## 2023: RENEW

In 2023, we had the overarching theme of Renew – participating in the mission of God and joining Him where He is already at work. God is a God of renewal as the Prophet Isaiah says, “those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint” (Isaiah 40:31).

2023 has been a wonderful year of putting our hope in the Lord and experiencing His renewal. Some examples of this have been: 38 people putting their trust in Jesus for the first time; 42 people recommitting their lives to Jesus; 14 people being baptised and going public with their faith; 386 Bibles being given out to people in our community who are seeking God; and Clovie Gawler officially launching in August as a campus of our church.

In 2023, we successfully completed renovations to the auditorium and Pathway Community Centre, two spaces requiring renewal. We sent a team to Nepal to further our partnership with Baptist World Aid and raised over \$30,000 to continue to release the Kapilvastu region from poverty by 2030. Church engagement and volunteering resumed at greater levels in 2023 and we thank God for His renewal and faithfulness in our community.

I encourage you not to rush as you engage with this impact report, but instead spend time reading the stories, absorbing all of God’s activity at Clovie and Pathway, and thanking God for His ongoing renewal work amongst us.

He has been encouraged by the resilience of his faith in the face of many difficulties, having left his family behind while continuing to wait for permanent residency in Australia.

## GROWING & SERVING TOGETHER

2023 has seen the Church come together for two significant building projects – upgrading the auditorium and renovations at Pathway.

For the auditorium work, we engaged builders and contractors to renew the air conditioning, ceiling, electrical and audio-visual equipment and install new carpet. Our team worked tirelessly to pull up the old carpet, relocate and build a new sound desk, put in wings, renovate the stage, create a new drum box and paint. Others assisted with cleaning, clean up around the building, and moving chairs and equipment in and out of the function room where we were located during the renovations.

The renovations for the Church's Pathway building of an internal upgrade to Treasured Op Shop and the new Food Services area, commenced in the last quarter of 2023. A pergola was added on the back of the building at the conclusion of 2022 and a new canopy has been added to the front of the building along with new paving during the recent works.

We sincerely thank all who invested time and resources into these projects, particularly Lee Haakmeester and the Tuesday Crew. Such a wonderful work that has made a significant difference to these spaces and the lives of those who connect with Clovie and Pathway. To be honest there were nights when we were tired and felt pressured, but each time we sat down in front of the zoom we were drawn in by the content and enriched by our time connecting. This exposed the lie too easily believed in our busy lives, 'it's too hard to find time to invest in our marriage.' We enjoyed adding a 'date' flavour to the sessions by preparing a tray of special snacks to secretly (or not so secretly) nibble on (or gobble on).

We appreciated that the course left no stone unturned and sensitive topics were handled gently. We gained quick tools of application such as 'what is one thing I can do to make your day better?' This is a love-loaded question and very helpful to increase sensitivity to understanding your partner. We were also guided to dig up the hard ground of those heavier conversations we were probably ignoring a bit and need more time and focus... another cause for date nights. Win Win! But not only were we blessed by the helpful advice and insights to deepen our relationship, but we shared a sense of joy for the growth and strengths of our marriage. Not everything needed fixing! Keith, one of our Seniors at Clovie Modbury North was baptised this year at age 86! A wonderful reminder that it is never too late in your faith journey to take the next step.

"I was brought up Baptist and growing up I attended Prospect Baptist Church. I then moved around the country and ended up back at Prospect Baptist.

I began working 7 days a week, and this and some overseas living meant that I didn't attend church for some time. It was during this time I had a major disruption in my life. My wife and son died within 6 weeks of each other. I was very involved in the RSL and U3A so I found myself driving down Milne Road many times a week and as I would pass Clovie, I repeatedly felt God telling me loudly to "GO IN THERE".

So one day I gave in and went to church at Clovie. Here I was met by Werner and Chris Meinel, and I ended up joining their Mission Prayer Team which resulted in my involvement with B4T (Business for Transformation). I also joined David and Margaret George's life group with many other good Christian people. I have now joined Nathan's Care Group, which is dedicated to helping all, which is why we are all here.

Through the many good influences of these groups and people, I have chosen to be baptised at the ripe age of 86."

During the Seminar, leaders were reminded of the profound impact of shared stories. These narratives illuminated hope and renewal found within life groups, services, community engagement, the enduring journey of discipleship, and the realm of art and creativity.

The feedback from this event resounded with positivity and encouragement, echoing the resonance of its themes. For those considering stepping into leadership or joining a Clovie Group, this is an opportune moment to step up and forward, embracing the call to lead or co-lead a group and be part of this enriching community journey.

## FAITH AND WORK

Last year, Clovie partnered with 18 Australian churches to pioneer a church pilot program centered on integrating discipleship formation into our everyday vocations.

You might remember participating in the faith and work survey last year, helping us grasp our connections between church, discipleship, and vocations.

We've assembled a committee of Marketplace Leaders—Lauren Field, Nick Jackson, Emily Fawcett, Simeon Lawson, Elizabeth Campbell—guided by facilitator Chris Partington.

Across Australia, this church pilot involves 18 churches spanning 5 states, 7 denominations, encompassing both urban and regional settings, diverse ethnicities, and church sizes, engaging 5000 individuals.

At Clovie, our committee and Ministry team are exploring ways to empower and equip people within their vocational journeys. This initiative aligns with Clovie's Vision, Mission and Values, offering tremendous opportunities for transformative discipleship. ## FAMILY AND KIDS COACH

In 2023, we were successful in gaining a grant from Baptist Care to expand from Kids COACH into Family COACH. This year, we were able to welcome Julianne McDuff as Family COACH coordinator and together we have trained 9 new Family COACH Mentors. 5 of those trained are ready to be matched with someone from our community who is doing life tough. Like Kids COACH, Family COACH works to be a friend with purpose, to walk alongside someone doing life tough, build relationships with them, set goals and help them flourish into all God has for them. We look forward to more stories of God at work as these relationships grow.

Kids COACH continues to be a shining light into our local school at The Heights. Currently, we have 9 Mentors serving in the local school.

Our Kids COACH Coordinator Bev Poppleton continues to hear wonderful stories from parents or participants like "She does not want to miss being with her mentor," "It is their highlight of the week. "He loves it", "We are so grateful for the mentor our child has".

Our mentors love to find ways to remind their child that they matter to them, and they are valued. One participant told her mentor she loves highlander cows. When our Mentor found a soft toy version of a cow highlander, she could not resist purchasing it. The joy on her face when she opened this special gift was priceless. This generous thought showed her that they listened, that she mattered to them and that they were interested in getting to know her. Many of these children come from broken homes and life is not easy. We are so thankful for all our mentors in the way they turn up each week for one hour to bless these children. It is making a life-changing impact.

We continue to hear stories of when people have graduated from COACH with opportunities for continued connection. One participant graduated in 2022 and her mum reached out to her mentor and mentioned that her child was doing a special meal at school, and she could invite 1 special significant other and she wanted her Mentor to attend. The power of investing in 1hr can make a lifelong impact.

We are excited to see where our COACH Program is going. We are also excited to partner with Clovie Gawler in helping them start Kids COACH in Evanston Gardens Primary School. In Term 4 we trained 2 potential mentors from Clovie Gawler.

This year we have seen Quench grow noticeably with more customers coming through each week and Saturday party hires. 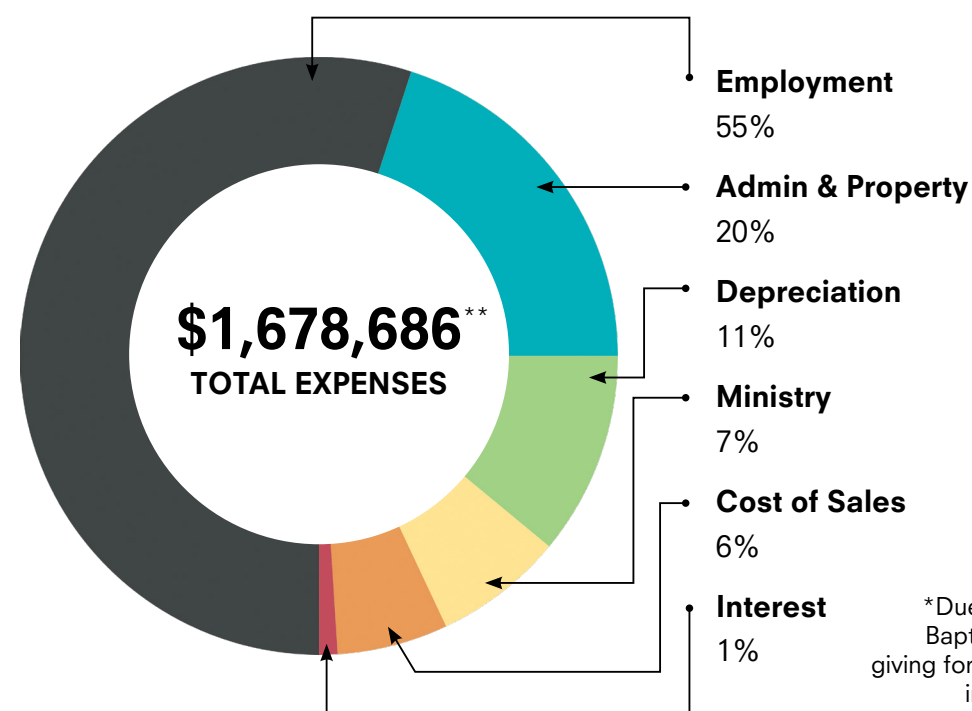
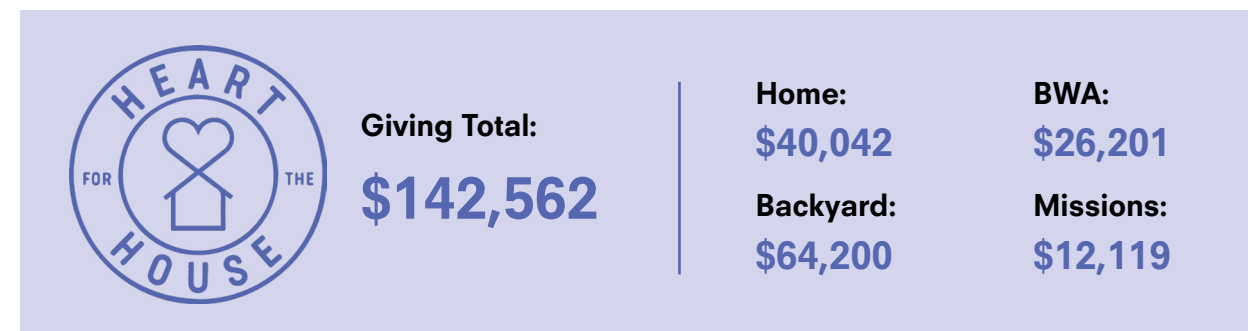

# PATHWAY IMPACT REPORT STORIES 2023

## THE YEAR IN REVIEW

There are so many stories from this year that we won't forget because they're not just stories, they're individuals that we know and serve at Pathway.

2023 has been a painful and challenging year for many families across Australia. At Pathway, we've seen first-hand the impact of the increased cost of living on families in our community. We regularly hear from new clients that they never imagined they'd need to access food support. Many families have felt the pressure and pain with every interest rate rise, while the cost of utilities and food continue to rise.

### According to Food Bank's 2023 Hunger Report

"...many households are experiencing food insecurity for the very first time, and how reluctant these people are to ask for help, despite how urgently they need food relief. It's clear the cost-of-living crisis is exacerbating the challenges facing those in vulnerable circumstances and forcing people to make compromises on what and when they are eating."

"Food insecurity is waking early and sending your child off to school with a rumbling tummy and empty lunch box because you've been forced into an impossible choice between paying the rent or buying food that week," Foodbank chief executive Brianna Casey said.

It is a privilege to be able to be a place of hope for individuals and families in our community. We'd like to thank all our donors for their generous support. Together, we are making a significant difference in our community.

At Pathway, Grow is about bridging the gap between Pathway and the church doors.

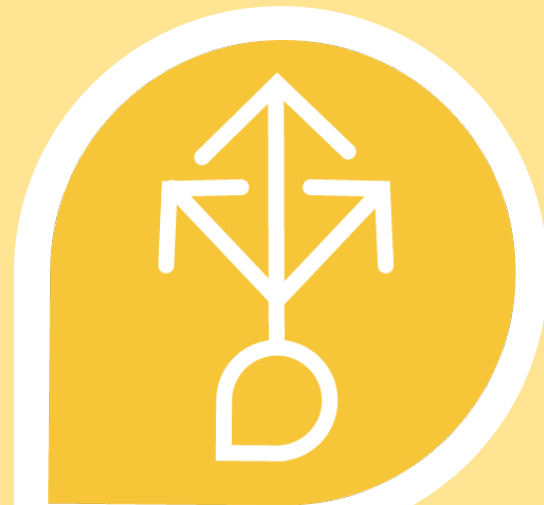

## 2023: PATHWAY EXPAND

### *One Church, Many Gatherings*

#### INCREASING OUR IMPACT AND REACH

At Pathway, Expand means increasing the impact and reach of Pathway. We have worked to strengthen and increase the healthy relationships Pathway has with organisations across the city as well as to build new connections with organisations.

The expanded relationship we've built with the Tea Tree Gully Library and The City of Tea Tree Gully has been a gift to Pathway. Our partnership with Uniting Communities and MarionLife, is a tremendous asset as we work to expand into offering more holistic, wrap-around services to our clients.

We have continued to grow our connections with local high schools this year, with three different schools doing excursions to Pathway as well as collecting non-perishable items.

In 2023, we gave 4,694 hampers through social workers, domestic violence support workers, school counselors, wellbeing officers, churches and other organisations that feed vulnerable people.

"I cannot speak highly enough of Pathway's service. The staff are non-judgmental and every participant I have brought here is treated with respect. If anything, if extra is requested (even pet food) staff are happy to oblige if possible. Pathway provides support for isolated and/or lonely people where coming here is an outing. Providing them with food helps them to be able to pay their bills."

## SA HOUSING AUTHORITY

Many of the tenants we work with experience a range of disabilities and health issues, are receiving a low income and are struggling financially due to the increased cost of living. We have tenants who attend Pathway on a fortnightly basis and are assisted with not only food but also personal care products, clothing, and pet food when able. Personal care items are often what our tenants go without as they are unable to afford them, so they are very surprised and appreciative when they receive these items. Our tenants have always provided positive feedback to us about their experience at Pathway. It is not only somewhere where they can access food assistance but a place they feel comfortable, safe and can connect with other people in the community. Tenants have shared how they have volunteered at Pathway or received assistance to connect with services when needed. At times, our tenants are unable to access Pathway and we have submitted an order and have collected this on their behalf. The staff at Pathway are always friendly, helpful and orders are made promptly and are ready the same day for collection. Thank you again for your ongoing support and the amazing services that you provide to our tenants.

## FINANCIAL COACH

In expanding our reach, we began offering Financial Coach, a financial mentoring program to our clients. Clients learn to budget and manage their finances in a healthier way. We strengthened our referral services and our financial counselor engaged with clients and worked one-on-one, supporting some of our clients to navigate government services and find appropriate support within the community.

Some of our clients shared the

impact that Pathway has made in their lives.

“Pathway has been helpful for years since my daughter was about 13 years old. I was helped with my getting my budget back on track which allowed me to send our daughter to a Christian school and purchase an air-conditioner. Money saved on food received from Pathway helps me pay for my cancer medication expenses. The staff are amazing and the Treasured Op Shop has great bargains. Without Pathway I would have found things extremely hard over the years.”

## 2023: PATHWAY INNOVATE *Daring to Dream*

### UPGRADING OUR FACILITIES

In 2023 at Pathway, Innovate has meant upgrading our facilities and our equipment to better serve our clients, volunteers and the wider community. All these improvements are setting up Pathway and Treasured for ministry into the future.

The renovations at Pathway and Treasured will greatly increase our retail space, which will provide a far better shopping experience for our customers and will set us up for growth in the future.

We have designed and purpose-built the new food services area to create better flow, improving safety and process. Each room has been specifically designed to best support the work done in the area, while prioritising safety in each space. The newly designed areas will also enable us to invite clients in, providing a more private and welcoming space to serve those who come to us for assistance.

The new Pergola will provide an additional community space, where clients can relax and

connect within our facility. It will also offer much-needed protection for our clients from the rain and sun while they wait to be served or enjoy a conversation.

We were grateful to receive a \$33,358 grant from the State Government of South Australia for one new fridge and three new freezers, that were greatly needed, as well as a Tesla battery for the building (including installation costs). The fridge and freezers are bigger and more energy efficient, allowing us to store more in a safer way, while keeping costs down. The new battery not only backs up some of our freezers, but also will save us money, as electricity costs continue to rise in SA.

The blessing of God's generosity to us through the church family has been impactful to our whole team. Our new refrigerated van has made a significant difference to our day-to-day running. It provides increased safety in delivery. Having a larger van means the food arrives earlier in the day, making sorting and distribution of collected food easier for the whole team.

One of our drivers shared about the impact the new van has made on Pathway and our committed team of volunteer drivers.

“Having upgraded from the ute to the van, there have been a number of benefits I can account for. The van has a much greater capacity and feels safe under load. A concern with the ute was refrigeration of perishables, eskies were far from ideal, so it is a massive relief to have a refrigerated van now. Also, even though the van is a much bigger vehicle, it feels safer and more manageable on the road and in the event of an accident I would feel more secure. Other minor factors are that it is easier to reverse, quieter and more comfortable to drive and way more efficient in regard to time management as it can carry so much more product. There are probably other benefits, but they can be summed up by saying that the ute has no redeeming features except that it served us extremely well and did get the job done.”

This has been the most challenging year of my ten years as the manager of Treasured. Despite various methods of raising revenue, we knew we were unlikely to make our budget this year due to the renovations. November and December are our busiest trading months, but our relocation to the West Lounge at Clovie dramatically affected our sales.

However, the advantage of being at Clovie has been the positive feedback that we have received about our church facilities, Quench, the welcome received from staff and the general atmosphere encountered. A lot of our volunteers have not set foot in a church for many years and were pleasantly surprised.

We have continued to support the homeless and victims of domestic violence with free items. We have also donated many items to a Women's refuge in Adelaide and a mother and baby group in Elizabeth.

We continue to place a high priority on reducing rubbish removal costs by up-cycling, repairing & placing items on the "free wall" for people to help themselves.

It may seem to some an unwise business decision to keep a 50c area in the new shop, but we know how important this has been for a lot of our customers and as a means for us to divert items from landfill.

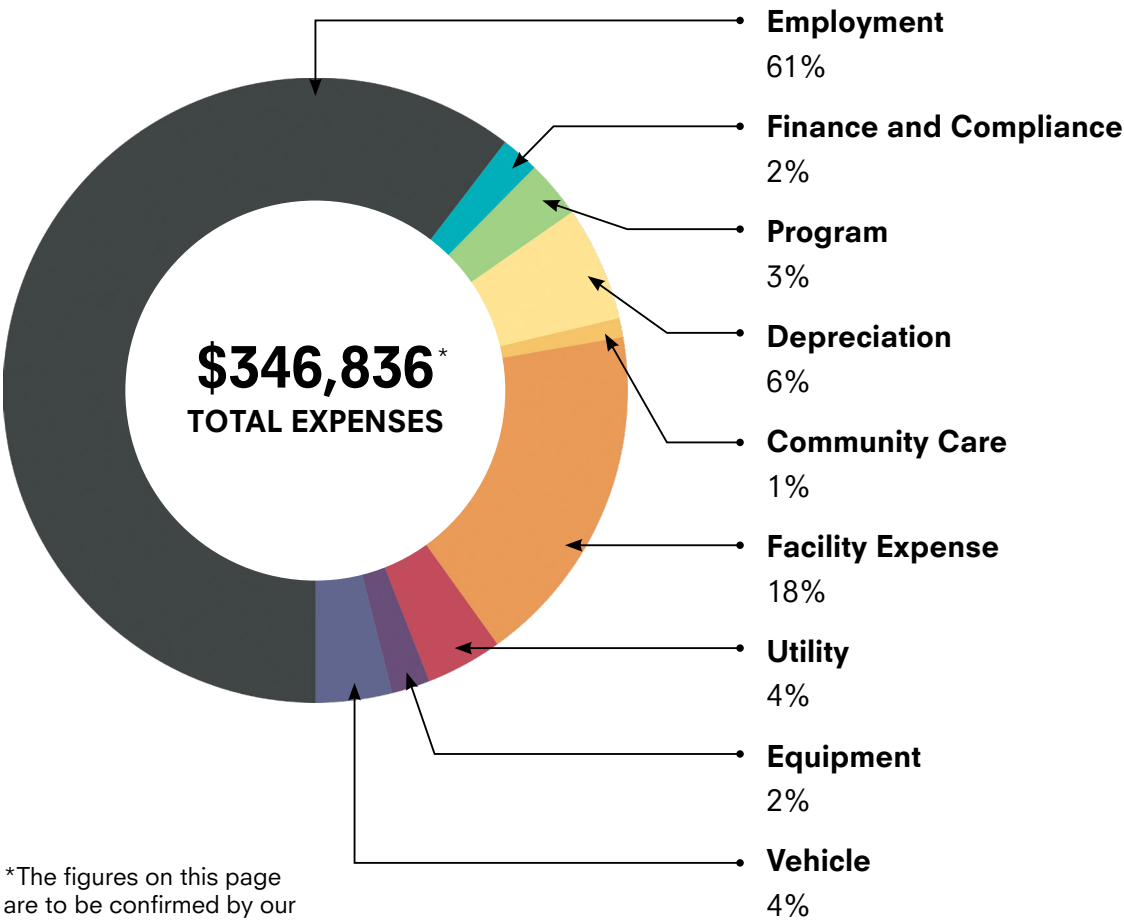
