have enough money to put food on the table every day. That's more than 78,000 kids growing up in homes without enough food. In South

Australia, families that have never needed food support before, now require assistance to make ends meet.

At a time when food insecurity is affecting so many households across our state, Pathway has been able to rescue 1,256,000 kilograms of food and distribute 55,000 food hampers in 2022.

Pathway exists for the mother who contacted us because she didn't have any food left in the house and it was three days until her next payment. For the single father battling cancer while trying to care for his young daughter at home. For the women who come in every week, escaping domestic violence, and trying to find a safe place for their children.

Pathway exists for every family who is working so hard to make ends meet and fighting to keep their head above water and feeling the crushing pressure as they watch their costs of living increase beyond what they can manage.

For every one of our clients there is a story, and it is our great privilege to give them essential items, while treating them with dignity and reflecting to them the value that Jesus places on each of them.


