Survival of the Meekest

Matthew 5:5

Introduction

The world says: "Only the **strong** survive."

Jesus says: "Only the **surrendered** are blessed." In a culture that prizes **pride**, He exalts humility.

In Rome and Greece, humility was seen as **weakness**, but Jesus calls it strength.

Big Idea: True strength is found in yielding to God.

What Meekness Is

Greek word: praus — meek, gentle, humble, strength under control.

Meek ≠ weak; it's power submitted to God.

"Meekness is the mark of a man who has been mastered by God."

True strength is not domination, but surrender.

The Posture of Meekness

The Beatitudes progress: Poor in spirit \rightarrow Mourn \rightarrow Meek.

Meekness flows from repentance and trust.

It's not a personality; it's a **posture** before God.

"I no longer fight God's hand; I rest under it."

Surrender and Submission

Surrender – internal yielding of the will to God.

Submission – external **obedience** flowing from surrender.

"If you submit without surrender, obedience feels like slavery."

James 4:7 – "Submit yourselves, therefore, to God."

The meek are not **spineless** — they are surrendered and strong.

Meekness in Action

Begins **vertically** with God, then moves **horizontally** toward others.

Meekness changes how we respond to people:

Not retaliating when wronged.

Responding with **gentleness** instead of anger.

Trusting **God** to defend our name.

"Moses was very meek." - Numbers 12:3

Meekness doesn't act from pride or revenge but from love and trust.

The Model of Meekness: Jesus

"I am gentle and lowly in heart." - Matthew 11:28-29

His power was restrained by **mercy**.

"When He was reviled, He did not **revile** in return." – 1 Peter 2:23

"The posture most natural to Him is not a pointed finger but open arms."

The **cross** is the ultimate picture of meekness: power surrendered for sinners.

The Promise of Meekness

"They shall inherit the earth." - Matthew 5:5 / Psalm 37:11

Present reward: peace, joy, and contentment in God's sovereignty.

Future reward: reign with Christ in the new creation (Revelation 21–22).

The proud grasp for the world; the meek **inherit** it by grace.
