Not Good Enough – Matthew 5:3

Introduction

- The Beatitudes are not **commands**, but **declarations** of blessing.
- The Big Question: Why should God **accept** you? (Hebrews 9:27)
- Key Thought: The world says, "Prove yourself." Jesus says, "You are **not** enough."

Bankrupt Before God

- Greek *ptōchos* = utterly **destitute**, a **beggar** (Luke 16:20; Rev. 3:17).
- *Pneuma* = the inner **man**, the soul.
- Poor in spirit = sinner who knows he cannot survive without outside help.
- It is **poverty** of the soul total spiritual **bankruptcy**.
- **Cross Reference**: Psalm 34:18 "The LORD is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit."

Why We're Not Enough

- God's standard is **holiness** (Lev. 11:44; 1 Pet. 1:16).
- Romans 3:23 all have **sinned**.
- James 2:10 one sin makes us guilty of all.
- 1 John 1:8 If we say we have no sin, we **deceive** ourselves.
- Isaiah 64:6 "All our righteous deeds are like filthy rags."

- Quote: "We underestimate our sins and overestimate our works."
- **Key Point:** Our "resumes" of righteousness are worthless before a holy God.

God's Kingdom for the Broken

- To belong to the kingdom is to belong to **God**.
- "Theirs is the kingdom" present **reality** & future **hope** (*Already/Not Yet*, Rom. 14:17; Rev. 21:1–4).
- The kingdom is not for those who are "good enough."
- It's for those who know they're not and run to **Jesus**.
- In a world that says bring your best, the Christian brings **Christ**.
- Cross Reference: Philippians 3:8 Paul counts all things as loss compared to Christ.

Living Poor in Spirit

- To be poor in spirit grants both **entry** into the kingdom and strength for our daily **walk**.
- Colossians 2:6 "As you received Christ... so walk in Him."
- Daily dependence: "Nothing in my hand I bring, simply to the cross I cling."
- Sanctification flows from the same **grace** that saves dependence fuels **growth**.
- **Key Point:** Spiritual bankruptcy doesn't disqualify you it **qualifies** you.
- Cross Reference: Psalm 51:17 "A broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise."
