WHAT MATTERS MOST

As we have continued to navigate a global pandemic, in 2021 at Clovie we have focussed on 'What Matters Most'. We have focussed our energies on Experiencing God, Creating Community and Reaching Beyond. I'm so grateful to God for His leading and I'm extremely proud of the Clovie leadership team as we have stayed focussed on loving God, loving people, and making disciples of Jesus together. As a community of faith over the course of 2021, we saw:

- 40 people make a decision to follow Jesus for the first time
- 11 people recommit their lives to Jesus
- 21 people go through the waters of baptism, declaring Jesus as their Lord and Saviour
- Over 70 bibles being given to people exploring faith

Generosity is at the heart of all we do and who we are, and due to your generosity we have been able to continue to subsidise fees for counselling for people, and also give to people in our wider community with needs, and other churches in need. We praise and thank God for His ongoing financial provision – we have experienced strong growth in our offerings in 2021 and H4H was our largest on record. Thank you!

This year we began living out the God Sized dream of what Clovie will look like in 2030:

- Developing digital mission and Clovie Online [REACH / EXPAND]
- Exploring leadership academy and leadership development pathways [MULTIPLY]
- Asking God what it looks like for Clovie to embrace more congregations [EXPAND]

Our ministries continue to grow and develop as we seek to introduce people to Jesus. I trust you will be encouraged by the stories of impact from ministry areas that fill this report.

I would like to especially thank the Church Council and staff, and all Team Clovie volunteers, who have demonstrated incredible resilience and gospel innovation through these COVID times. We look to 2022 with faith and belief that with God, the best is yet to come!

JIRAH'S TESTIMONY

I was raised in a Christian home, going to church, and watching Veggie Tales from a young age. By the time I reached age 13, I couldn't seem to find God in my life, and I felt in many ways abandoned by him. I spent many nights crying out for help, only to receive what I felt was no response. This brings us to around mid-2017. I had just started high-school and life was not really looking up. I was completely lost. One night I prayed the prayer that I thought would be my last, "God I'm sick of looking for you, if you want me come and find me." That is it, I thought it was done. Two years passed and I went to Echo Youth for the first time in 2019. Little did I know that it would be the year that my life changed 180°. Slowly as the year passed, my walls started to crack. I craved this love and connection that people were talking about, the love of God. The first moment in my life when I felt God moving in a truly undeniable way was at a youth event called United, We Stand in 2019. The preacher had requested those who wanted to put their trust in Jesus to put their hand up. I stuck my hand up, I was pretty much thinking "Yeah, alright, what's the worst thing that could happen." The very next moment

the preacher was asking those who put their hands up to come forwards. I did not plan to move forwards; God had other plans for me that night. My feet began to move when I did not command them to; God moved me to the front, when I wasn't willing to. God carried me through that moment in arms of love. That was the night when I put my faith in God again. Looking back, I realise that not only did He come and find me when I was lost but He actually never left - He was with me through the toughest moments, even when I didn't realise. I was once lost, broken and hopeless. I stand here today more alive than I have felt in many years. That is because of God's redeeming and unwavering love.

was able to answer my prayers. In the next House Session, Dubsy prayed for those who were experiencing doubt that they would receive fresh faith. I gave my doubt to God and was renewed in my trust that God does hear and will answer my prayers in His way and time. I praise God for encouraging me through His Word and His people!

EXPERIENCING GOD

TRUSTING GOD

was diagnosed with melanoma cancer in September 2020, which had spread to other areas in my body. The prognosis was a five-month life expectancy without any treatment for the cancer. I commenced immunotherapy treatment in October 2020. I was re-diagnosed at the end of January 2021 and the relevant scans remarkably revealed I had a complete metabolic response to the treatment and my cancer had disappeared. I am currently on a maintenance program; however at the time of writing, two subsequent scans since January have confirmed the absence of any cancer. I feel very blessed given the results of the treatment.

I am extremely grateful for the scientific developments regarding the treatment for melanoma and for the skill of the medical professionals who are treating me. However, as a Christian, I believe my faith has also

been a significant part of my recovery. I prayed each day for recovery, but on the understanding that it is God's will for our life and not our own that is important. I surrendered myself completely to God's will and placed myself at the mercy of his love and grace. I believe my prayers were answered regarding recovery, but regardless of the result, I know faith sustained me throughout the treatment process. I felt God's presence and somehow knew all would be okay, whatever the outcome. My illness has strengthened my faith and understanding in ways that are difficult to describe. The experience has very much reinforced for me the truth of the Christian faith and the power of a personal relationship with God through Jesus Christ. Amen.

FINDING CONNECTION ONLINE

On Christmas Eve, one of our online hosts prayed with a woman who has been attending Clovie for many years and had settled into the online community during COVID. She had received some difficult news about her employment and faced significant challenges in her workplace as 2021 began. By June, she was experiencing anxiety and depression as a number of difficult personal and professional situations compounded. Throughout this time, our online team were able to pray with and pastorally care for her, while she also received appropriate medical support. She reflected that she felt more connected online than she used to feel when she attended in person - online is her right fit. God guided her through this difficult season, and He has provided a new short-term employment position. She has since joined our online host team, where she is thriving as she greets and prays with people online.

BELONG & FLOURISH

Our Life Groups (LGs) have had a wonderful year of growing together, sharing together, and serving together. One LG has seen an answer to prayer as one person, who had been absent from Christian community for many years, is now regularly attending. Another LG has kept up a regular prayer diary over the year,

filling it with prayer needs and celebrations, and sending it out after each meeting. Group members have grown and are able to share vulnerably with each other. Another LG in our community has been able to Reach Beyond by supporting David & Rosemary Girvan, who are part of Andrews Farm, and their outreach to disadvantaged school children in the Northern suburbs with financial and practical gifts. It is wonderful to see Life Groups as a place to belong and flourish.

EXPERIENCING GOD TOGETHER

Our Life Group spent time over the year sharing our life and faith stories with one another. This was so enriching as we saw how different each of us is and yet how God has been at work in our lives and brought us together. A man with serious health issues and no faith background came to know Jesus and then regularly attended the group with a wonderful lady God asked to be his carer. Another man suffered a stroke after routine knee replacement surgery. God has answered prayer, as this man is making a remarkable recovery and is almost back to his old self.

BUILDING CONNECTIONS

We have seen significant growth in the Year 7 boys Life Group at Echo Youth this year. Youth Camp was a key moment where they encountered God together and were able to go deeper as a group. We have since noticed this group looks out for each other, worships together, and goes from strength to strength. They are shifting from being just a group of lads put together at the start of the year, to becoming more like family.









In 2021 Quench continued to build in team and engagement, receiving some fantastic reviews and publicity. There have been many stories of people coming to church activities and services after having a positive experience at Quench. Through the year we sought where God was at work in our church and community which led to us supporting other ministries including Life Groups, Perspective and Welcome Team.

We consistently hear stories of people feeling blessed and those with food allergies feeling cared for and safe. One of our favourite highlights was staying open late on a Friday afternoon to support Revelation Dance in providing a warm and welcome environment for the dance families. It was great to be part of Revelation's final year and we are excited for the new opportunities God has for us in the coming year.

MEMBERSHIP

Our family has attended Clovie for a significant number of years and over this time we have always felt accepted, loved and grounded in the life of the church. We have always been active and involved with Life Groups, Women's Ministry, Projection, the Welcome Team, and many events over the years. In 2019, David was re-evaluating his baptism as a child and was led by the Holy Spirit to be baptised as an adult. Ella was

MAKING ROOM AT THE TABLE

Our Clovie Kids team has continued to partner with parents of kids with additional needs, so we can create an environment where they can experience God and understand his love for them as they are. We see them – we value them and know that there is always room at God's table for them. These children are a blessing and teach us as we imagine ministry through their eyes.

CLOVIE EATS

In 2021 we launched Clovie Eats!
Our heart is to provide practical care and support to families that are going through a tough season.
Since our launch in May, we have been able to bless over 50 families with a meal. This has included families at the Heights School, with 4 meals going to a family who were experiencing grief and hardship after their mum sadly passed away.

EQUIPPING PARENTS

The opportunity to engage in a Parent Night on Zoom was such a blessing. It was encouraging, supportive and I came away with genuinely helpful resources that we have started using in our family. I was grateful to be absorbing the wisdom of parents who are further along the journey than I am. As parents, we all face challenges and it was comforting to find connection in a community of people who are walking the same path that I am. We tackled the tough topics and difficult conversations, all through the lens of wanting God's best for our kids. I came away feeling better equipped to tackle some of the trickier moments that could be ahead. It was a great night of parenting insights, connection and a timely reminder for me that I am not alone. Parenting is a shared experience and the journey is better together.

EQUIPPING TO REACH BEYOND

Our Reaching Beyond Course helps people learn how to share their faith in the everyday. One of the attendees shared their experience:

found the Reaching Beyond course really helpful in equipping me to better share my faith. Michelle reminded us that in Matthew 28:18-20 we are told that we go with Jesus' authority and we are not alone. I now have a regular fortnightly catch up with a friend where we pray for people in our lives that do not yet know Jesus. This consistent time of prayer has opened up our eyes to see opportunities to talk naturally about our faith. From this, I have had a friend start coming to church and they are wrestling with the big questions around God and faith. My prayer partner was also able to share a children's Bible with a colleague whose children had been asking questions about God. We can be encouraged that we don't need all the answers but just a desire to share the most important thing in our lives with the people we care about.

QUENCH CAFE

A few times in 2021 the Quench team felt led to ask the question "How can we support you?" and just listen with no agenda. This led to some fantastic opportunities to go into our community and bless and work with them. We were able to bless a family at a local kindy with a birthday package, support Ann's team in blessing staff at The Heights School with coffee and banana bread, and work with the Year 12 Café Skills class at Banksia Park International High School. Because of COVID the Café Skills class was unable to participate in their usual activity for their community connection major assignment. By working with the teacher and being willing to let the students make cakes and savouries to fill our cabinet, we met their felt need. The teacher said it was one of their most successful community connection assignments ever. It was great to build relationship and we plan to work with them again.





MAINLY PLAY

Mainly Play started in February 2021 and we have seen God's faithfulness in growing this preschool ministry in His timing. We now have eight community families connected in and we have started a waiting list. One Mum shared on her mums group Facebook Page: "The volunteers are so welcoming to everyone that attends, you feel like one big happy family. I have been fortunate in making many new friends." We are so thankful for the leadership team that have continued to create a warm welcoming environment each week.

PONG-A-THON \$17,527

Pong-A-Thon continues to capture the heart of our church. Once again we saw a significant lift in engagement with 170 players (double the participation from 2020). We also saw a lift in funds raised, from \$12,602 in 2020 to \$17,527 in 2021. This represents 11 people being freed from slavery. We thank God for the work of Pong-A-Thon, as well as the participation and commitment from our church to fight against modern day slavery.

COACH

COACH is described as a friend with a purpose, for one hour, once a week in our local school. We celebrated 4 new mentors starting this year, bringing us to a total of 11 Mentors from Clovie, who each week are consistent, reliable, caring, faithful friends to their Mentees. At the end of 2021, 3 of our Mentees graduated and celebrated their time together with their Mentors as they move up to Middle School. Some of these Mentors have seen the value and difference that one hour a week makes in a child's life and are excited to start a new chapter with another child in 2022. We have been able to personally contact many of the Mentees' parents, who have given positive comments about the support and difference that each Mentor makes. It is wonderful to see many of our COACH Kids attending our weekly Blast lunch time program at the school, where they hear about Jesus' love and acceptance for each one of them. We celebrate that several of our COACH kids have come along to once-a-month Year 5 and 6 outreach program called JAM - another safe, fun place where they can hear and learn more about Jesus.

INTO AGED CARE

This year we have been able to provide monthly worship services at Helping Hand Golden Grove and Allity Ridgehaven. God has been moving and giving us opportunities to connect with residents and help them connect with God. We have been able to provide a resident with a large print Bible, explore creative ways to deliver services amid COVID restrictions, and also reach staff and volunteers. One volunteer played a particular song for the entire month after one of our services. They play this song continuously and it's still impacting them. Residents have shared their gratitude and expressed interest in more frequent services. In 2022, we will explore expanding into other Nursing Homes and Aged-Care facilities across Tea Tree Gully. As we continue to fulfil the vision of "One Church, Many Gatherings", God continues to open the door for us to connect with people who can't come to Clovie.



INTO SCHOOLS

Over my years in high school I've noticed a huge disparity between what I experience in my faith at church and youth, and what people seem to think being a Christian is. I've always wanted to open up faith to my friends so they can see it with new eyes but starting this conversation is challenging. After exploring various ways to bring faith into school, I decided to give it to God. I knew that if He wanted to open that door he would make a way. At Youth Alive Conference in September, I was able to meet so many people who had a similar experience to me in their schools. God brought together a group from my school to start praying - some people I had never even spoken with before. When Term 4 started, we met once a week to pray into different areas of the school and then we made a time to worship together. We spread the news through word of mouth, and through contact with the ministry team we were blessed to have live acoustic worship in the music room at lunchtime. It was something the school has never seen before and I'm so excited to see what God is going to do into 2022 and beyond!

MISSIONS: THE RIVER

For our Missions series in 2021 we launched our new vision of Mission Like a River: a place where we all find ourselves responding to God's call to be on mission for Him (Matthew 28:18-20). It was an exciting series where people were all invited into the River, to either Enter, Know, Experience, or Go on mission. Throughout the series, we launched Mentors for those who are keen to explore their part in cross cultural missions. We have 5 people formally participating in Mission Mentoring, seeking God for their future in mission. We have seen God's hand and leading as we partner with Baptist World Aid, to invest in the village of Kapilvastu in Nepal. We now have 11 children from this village sponsored by individuals in our church, and we continue to work with BWA toward the goal of freeing this village in Nepal from poverty by 2030. God is clearly moving. Let's continue to be people who ask where He calls us to be in the River.

ALPHA @ CLOVIE

In August of 2021, Nathan McDuff and Lindsay Saul were able to build a team of leaders and host Alpha at our Modbury North campus. We saw a range of people, who were at different ages and stages of faith with God, attend Alpha and have an opportunity to ask the big questions. Some of the highlights included:

- People making considerable next steps in the journey of faith (such as baptism, joining a Life Group, exploring Membership and different serving opportunities).
- The Holy Spirit working through people and releasing people from their past hurts and fears.
- People growing in their faith through prayer and Bible study.



GIVING HOPE





Pathway Community Centre impacts our community every day by restoring dignity and worth to broken lives touched by life's struggles. We see the impact of relationship breakdown, domestic violence, drug abuse, homelessness, unemployment, retrenchment, underemployment, addictions, bankruptcy, sickness, grief, and COVID-19. Pathway offers support to the local community in a number of ways. We provide relief by providing food to those in need, and we partner with multiple groups, churches, and schools to distribute food beyond our storefront. We offer financial support with No Interest Loan Schemes (NILS) and provide counselling support and inclusion for people experiencing hardship in the community. Our Kingdom focus is to enable other churches and ministries (as we assist Baptist Care for example), and christian workers in schools, who are serving the Lord in their local area to share the love of God and a message of hope. We provide ingredients for community meals, and provide food for youth programs to support building relationships with youth at risk. When people feel loved, valued, and cared for it gives hope and restores dignity.

Pathway's heart and vision is to continue to grow and develop programs to support creating resilience and courage for our friends of Pathway, as they navigate the tough stuff thrown at them.

We are thankful to God for our supporters, our partnerships, and our faithful team of volunteers who are making a huge difference to our local community and families across Adelaide.









FOOD ASSISTANCE

Food insecurity is a real issue facing our nation. 1 in 3 people struggle to meet their food needs. Pathway's membership has grown to over 4,600 members and every week we are supporting over 1000 families to help bridge the food insecurity gap in our community. When action meets compassion, lives change. Pathway helps vulnerable people to build financial resilience, hope, improved health, and wellbeing. Each fresh food hamper shared is a gift of love and hope.

North East No Interest Loan Scheme (NILS) supports clients who are applying for a loan to purchase household goods and services. One client reflected. "This a very friendly and helpful place. All the people I spoke to were extremely helpful and Pathway has helped me during a difficult time." Another said, "Thank you for helping me apply for a NILS loan. I am so excited that it has been approved - I can do my own washing now and I don't have to rely on my sister to help me." In addition to the NILS application experience, clients also gain knowledge about local services and are provided counselling support or referrals as required.

COMMUNITY AT PATHWAY

Our vision at Pathway is not just about food assistance. Pathway is about community: loving and caring for our volunteers as well as our clients. Maree has been serving at Pathway for 10 years, and she has shared some of her story.

Following the turmoil of being a carer to broken-hearted widow, I embarked on a Business Administration course where I met a lovely lady named Cheryl, who suggested I apply at Pathway as a volunteer to use my newfound skills. I began working at Pathway in the front office, learning the ropes, and supporting those doing it tough by making up food hampers. Part of the brokenness of grief is having a lot of love with nowhere to go, and the emotional roller coaster can be quite confronting. The team at Pathway were kind and understanding as my grief would often bubble to the surface and leave me in tears. Through the kindness of the team, I was able to slowly make a new life from the shattered pieces, which in turn grew my ability to empathise on a deeper level with the clients who visited Pathway for assistance. Over the years, I have been able to use my skills in the administrative/reception areas, supporting the NILS team, baking for events, supporting Treasured, and listening to those who need to share their story or just download. I currently provide support working behind the scenes, but still enjoy the interaction with volunteers and clients. In return, when I have occasionally had a grief overload, there has been a shoulder for me to lean (and cry) on, that is non-judgmental and full of compassion. What is special about this place is that everyone has a story, and in some way is hurting underneath, yet has found a purpose and joy in helping others. Each person has found a niche in which to use their talents and skills, and the Centre is a joyful and welcoming place to be. I am indebted to the entire team at Pathway, past and present, for helping me heal and grow. They have helped me become a stronger, kinder and more compassionate person, and without their prayers, love, and support, I would not be who I am today.

EMBRACE & CARE

In 2021, we had a request for help from a Pastoral Support Worker (PCW) for a family who has lived in Australia for over a decade. The husband, in his early 40's, who died very suddenly, was the primary provider, leaving a wife and young family. There was no government support as they weren't citizens. Even though they had some savings to last a few months, they needed support. We promised the PCW we would support the family each week with fresh food and staples if they needed it. We have been a lifeline to this family. The mum has been working 2 part time jobs (irregular hours) and her strong faith has kept her going. Sara had the opportunity to chat and pray with the mum and realised she wasn't connected into a community where she could be embraced and loved. So, Pathway has now welcomed and embraced her as part of our team. An amazing product of working as a Pathway team to embrace and care for the vulnerable of our community, is that the team members grow in Christlike qualities and find community and acceptance as well.

SHARING HOPE

Each week I look forward very much to my time at the Pathway Community Centre, where I help in the Bread Room. In the same way that Jesus said He came, "Not to be served, but to serve'" (Mark 10:45), so the work of Pathway follows the model of Jesus by serving the needs of the local community. The outstanding example of its leaders, John, Kaye, Sara and Val, are a great witness not only to the clients, but also to the helpers, who come from a wide variety of backgrounds As I get to know the clients by keeping up the bread and bakery supply, I sometimes have the opportunity to offer them a Gideon New Testament and am encouraged by their positive responses, such as, "I need this book," and "I haven't read the Bible, but I will." The work of Pathway is touching the lives of the community in many ways!
