SEEK FIRST



As we reflect on 2025, let's give thanks to God for all He has done in and through His church in the last year. It has been a year marked by faith, generosity, growth, and a deepening commitment to God's mission as we've focused on seeking Jesus first. Some highlights wrapped around our God Sized Dream (GSD) include:

REACH – INTRODUCING PEOPLE TO JESUS

This year, we celebrated 43 first-time commitments and 40 recommitments, with faith taking root in many hearts. We placed 298 Bibles into the hands of people across our community, trusting God's Word to continue its work. We saw Alpha engage over 30 people across in-person, online, Pathway, and a Chinese course. Our Red Frogs presence at the local university continued to develop, COACH operated in three local schools (Modbury West, Highbury, and Evanston Gardens), and multiple DBS groups are now happening at Clovie.

Locally and globally, your generosity has made a powerful impact. Our Heart for the House giving was the highest yet, with over \$210,000 given to God's mission. We also faithfully supported our missionaries through our budget, and we thank God for their ongoing service.

GROW – GOING DEEPER WITH JESUS

We celebrated 27 baptisms across the church and our average weekly attendance grew to 644, a 7% increase from last year, and 74 people connected through our Meet & Greet welcome lunches.

MULTIPLY – RAISING AND RELEASING LEADERS

We rejoiced to see Elijah Hughes commence in the Youth worker role and Ilias Woithe in the Production role, both from within our church. We continued to invest in marketplace leadership formation through Kara Martin and the This Time Tomorrow series. Next year we have 9 interns signed up to grow and develop in their leadership.

EXPAND & INNOVATE – ONE CHURCH, MANY GATHERINGS & DARING TO DREAM

The Clovie Gawler land conversation has begun and will be a key focus as we look toward 2026. In following God into this vision, one of our big challenges is to live into the budget as we follow God on an adventure of faith in seeking land and a home for Clovie Gawler.

Personally, I would like to take a moment to thank our Church Council, staff team, volunteers, and every person who calls Clovie home. I'm so grateful for you and it's a pleasure and privilege to be your Pastor.

ALPHA COURSE ONLINE AND IN PERSON

It's a joy and a privilege to run Alpha each year here at Clovie. This year we ran both online Alpha in Term 2 and in-person Alpha in Term 3.

Five participants attended online Alpha, two of whom had made first time commitments to Jesus at Easter and found the Alpha course an excellent first step in their faith journey. One of the other online Alpha participants shared, "I always believed in God but wanted to understand more about His journey and my own journey in faith. I always had lots of questions and even still do but Alpha has helped me discover more about those questions and how I can gain a better relationship with God."

Our in-person Alpha had 8 participants, all at various stages in their faith journey. One of these participants made a first time commitment and others made significant steps towards knowing Jesus more. Another of the participants shared they were grateful for a safe space to bring their doubts.

As I look back over the course, I'm so grateful for the faithful presence of the Holy Spirit, leading and guiding the teams week to week and creating a wonderful space for healthy faith discussions. Seeds are planted and God continues to work.

REDISCOVERING FAITH AND HOPE



Tanya Duns was baptised at Clovie Modbury North in July 2025. This is the message she shared.

“My life before I truly came to know and follow Jesus has had a lot of

ups and downs. As a child, I was aware of Jesus through my Nanna and Aunty and mum’s faith. As a teenager, I attended church and youth group. I have always believed in Jesus, however, I turned my back on him for many years.

During this time, I lived my life how I pleased, and this came with its consequences: some unfortunate volatile relationships and an unplanned pregnancy, which in turn led me to blame Jesus for what were my poor choices. However, I still felt Jesus gently calling me to come back to him, but I was stubborn.

My life didn’t seem too bad, despite my anger and resentment, but I worked hard to feel good about myself and thankfully was blessed to achieve a lot of personal goals, such as; completing university to become a Registered Nurse, getting married and having children, the houses, the cars and many travel journeys along the way. Looking back now, I can see that this was all performance based, because due to my past mistakes, I did not feel worthy of receiving Jesus and His unconditional love.

After suffering though some recent deaths

in the family and enduring ongoing personal troubles, I realised that I couldn’t continue this exhausting pace of life by myself anymore and something needed to change.

My decision to follow Jesus started last year, when my eldest son asked me if Jesus was real - I said “YES!”. That day I knew I had to make a choice once and for all. I started reading the bible, from Genesis, and learning about God’s perfect design, human brokenness and sin and ultimately Jesus’s sacrifice for us on the cross. Shortly thereafter, I researched some local churches and found Clovie online, where I felt comfort in fellowship and prayer from afar, but I knew Jesus and I wanted more.

One Sunday earlier this year, I took my two boys, Aidan and Austin, to the indoor playground located within Clovie, and had a coffee while they played. A member of the church sat with me and encouraged me to attend with her the following week.

Since then, I have been coming to Clovie almost every week, as well as regularly attending the Discovery Bible Study, and my boys have been going to the kids church. We have been welcomed with open arms and we’re all absolutely loving it! Nowadays, despite my personal troubles, I have found peace and healing through my faith, and the anger and resentment has gone. I still have my moments, but I am filled with hope and confidence, in knowing that Jesus is by my side throughout the good times and the bad.”

"I have only recently started attending the mums' Bible study group on Wednesday mornings, and it's already made such an impact on my life! The biggest and most important impact has been the studies. As our God often does, each study we have had this term has spoken directly into my life circumstances and big questions that week. I've been praying for answers and to hear God speak to me for a long time, and I believe this is one of the ways He is answering that prayer.

In addition to the encouragement my soul gets from the study, I'm so grateful for the hope of new friendships from this group. I came to Clovie as a single mum not knowing anyone else my age or stage of life, and in a big church, while chasing a toddler, it's hard to make new friends. The mums' group has given me an opportunity to meet other women in a similar age/life stage who have been so welcoming and encouraging. Even if we don't know each other well, to have some people who smile and wave at me and my daughter on a Sunday at church has made a huge difference. I no longer feel quite so nervous walking into a room of so many people.

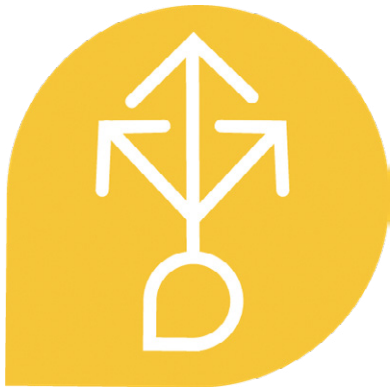
A YEAR OF GROWTH AND COMMUNITY IN YOUNG ADULTS

QUENCH CAFÉ: COMMUNITY COMPASSION

It is a great privilege to embrace our volunteers gifts and also work with other churches in our community. So, when some volunteers from Soul Food joined our team after Soul Food Christian Community closed their café, we looked at how we could honour them and contribute towards and continue to engage with the community they had built relationship with. We decided that one of their former volunteers could make their Pear and Raspberry bread, a signature dish of theirs, and that all profits would go towards Soul Food's Community Meals Program, which is also supported by Pathway. In 2025, we have sold over 250 Pear and Raspberry breads and donated over \$750 to the program. This equates to over 60 meals provided to people in need.



So far this year we have saved other ministries over \$1500 in value provided through discounts, so we can work together as one church. We have also given away \$300 worth of meals to those experiencing homelessness or hardship. This has given us relationships with people and we have been able to connect some of them with Pathway and housing services.

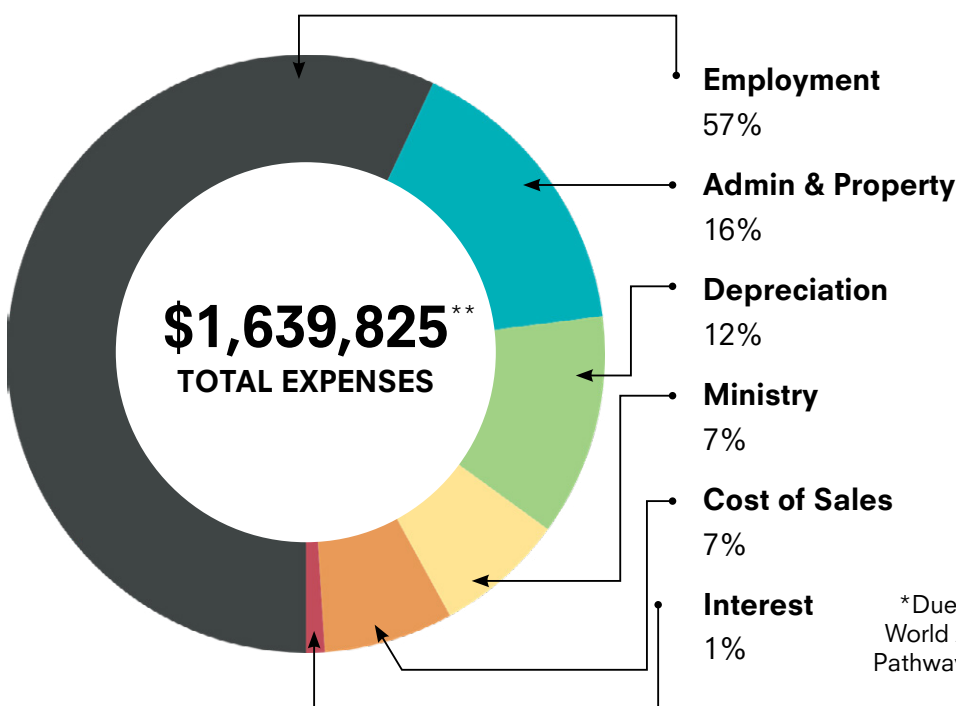

Pathway REACH

PATHWAY DISCOVERY BIBLE STUDY

In 2025 we continued running Discovery Bible Study for our Pathway volunteers. We also ran another Alpha course for our volunteers. Several volunteers expressed a desire to learn how to study the Bible, so we ran an inductive Bible study course. It's been incredible to see our volunteers coming to faith and growing in their relationship with Jesus. Many are learning to study the Word of God and live by faith in their daily lives.

I first came to Pathway as a client, on and off, for a few years. About three years ago, I started working at Pathway, as a volunteer. I didn't really have any expectations - I had stopped working and I just wanted to do something constructive with my time. I also felt that I wanted to give back to my community.

I had spent probably two thirds of my life battling addictions, and the rest, trying to repair the damage to both my life and my soul. I was as far away as possible, from believing in God. I was full of anger, pain and resentment. My life basically was just an existence, not really living.

Everyday that I work at Pathway, I get to see God's amazing hands at work - His care, His love and His compassion. It is not only seeing the food hampers, which are being given to the clients, but it is also seeing how respectfully the clients are being treated. The clients (and it doesn't matter who they might be, or where they have come from) are considered to be valuable members of our society.

I love being able to see such trust put into God (by the managers, supervisors and many of the volunteers), that He does care and that He will provide ... and time and time again I get to see this in action at both Pathway Food Services and the Wellbeing Centre. It really warms my heart.

Unexpectedly, through Pathway, I have found so much more. I have found incredibly good people at Pathway and the Clovie Church - where I feel so comfortable. Again, I get to see God working with His people, in many different areas - spanning from mission work, to caring, not only for vulnerable people in our local communities, in Australia, but also overseas, to learn about what the Pong-A-Thon is doing, by trying to help abolish slavery. I get to see hope being brought back into the world.

Through Pathway, I have discovered an amazing Bible study group, called "The Book Club". I regularly attend these study sessions, and through this, I have learnt so much about God and His goodness. The Book Club is a very special safe place, where we can explore the scriptures at a comfortable pace, in a relaxed atmosphere. Basically, it is a safe environment, where anyone can really ask anything, and they will not be judged for it.

I think that I have grown spiritually so much - I now have a sense of calmness and peace, knowing that pretty much, whatever will come, things will be alright - as it is in God's hands. All we need to do is put our trust and faith in Him and His words.

MORE THAN A SHOP

One of our greatest areas of impact is through our volunteers. Many serve with us for up to 15 hours a week as part of their Centrelink requirements. This provides a wonderful opportunity not only to work alongside them but also to speak into their lives and share how Jesus shapes and influences the way we live and care for others.

Over the past year, we have walked closely with two of our volunteers who experienced the loss of a parent. We stayed in regular contact, offering prayer, encouragement, and practical support. Both shared how deeply they felt cared for and supported during such a difficult season.

Often we don't realise the impact we have on customers until they tell us. One young woman who moved to Adelaide from another country became a regular visitor to the shop. She opened up about her life and the challenges she was facing. We listened and supported her as she navigated life as a new immigrant.

Recently she rushed in, beaming with excitement, eager to share her good news. Her professional qualification had been recognised in Australia and she had secured a job. She was also excited to share how her children and husband were settling in and making a life here. Overflowing with gratitude, she

thanked us for the encouragement and support she had received along the way. Another familiar face in the shop is a young mum who often visits with her bright and chatty daughter. She regularly shares some of the challenges of parenting, and while much has changed since our own parenting days, we enjoy listening, offering encouragement, and reminding her that she is doing a wonderful job.

She often visits Quench Café - Clovie before or after stopping by the shop, which has created natural opportunities to connect her with other ministries at Clovie.

Treasured Op Shop continues to be far more than a place to shop — it is a place where relationships grow, encouragement is shared, and the love of Jesus is lived out in everyday conversations.

A MOMENT OF HEALING AND PRAYER

The following year, I asked her if she would like me to accompany her to the cemetery to which she agreed. There is a memorial there and we found the paver with his name and laid some flowers on it.

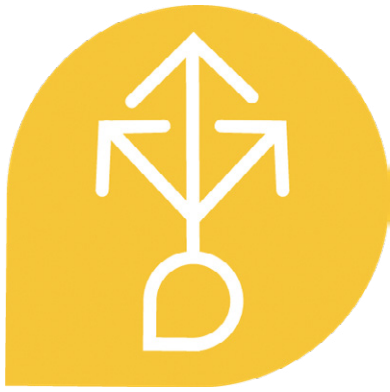
We then located the site where his body had been laid. We hugged, cried and I prayed for her, her precious baby and for God's peace and comfort as she continues to grieve her loss.

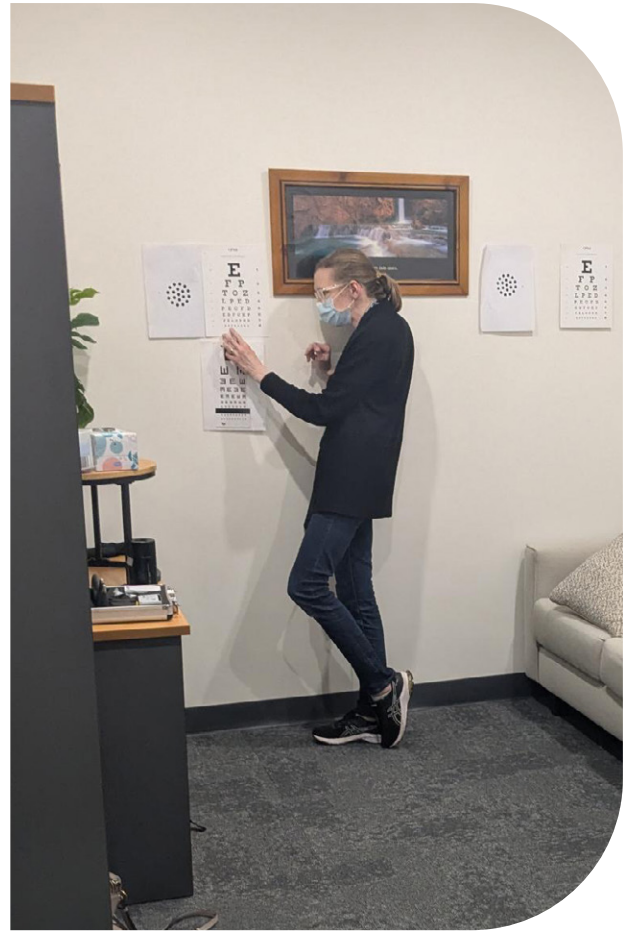

A CENTRE FOR HOPE, HEALING AND HELP

We rejoiced in 2025 to open the Pathway Wellbeing Centre. Through our Wellbeing Centre we are able to offer free and low cost services onsite to help increase community connection and support the holistic wellbeing of our clients.

Completely free services in 2025:

- Financial counselling through Anglicare
- Support to access NDIS through Feros Care
- Community Connections Program through Baptist Care
- No Interest Loan Scheme (NILS)
- Legal Services through Uniting Communities
- Aged Care Support programs and groups through Uniting Communities
- Aged Care Support programs through Life Care
- One Sight eyeglasses clinics

Services with a fee:

- Christian Counselling
- Migration Consultant

We also began running courses and group sessions for our clients. We ran a New Light Empowerment Program for women who have experienced domestic and family violence. We have run multiple free seminars and information sessions for My Aged Care and available supports for seniors.

One of the brave women who attend the New Light Empowerment program shared:

“

I wasn't really sure what to expect when I signed up for the domestic violence course at Pathway, but I'm so glad I did. It's been wonderful connecting with other women who really understand what I'm going through, and I've learnt just how many ways domestic violence can affect our lives—physically, mentally, emotionally, in our relationships, financially, and even spiritually. I was especially interested to learn more about the impact of trauma on the brain and to pick up some new techniques that are already making daily life a bit easier. Having access to a leader who is incredibly knowledgeable and highly qualified has meant the content of the course has been well beyond what I thought it would be. It was also very meaningful that the leaders shared their own vulnerability and lived experience, which made the sessions feel even more genuine and relatable. Both the leader and support person have been so welcoming and genuinely lovely, which made such a difference. I'm really grateful for this experience and feel much more supported and hopeful for the future.

A CLEARER FUTURE: EXPANDING ALLIED HEALTH AT PATHWAY

& GIVEN GLASSES

We rejoice in the expansion of the Wellbeing Centre into offering allied health services for our community. In 2025 we offered two Pathway Free Eyeglasses Clinics thanks to the One Sight team. Through these clinics a total of 164 of our clients had their eyes tested and received free glasses. This clinic is a beautiful example of the vision God gave to find new and innovative ways to support our community and increase the impact we have in peoples lives.

The need for this service was evident, and the impact has been immediate and deeply moving.

- **Years of Waiting:** Several clients shared that they had been waiting years for new glasses, simply unable to afford the expense.
- **The Struggle:** One person movingly shared that they had been going without glasses after theirs broke, unable to afford a replacement – a situation that can significantly impact daily life, work, and safety.

Again and again, clients express joy and gratitude as they collect their glasses. They are amazed that they could not only receive free glasses but also choose frames and receive complex lenses like multifocals.

We are truly privileged to work alongside the One Sight team, who generously donate their time and expertise to care for our community.

EXPANDING OUR SOCIAL SUPERMARKET

In 2025 we increased our dignified food relief for our community through increasing and expanding our social supermarket model of service. This model of service delivery, in addition to our current food service, increases clients choice of and access to fresh fruits and vegetables. These items are in addition to the food they receive in their food hamper.

This year, Life FM held their inaugural market in June, and we were excited to take part by hosting a stall. Despite torrential rain and strong winds, the day was a great success. Sales were excellent, but even

more valuable were the many conversations we had about the work of Treasured and Pathway. In the months that followed, we noticed an increase in new customers visiting the shop, along with a significant rise in enquiries through our Google Business page.

We also participated in an auction this year. While it required a great deal of time and preparation, it proved worthwhile. Seeing large

amounts of stock find new homes in one event was incredibly rewarding, especially knowing that it might otherwise have taken a long time to sell through the shop.

As I write my final Impact Report as Manager of Treasured Op Shop, I realise that the greatest impact has been on me personally. Over the past 12 years, I have grown immensely in both my faith and confidence. It has been a privilege to be part of such a supportive staff team, and I cannot speak highly enough of the volunteers I have served alongside.

Some of these faithful volunteers were part of Treasured even before I began, and I have deeply valued their loyalty and commitment. It has been a joy to serve with such a wonderful team, and I will greatly miss being part of this community.

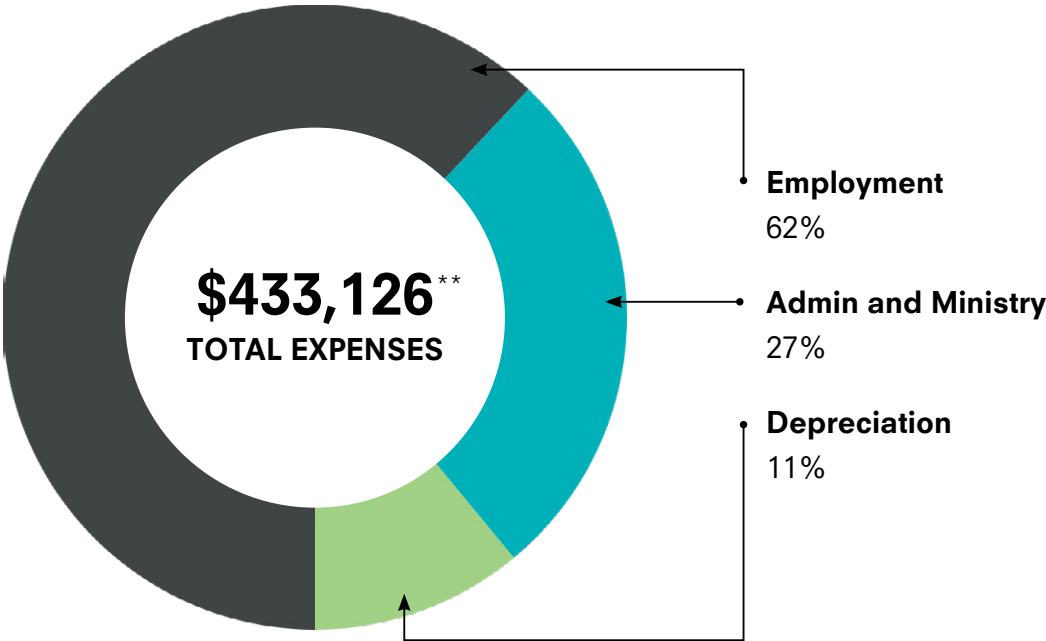
