How does the way you judge or compare sin and good deeds tell us about how you truly measure goodness?

What is the difference between being good and being righteous?

What actually separates those who receive salvation and those who do not?

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In what ways does John 14:6 shape the way we approach God?

How can these passages shape our understanding of the love and grace of God?

How can these passages inspire gratitude?

Dig Deeper:

Are there any areas in your life where you're trying to earn God's approval?

What can we learn about God from these passages?

Is there anything you feel the Holy Spirit nudging you to look at more closely?
