I am so grateful for God's leading and the obedience of God's people as in 2019 we declared that Jesus was Above All Else! We also committed before God and one another we would be a community of faith that would value Experiencing God, Creating Community and Reaching Beyond as our core behaviours.

As a community of faith over the course of 2019 we experienced:

- 41 people make a decision to follow Jesus for the first time
- 25 people recommit their lives to Jesus
- 15 people go through the waters of baptism, declaring Jesus as their Lord and Saviour
- Over 90% of people who attended a welcome lunch are now engaged in the life of Clovie
- 10% growth in our Sunday gatherings and 2.3% (14.3% from July to December) growth in our regular giving

In 2019, God spoke the words unity, holiness and trust into the life of our church as we prayed and fasted.

In my own prayer time with the Lord, I sensed the Lord give me a word for us at Clovie: "God desires to increase the spiritual temperature and move us into a season of repentance, the prophetic and freedom. With this was this verse from Zechariah 4:6, "not by might nor by power, but by my Spirit" says the Lord." God desires to shape us into a community that trusts Him more and more! This is exciting, but for some it can also be a terrifying prospect, as it will mean change and saying goodbye to some old things / ways and saying 'yes' to what God has for our now and future.

I would like to take a moment to thank the staff, both existing and new additions, for their dedication and service. The staff team is in very good health and I thank God for each one. I would also like to thank the Church Council for their support, encouragement and accountability.

I'm excited as the Lord leads us into 2020 and we explore the God Sized dream for Clovie and begin to ask where He is taking us into the future.

A LIFE CHANGED

"God is amazing!! He has totally changed my life!

I should have known He was there all along, but I didn't. There has been a lot of trauma in my life, abuse, rejection, mental health issues, even suicide wishes. In November 2017, I met someone on a bus and my new friend talked a lot about God and the Bible. This friend was baptised at Clovie and I began to go there, too. For a long time, I was really scared of people and went at 11 am because there were fewer people. It was pretty overwhelming but to my amazement, people were welcoming and sincere and really nice. It was like having a new family! The best thing ever! The more I went, the more I saw that people were really living their faith! I cried every week at church. Something was happening in my life. One day, when I was really down, Cheryl told me about Alpha and invited me to go with her. I found beautiful people and help with my questions.

Lindsay encouraged me to watch the Holy Spirit video and to forget any preconceived ideas. This was a defining moment for me as I heard a 'Voice' say to me, 'Forgive your husband.' I listened - and did it - and felt such amazing relief and release. It was amazing!

Next, I found myself doing the baptism class. I was ready to commit myself wholly to God, but maybe next time! I have a huge fear of water and of steps! Then, at the next baptism service as I listened to people's wonderful stories, I felt God nudging me to take up Mike's invitation to be baptised then and there. Wow! It was like coming home - being somewhere safe and comfortable and loved. I had nothing to do with it, it was all God. He has changed my life so much! I'm not scared of people now. I can't stop talking about Jesus. He's showing me more of Himself. There are big issues happening in my life, but Jesus is all I need. I am relying totally on Him. It is pure joy to be His!"

PROPHECY

19 attended our 8-week prophecy course in October. They commented that the teaching, 'removes the mystery that can be connected to prophecy', and 'makes prophecy feel safe.' Attendees had the opportunity to spend time listening to God for words of encouragement, comfort or strengthening for 30 people in leadership from Adelaide churches who attended a Learning Community held here at Clovie in November. Many were apprehensive about using this gift/practice, but we prayerfully persisted. Such encouraging feedback was received, one person stating that their prophetic letter was 'on point', for their situation. 12 attendees from the course wish to pursue prophecy and joined our Prophecy Team meeting at the end of the year. It is so encouraging to see Clovie pursue this wonderful gift from God!

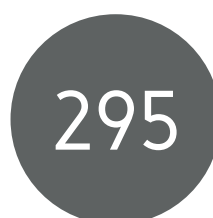
LIFE GROUPS

CREATING COMMUNITY

A STORY OF IMPACT

“As 2019 draws to an end, we look back upon the Year and realise how prevalent God was in our lives this year.

As Members of Clovercrest we have experienced God at work with the love and support the Church family have given us during a time of a health crisis. This has been inspirational and humbling to see how the life of Jesus has shaped and moulded their lives to be like Him.

We have been fortunate to join a Life Group this year, enabling us to share God's word and expand

our fellowship with other followers of Christ. We have grown spiritually through our close fellowship with one another. We believe God has given us a task to care for an aged gentleman who has had difficulty with domestic life after his mother died. He has relied totally on his mother's care all his life and we have been in a position to reach out and teach and encourage this person to become more independent. Yes, God is awesome!!!!



THE NEXT GENERATION

Over the last 2.5 years, we have grown significantly in the area of transitions. In youth, we have 2 key transition points: from kids to youth, and from youth to young adults. Historically, we would reflect the research that suggested 40-60% of students will walk away from their faith when they graduate from Year 12. Over the last 2.5 years we've been able to change the narrative for us, seeing more people graduate and remain connected to faith or a church community.

This is a result of our commitment to create environments where people can experience Jesus and connect in community. We praise God for students not just having seasonal faith, but having lasting faith.

REACHING BEYOND

ANDREA'S STORY

Andrea is a year 9 student in our community who is living out her faith in her school. Last year she started an Echo Hub – a missional expression of our youth ministry in her school. She runs a lunchtime group where they explore God & faith together. In 2019 she had the opportunity to speak in assembly and bring people from her Echo Hub along to youth on Friday nights. She even got to baptise someone here at Clovie – a friend from school who has been part of our community for the last 12 months. It all started with Andrea inviting her along.



A customer shared that she felt very welcome at the Café with her autistic son; something that she felt she hadn't had in other cafes. She appreciated the kindness and assistance she received. Some customers were told about Carols at Clovie, which they were unaware of, and they took the invite cards and on the night popped into the Café to say hello and let Thalia know that they had come – so awesome!

ALLITY

On Sunday December 15, Clovie had its annual Allity Nursing Home Christmas Carol Service. Approximately 70 residents, their families, carers and people from Clovie came together in their Cafe to sing Carols, hear the Christmas message, listen to personal testimonies of what Christmas means to them and special children's prayers prayed over the residents. The residents were blessed with a special Christmas Brochure and origami hearts made by one of our Clovie families.



REACHING BEYOND

COACH

One of our COACH students was previously referred to the program and in the beginning, the COACH mentor found it very difficult to connect with the student. The student was disruptive and disengaged during their sessions, as well as the classroom. The mentor persisted and focused on connection, encouragement and fun as they got to know each other.

In the second half of 2019, the mentor noticed some big changes in the student. The student's concentration improved and the mentor felt their connection was really growing. The student showed obvious trust and they have been able to have open discussions together about struggles and challenges.

The teacher noticed a change in the student's engagement levels and noted that the student would really look forward to sessions with his mentor. In mid 2019, she sent this feedback to the school chaplain on the mentoring relationship: "It is so important that he has time with his mentor. [The student] is always excited to see him. When he comes back from session, he is engaged and ready to learn, vs defiant. The support offered by mentors is so special to children that just need someone to care for them and regularly be there for them."

The COACH Coordinator has also been able to build a strong relationship with the mother of the student and they have been able to keep in touch via phone and email.

JAM

We are celebrating seeing the transition from JAM to youth. As we finished our second year of JAM, we saw 4 kids plugging into youth and now 1 committing his life to Jesus - so awesome! We now have families from Blast at The Heights school starting to connect in and are we are seeing siblings coming to JAM as well. Parents from The Heights also attended our Next Gen Parent Nights.

REACHING BEYOND

PONG A THON - \$10,125

In 2019, Pong smashed records financially from its previous best of \$3,800 to \$10,125. This is truly remarkable. \$10,125 is more than just a good fundraising goal achieved for it represents five people who can now be freed from slavery. It still blows our minds that there are more slaves in the world now than ever before and we believe we have a responsibility for that to be different. In 2019 we have raised a significant amount of money, but we have also increased awareness of slavery, with people using social media in creative ways - from videos, to posts, to even contacting people directly. We can make a change in this space and release 40 million people from slavery.

ENCOUNTER GET TOGETHERS

You may remember the missions team facilitated 'Encounter Get Togethers' in September. Over 100 people attended these, and here are some of their comments: "A highlight was seeing people put aside a weeknight to attend something like this, and on top of that, participate in equally encouraging and challenging discussion. It provided an opportunity to think about missions and bring it into reality, make it personal and accessible - brought it off the platform and into people's lives."

"Opening one's home to folk, usually is a source of encouragement. When we feel loved, included and supported we are strengthened to reach out to our own individual circle of friends. In that way I think our 'get together' was of value (even a non-churched friend joined our gathering!). I managed to share a snippet from the life of Philip, which had challenged me from a devotional reading. Others shared about how God was leading them to be a light in others darkness."

MISSIONS

JAMES AND ASHLEIGH

During a Discipleship Training School we were involved in running, each of the students went deeper in their relationship with God, saw breakthrough in specific areas of their lives, and were healed from past hurts. We had the privilege of closely discipling 3 of the students. One of the students had this testimony at the end of the lecture phase: "I used to view God as an angry and distant God. I didn't fully believe that He loved me. The first week's teaching on The Nature and Character of God and learning who He really is, I accepted for the first time that He really does love me. Now that I've found my true identity in Jesus Christ, I'm able to love myself more and I have more confidence. I'm now passionate about sharing His love with other people."

During this time, James organised a Bible Distribution Day in our local area. It was a really good day. We knocked on close to 500 doors, offered a Bible to around 200 people, and were able to give out 77 Bibles. It worked out that almost every second person that we offered a Bible, who didn't already have a Bible, received a Bible.



In July we organised a six week Summer Outreach. We had around 60 people from all over the world participate. We spent two weeks in Biarritz, two weeks in Paris, and then finished with two weeks in Marseille. In Biarritz, we talked to almost 1000 people about Jesus and prayed for over 500. 20 people gave their lives to Jesus, 12 people were healed and we were able to give out 120 Bibles. During our time in Paris, we joined with the "Paris Je T'aime" 2 week outreach event in which there were about 200 that attended. Together we shared the gospel with 2000 people, prayed for 1300 people, saw 64 people instantly healed, and 37 people give their lives to Jesus. And then in Marseille, we shared the gospel with 376 people, talked to another 676 people about God, prayed for 463 people, gave out 138 Bibles/gospels, saw 18 people instantly healed and had the privilege of leading 31 people to the Lord.



CLOVIE CAROLS



Clovie Carols 2019 was a fabulous time when the community came together to celebrate Christmas and sing carols. Different teams of leaders and volunteers united together to organise the Family Fun Zone and the Carols service. After months of planning and rehearsing, a wonderful night was had by all. Around 700 people attended and the name of Jesus was loudly proclaimed and glorified by children and adults. We thank God for this amazing opportunity to welcome the community into the Clovie family and celebrate the true meaning of Christmas.

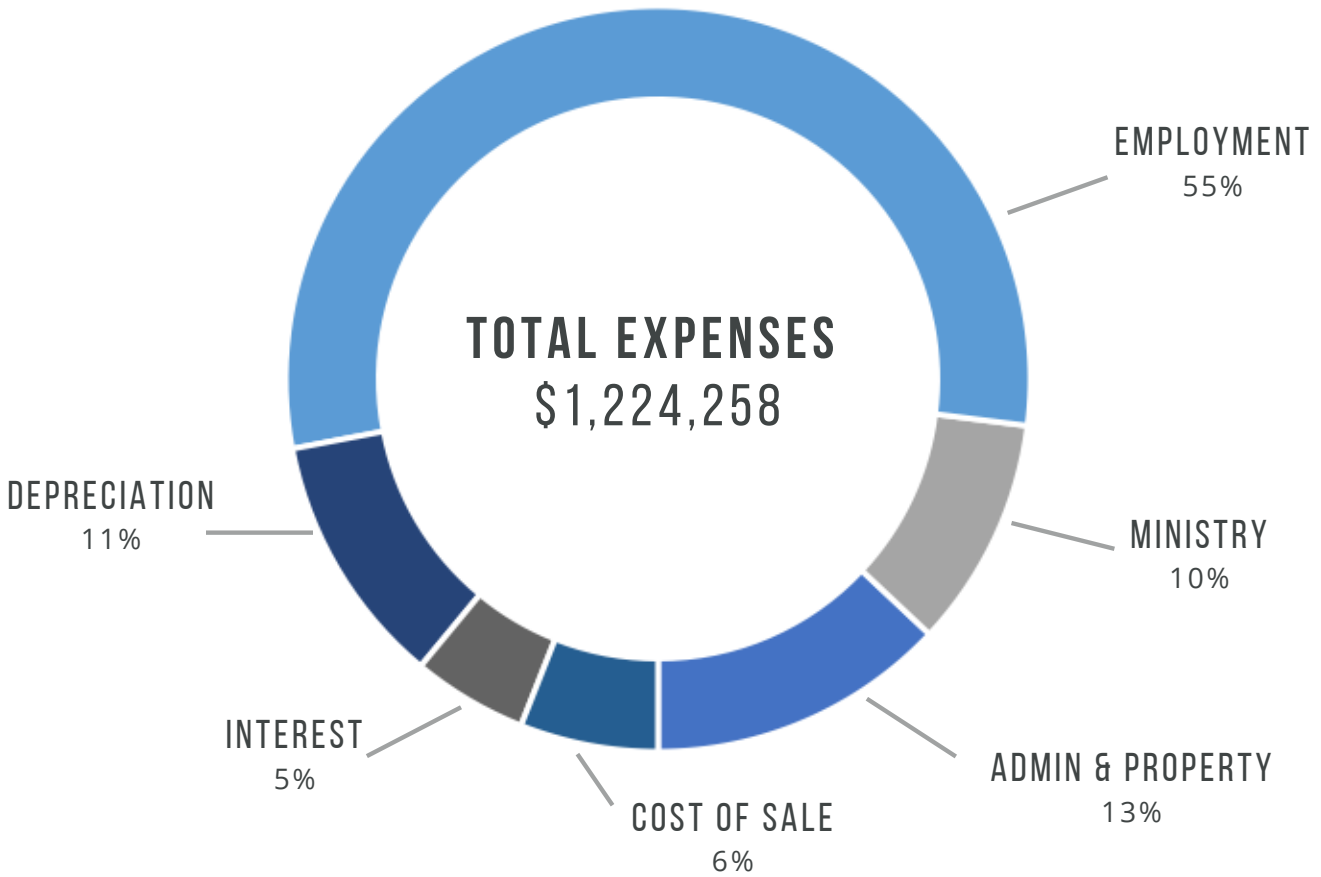

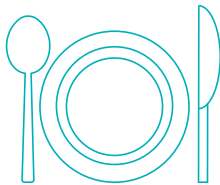

FOOD DISTRIBUTION

Pathway distributed 800,000kg of food in 2019. That equates to a lot of meals for a lot of families, but as those who work at Pathway know, “the ministry of food is just a bridge to creating relationships”, and we did just that with an average of 135 families and individuals served every day, as well as the 40 groups, schools and churches that we support.

Many recipients shared with us, “we could not have survived this year without the food assistance you provided.”

The opportunity to support the Pastoral Care Workers (chaplains) in our local schools has been a special way to bless staff, students and families in need. They have been a good source of referrals to help needy families. In the last week of school, Pathway delivered 35 pallets of ice creams to local schools around us and up in the Barossa. One principal said, “That was a memorable way to finish the year.”

WIDER COMMUNITY

Pathway has impacted our community, our city, and our state in a greater way than we could have imagined. There is hardly a suburb north of the city of Adelaide where Pathway's food rescue ministry doesn't have an impact. From Gawler, Andrews Farm, in a great circle to Port Adelaide, city, to the Hills communities, and places as far as Victor Harbor and Cambrai.

Through our Kilburn hub and working with Eric and Heather Randall, we have partnered together to assist many groups, and many, many families, like a couple who came as customers to their hardware shop, saw what they were doing with the food distribution, and got on board with their ministry Hope4You House:

“In this last year Carmen at the Hope-4-You-House has served people at risk diligently by visits, counselling, activities and small groups, food parcels, and short-term accommodation. She helps people experiencing hardship. Single mothers are a big part of Carmen's work. These people include pensioners, people dealing with abuse, people recovering from exceptional circumstances etc. At the moment she supports ex-prisoners, people with failed business, people with complex personal issues and retired people at risk or with grandchildren who seem to need help. Hope-4-You-House is about hope, opportunity, people, and experiencing God's presence. "We could not do it without the support from you." Carmen cooks, listens, prays with people, refers them on and sends them with a full tummy and enough food to ease their weekly load. "You play a key role in that and we therefore thank you from the bottom of our hearts and to those who help you."

REACHING FURTHER

Even further afield, among the many churches and groups that Pathway supports, there is one group that regularly visits Point Pearce Aboriginal Community (mid-western Yorke Peninsula), Copley, Hawker and other remote communities in South Australia.

“Thank you for the food hampers that David and I took to sheep stations last month, when we travelled to Nipapanha. We split the food into 4 and visited Angapena and Depot Springs Stations. They were pleased to have a visit and also for the gift of food. They have had no real rain for 3 years and Depot Springs have no sheep left on their huge property and a \$400,000 debt for stock feed trying to keep their former sheep alive!! We gave the other food to Jeff Morgan, the Christian artist in Hawker, to distribute. He has told us that the food was very well appreciated at Motpena and Holowalina Stations, and sends many thanks for your thoughtfulness. Thanks for making a difference in the outback.”

Our OpShop has had a record-breaking year! It was a combination of Val D'Arcy's leadership, management, marketing, and community building. Income from sales in the OpShop exceeded the budget we set in late 2018.
