There is so much to thank God for in 2020. Some highlights include: 87 people who have come to faith, 28 people who have recommitted their lives to Jesus, and the 2 people who were baptised!

Our overall engagement in Clovie has grown through 2020 with Clovie Online becoming a campus of our church. It's hard to fully understand how much the church has grown due to the changing nature of restrictions, but we can conservatively say it is in the range of 10-15% – all praise to God!

Our offerings have remained very strong throughout 2020, showing an overall growth of 6.1% compared to 2019. With offerings strong and various government assistance, our cash position as we ended 2020 was very strong – all praise and thanks to God!

Pathway has been able to remain open as an essential service throughout 2020 and continues to reach the most vulnerable people in our society with the love of Jesus.

I would like to specifically thank the staff team who have been amazing all year in being flexible, adaptable and mission orientated in the midst of extremely difficult circumstances. I cannot speak more highly of each staff member – their heart to serve Jesus, you, our local community and beyond. I am also very grateful for our Church Council who continue to serve God in this crucial leadership and governance role.

We look forward in faith into 2021, keeping our eyes fixed on following Jesus as we embark on the God Sized Dream journey.

CHURCHWIDE PRAYER

We were able to host two church wide prayer meetings this year. Interestingly, the first was on the Thursday night before our first lock down in March and then again on the Thursday night before our second lock down in November. It was great to set aside some time together as a church to seek and soak in God's presence as we cultivated moments of deep felt prayer and worship. There were many moments of experiencing and expressing joy, thanksgiving, repentance and the Holy Spirit's presence and power. There was a great sense of unity, rest and encouragement.

GOD'S FAITHFULNESS

God has been so faithful. I can't praise and thank Him enough for all He means to me. I guess I have had a tough year with breast cancer, surgery, treatment, side effects, the death of my husband, to name a few things. But that is not what stands out to me in the year; it's God's love and nearness that stand out. He has never left me. I talk to Him all the time and even a few times when I felt there was silence on His part, I always knew He was there. God has known what I have needed, and He has provided, always with better timing than mine! God helped me become kinder to my husband, handle sorting out finances and everything else after he died,

gave me a friend to be with me at home, wonderfully supportive hospital staff, helpful taxi drivers, countless friends, my church family, and I could go on. I can't physically do much for others but because God has blessed me financially, I can give away, and that brings me so much blessing. I have so much happiness and joy in my life, all because of what Jesus has done for me. Sometimes, people ask me why I believe. I can only say that unless you have encountered God for yourself, you can't really understand. He encourages me to 'Be still and know that I am God' and nothing can prove to be truer. I love my life and I love growing closer to God.

EXPERIENCING GOD

CLOVIE KIDS & JAM

God continues to be at work in the lives of our children. This year we saw 28 kids say yes to Jesus for the first time. We enjoyed creating 24 episodes of Clovie Kids at Home, even reaching families who don't normally attend church as they chose to watch at home. Connections grew with fortnightly Zoom calls, dropping off packs and writing letters. A huge highlight was when some of our children wrote letters to our older generations to show love and care - and some are still writing today!

We were also able to have JAM on Zoom, a fun way to keep connections high with our Year 5s & 6s. We are seeing kids from BLAST at The Heights school come to JAM and they are super excited to invite their friends. Through JAM we had 2 first time commitments and saw 6 kids connect into Echo Youth – God is at work and we praise Him!

MADISON'S STORY

Freedom Nights was such a significant night for many students at Echo Youth. We saw God move powerfully and in a profound way. One of the students that experienced God was Madison. She had no connection to God or Echo before Freedom Nights. A student from Echo invited her to be part of it and she accepted the invitation to come. On the 3rd night, we gave some opportunities to testify to what God had done in their lives and she got up and shared with everyone that she now believes in God and that 3 Freedom Nights had freed her over the doubt she had about God.

JOIN THE FAMILY

Noel and Raech Joyce began attending Clovie in September 2019. The last 12 months have been a very difficult time for them as a family. While they have struggled and grieved, they have known God's presence in it all.

Clovie has given us a consistent reminder of who we are in Christ. Clovie has nurtured our hearts, minds and souls through the faithfulness of God, the praise and worship, the gospel centred teaching and the prayerful love of His people. God knew ahead of time what 2020 would look like for us. He knew we would have no capacity to give and could only receive. He knew we would need to be cared for when we were broken and had nothing to offer in return. He knew we would be entirely out of our comfort zone; we needed to be given the encouragement we were more accustomed to giving. He also knew Clovie could offer that to us non-judgementally, in grace and love.

Psalm 23:2-3 says 'He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters. He restores my soul.' God knew we would need green pastures, with still waters to restore our souls. Thank you Clovie for being God's church to us during 2020. We eagerly look forward to what God has in store for us all at Clovie in 2021.







TANYA'S STORY

During the first lockdown in early 2020, Echo was given the exciting opportunity to pivot online and increase our reach as a youth ministry. Tanya connected with Echo through an invite from a friend. Tanya is Deaf, and she was able to have an interpreter join her for life group on Zoom. After lockdown finished, Tanya and her interpreter joined us in our physical gatherings, for both Life Groups and Live nights with all our students. We love that Tanya is able to be part of our ministry and experience Jesus.

SETTLING INTO OUR NEW CHURCH

We drove into a very full carpark for a 10am service in the middle of January. There was such a buzz of excitement and expectation as we entered the foyer. The worship was engaging, the message inspiring, the people friendly. So it was an easy decision to return the following week where we heard Mike cast the 2020 "All-In" vision for Clovie. This tugged at our heart strings and we knew that we were being called to be "All-In" with this our new church. We committed ourselves financially, and attended the Welcome Lunch and Discovering Clovie. These were very helpful in enabling us to understand more about Clovie's direction and happenings. They were the beginnings of helping us feel connected. Chris, Cherise, Mike & Michelle made us feel so welcome seeking us out, having meaningful conversations with us and following us up. Change is never easy. For us change involved a new church, a new denomination and a new lifestyle as we were stepping into retirement.

But with change comes opportunity. We were confronted with what this change meant for us when lan was diagnosed with a significant health issue which required immediate surgery. This was a very confronting and difficult time for us. A time when we needed our church family to pray for us, to care for us and to walk this journey with us. But we were new and didn't know who or how to access the help we needed. In Isaiah 43:19 it says "I am doing a new thing..." We were amazed as we saw the fulfilment of this scripture during this time. God opened an opportunity for us to share our story with Mike Stevens. The genuine care, the prayer, the follow-up we both received during the coming days, weeks and months has been so thoughtful, and God-led. REACHING BEYOND

A SIMPLE INVITATION

The culture of invitation in our Year 7 girls' life group at Echo has been something else in 2020. This group started with 12 people and finished 2020 with 40 people. We have seen multiple teenagers inviting their friends and the growth has been remarkable, all because of the desire these students have to reach out to their friends at school.

PONG-A-THON \$12,602

Ping-Pong-a-Thon continues to break records. This year in a pandemic the goal was awareness and engagement, not necessarily funds. Yet in 2020 we saw a lift in players from 27 to 80 across all generations and we raised a new Clovie record of \$12,602. It's been remarkable to see the lift in engagement and funds these past few years. The money raised through Ping-Pong-a-Thon goes towards releasing people from slavery.

COACH

One of our Coach Mentors has been meeting with their Coach student for almost 3 years. The student began as a timid, anxious person who feared school and was frequently absent. The Mentor consistently connected with her for one hour each week, doing craft, puzzles, and other games which she loved. It was the consistency, the chats, the good listening and just being there that made a big difference. Her teacher from last vear saw lots of positive changes in her. Her Mentor said it has been a delight to connect with her and watch her grow. She is caring and thoughtful of others, kind, creative and does careful and detailed work. She has learnt how to deal with her anxiety and never misses school unless she is sick. Over time there has been some further connection with Mum and JAM - a monthly Year 5/6 gathering at Clovie that other students at her school also attend. In her recent visit to JAM she chose to give her life to Jesus. One of our leaders was able to connect with Dad and give him a next step pack. God truly is at work in the lives of all our mentors and mentees. Let us keep praying for them as they shine Jesus's love into our local schools

REACHING BEYOND

LOVE OUR NEIGHBOURS

Feeling prompted by God to look for ways to reach beyond and be neighbourly, we put together 10 hampers to bless the businesses on our street here at Clovie. Together we prayed, walked and delivered hampers to share Jesus' love. Nearly all recipients were overwhelmed by this act of kindness, and felt blessed. A number of businesses also asked us about how we as the church have coped with COVID and we were able to share about our online services. So good to be a generous church and a blessing to others!

REACHING BEYOND

WHITMORE SQUARE MINISTRY

This is the story of an outreach we won't forget in a hurry. God came, in a wonderful way. The weather was dismal, one of the homeless men in the park was causing trouble, and the only people who were presently listening, were our team. The enemy spoke into my mind at that moment and said "This is going to be a complete waste of time." Yet God had a plan. Ashley began to share his story. By that stage, a few homeless men and women, including some members from our indigenous community from up north sat down on the wet chairs to listen. The rain had eased a bit. Then more gathered. Seats filled up. Still more arrived until we had quite a small crowd. I looked over and saw every eye fixed on Ashley as he spoke. We had never seen that happen quite like that before. There were no distractions. It was clear that the Holy Spirit had their attention. When Ashley invited people to respond to the gospel, a few raised their hands. He asked them to come to the front to receive prayer.

As they began to walk to the front, others followed. Still they kept coming, until nearly every person present was up the front, surrendering their lives to Jesus. It was a "God moment". We had team members praying over them, others giving out Bibles as Maddie continued to sing songs of worship in the background. Some shed tears as they were ministered to. In 11 years we had never seen anything quite like this. People stayed for the BBQ. Lots of warm clothes were distributed. Our friend who had been so disruptive earlier in the day, left a different person after he had been ministered to by a number of people from the team. He was very grateful.

And so, the challenge: could Clovie fund the purchase of French Bibles so that France could hear about Jesus? The goal was \$1000 for 300 Bibles. Within weeks, the target was exceeded. Over 300 French speakers can now hear of Jesus as they read these Bibles.

TEAM CLOVIE HIGHLIGHTS

PRODUCTION TEAM

The lift from our Production/Tech team across this year has been phenomenal! To see the team, with the support of the wider Worship-Creative team, grow in numbers of volunteers and skill in their craft in such a short amount of time, is a credit to them. We've seen a whole new team emerge with such passion, humility and skill to serve. From producing an online service each week and innovating ways to capture our Sunday experience of worship, through to live feeds, live streams, virtual choir videos and pre-filmed sermons - all of these enhanced our experience of worship together and kept us connected through many weeks of lockdowns and restrictions from COVID-19. The video team, projection team, sound and light teams have all demonstrated such diligence, flexibility and persistence in our ministry, bringing such a huge lift for our onsite and online experience of our Sunday Services.

CLOVIE ONLINE

2020 brought a whole new element to Clovie ministry that we truly didn't expect - doing church online! When we transitioned to hybrid gatherings in July, we started to build a volunteer team of online hosts who can connect and pray with the online community each week. Hosts have been able to pray with people live time while they are engaging with Clovie Online in their homes, even reaching as far as Hawaii! Over the last few months, we have seen prayers answered and have continued building connections with many people, some who are completely new to Clovie. Our team has also been meeting together to listen to God as we dream and plan for the future of Clovie Online. We are discovering new ways to reach and disciple people in the digital space, and we are excited for all that lies ahead!

TEAM CLOVIE HIGHLIGHTS

TUESDAY CREW & PROJECTS TEAM

This year has been another eventful year, given the COVID-factor, but when it has been possible to continue to serve, our Tuesday Crew and Project Teams have always been there! These people have made great progress with putting up the parklex on the building façade, undertaking preparations for the Pathway internal renovations, as well as instigating an upgrade of the AV equipment in the Function Room. Within the Business Services Team, our volunteers (around 100 people in total) continue to grow in community and camaraderie with each other. Whether they serve in maintenance, gardens, cleaning, Quench, IT, at reception or in administration, these individuals give above and beyond with their time, and many also with their resources, to enable the Church to continue to look presentable, to function and to grow. Clovie is blessed to have such generous and talented people.



GIVING HOPE





Pathway offers support to the local community in a number of ways. We provide relief by providing food to those in need, and we partner with multiple groups, churches, and schools to distribute food beyond our storefront. During 2020 our database grew significantly, now representing over 3600 individuals and families who experience food insecurity. In January 2020, Pathway was recognised by our local City of Tea Tree Gully as Outstanding Community Group of the Year.

The No Interest Loan Schemes (NILS) has been a successful service provided at Pathway for 14 years. We are able to support many families, giving them the ability to purchase goods of value instead of getting into debt. We also provide counselling support and inclusion for people experiencing hardship in the community.

Pathway's food assistance program serves people experiencing food insecurity where they receive food free of charge, meaning they are able to do more with their limited resources. This supports increased economic participation, enabling personal choice and agency. In alleviating hunger, providing nourishment, and affirming their sense of dignity, Pathway plays a part in supporting improved health and wellbeing of people in need.

Impacts of COVID-19

Even in our local community, as a result of COVID-19 many people who had modest income have lost employment and now have no income. They did not have the luxury to be able to stockpile, or buy from more expensive food outlets. Fruit and vegetable prices escalated; many pantry staples were simply not available at retailers. Many are now fully reliant on Pathway for food relief. In 2020 more than 1500 new clients enrolled with Pathway for assistance. Due to increased stress around food insecurity, mental health has deteriorated. Our staff see daily the increase in anxiety in our clients. Social interaction is severely curtailed due to isolation. Our clients come from all over the region, anywhere from Gawler to Glenelg. Many social workers and carers report that there is nowhere else like Pathway where they can access the crisis relief for their clients. We acknowledge SecondBite and OzHarvest, our donor partners, without whom we absolutely could not do what we do.

COMMUNITY AT PATHWAY

Our vision at Pathway is not just about food assistance. Pathway is about community: loving and caring for our volunteers as well as our clients. Our consistent motto has been: "The food we give is not just an end in itself but a means to a greater end - creating community and restoring hope."

Our Craft Connections and English as a Second Language groups stand in the gap - creating community and breaking down some of the barriers that keep people isolated and lonely. What a great ministry to 50 and more ladies as they come together on a Wednesday morning! Most of these Craft ladies are not from Clovie and the "God-spot" presented by Coordinator Jenny Lewis and others in the team, may be the only spiritual input in their week. Similarly with our English classes - Jody Chambers and her team have a one-to-one student/tutor interactions, and these may be the only English-speaking people our students can relate to in their week marked by social isolation because of language.

ASSISTING PUBLIC SCHOOLS

My name is Jody Chambers, and I am the Pastoral Care Worker for two public schools in the North East area. I would like to thank Pathway for all their assistance in providing food supplies with gifts for 20 families this Christmas. All families expressed their gratitude to the people who were involved - most of whom they will never know or get to thank in person. Many recipients wanted to know about the organisations involved that provide this service and why people would be so kind. This gave me an opportunity to explain how Christian people work together in the Pathway ministry. Every family had a story of hardship - some found themselves in difficult situations only just before Christmas. I was able to have a longer chat with a few families, and raise awareness of my role and purpose in the school. Many thanks to Pathway and all the many 'hands' who work there!



I work with a wonderful team here who are amazing people who reach out to the community. When I first got in touch with Pathway, I was a client. I had lost my job and was not getting enough hours. I have a nine-year old son and life was extremely tough. We needed help with rent assistance and food. We came to Pathway and we were welcomed and it was amazing. They sorted us out with food and emotional support as well. It was just amazing to have that support with no judgement and with care which imploded on my self-esteem and my son's life for us. I was so moved by meeting with the leaders, John and the team, and I decided that I wanted to volunteer here. They are amazing people. I've learnt a lot, and it's like an extension of my own family. Our clients are not judged: they are welcomed. If they need a chat, we're there. It's an amazing place that John and Kaye have developed here with their team. It's just fantastic for the community to have a service like this that they can come to. For myself, it's a personal engagement with each person who works here. We're very aware of the wellbeing of our staff and each other. We have the time to discuss how we're feeling and our experiences. Also the team, if we are struggling with things in our own lives, or just need a listening ear the team that is here are just amazing that we are there for each other, that we're not judging, and can have those small confidential discussions, they are just amazing with the support that we give each other. It flows on to their families, and their children (a lot of us do have children) and they are just welcomed if they want to come in and help, which is fantastic for the kids to learn those experiences also. A lot of the children have become friends and we see these families outside so kids can meet up. But the environment is incredible in the support and it's so rewarding to be a part of it and to meet some fabulous people.



Well, 2020 has definitely been the most unusual year during my time as Manager. Due to COVID, we had to shut the shop for two months to ensure the safety of our volunteers and customers. We re-opened with a bang and still made budget! God is good and meets us in all shortfalls.

2020 was a year of being a part of a team that suffered many tragedies amongst our volunteers; the death of a husband due to COVID, a son's suicide and the sudden death of one of our team. It was a blessing to see the team bond even stronger through these times. There were great opportunities to reach out in prayer and support and to genuinely nurture one another. God is good and meets us in our grief and challenges.

We organised our first "Op on, Op off" tour this year. With a minibus full of avid shoppers, we set off to visit five op shops with Treasured being last on our list. Many aboard had never been to Treasured and it was a great opportunity to share the work of Pathway with them. Lots of fun, laughter and bargain hunting was had! God is good and meets us in joyful experiences.

We had an unusual request towards the end of the year. Could we supply some formal wear to the Year 7 graduation classes at the Pines Primary School? Yes, we were happy to do that as well as handbags and jewellery. We were able to bless some of the students for their special occasion as well as continue to support one young lady with everyday clothes. God is good and shows us how to meet other's needs. Then in late November we were blessed by a local manufacturer with the donation of 300+ pairs of quality school shoes. What a blessing to be able to distribute these to our local schools! Wellbeing officers were really touched as they walked out of Pathway with 20-30 pairs of shoes, knowing what a difference they would make for disadvantaged kids. One student said, "Now I can wear shoes that don't hurt."

As we look forward to reconfiguring the Treasured shops next year, I am so thankful to have the privilege of leading this volunteer team who give so much and with so much passion, hard work and joy. God is good, all the time.
