Day 1

Thinking Like Jesus



Thinking Like Jesus

Practice makes permanent. Daily renew your mind to break down the old patterns and build up your renewed mind in Jesus. Then you will be able to discern God's will and His voice. If you have a steady diet of worldly "junk food" mentally (junk tv for example), then just like with your body, your mind will be unhealthy. We need to "eat" the Word of God to renew and transform our minds and world views to line up to Jesus.

Thinking Like Jesus

For by the grace given me I say to everyone of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the faith God has distributed to each of you. **Romans 12:3**

Day 2 Meeting with Jesus

Prayer is simply spending time talking and listening to God.



Meeting with Jesus

James 4:8

Draw near to God, and He will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, sinners, and purify your hearts, double-minded people!

A relationship with Jesus is like any relationship. You need to spend time with Him to know Him. What does this tell you about talking to God and spending time reading the Bible?

Meeting with Jesus

In 1 Thessalonians Paul says to, "Pray constantly" (1Thess 5:17). How do we do practically do this?




Prayer is simply talking to God. Paul doesn't mean that we must "constantly" be on our knees "praying". What he is saying is that we can and should be in constant communication with our Lord, Jesus. Jesus wants to have a close relationship with you. So close that He is the first one you run to when things are good or bad.

Meeting with Jesus

Part of prayer is listening as well as talking. How can you listen to God?



We can listen to God by asking Him to quiet our minds to hear Him. Another important way He speaks to us is by reading His Word. The Bible IS God's word to us. It has His thoughts and final authority on EVERYTHING. When we read the Bible, His word becomes planted in our hearts and it will begin to change the way think and see the world.


Considering these verses, how have you met with God today? How does this change the way you will continue to meet with Him?

What topics do you find yourself "fitting" into the conversation?




Sharing my Jesus

But how can they call on Him they have not believed in? And how can they believe without hearing about Him? And how can they hear without a preacher?



Sharing my Jesus

What are some reasons why we don't share Jesus?



We may not share our faith out of fear. Fear of what people will think of us, that we don't live up to what we think a "follower of Jesus" should be like. Maybe we feel inadequate to answer tough questions. You don't have to be a theologian to share the "good news" of what Jesus did for you. You don't have to be perfect either. The "good news" is that Jesus died for the imperfect. And we don't have to understand all mysteries to receive that salvatio. Just share what you DO KNOW. Share what Jesus did for you and how He changed and is changing your life.

Sharing my Jesus

In the same way, let your light shine before men, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven.

Day 4 Growing in Jesus

One of our 5 Marks of a Follower of Jesus is, "How is God challenging you to grow?".

When you received Jesus as your Savior, you were "born again". Like a new baby, you began a new life and had to learn a new way. Scripture continues with this analogy liking "milk" to the fundamentals of salvation and "meat" to deeper theology (1 Corinthians 3:1-3).

As we mature in our relationship with Jesus, He challenges us to mature or grow in our walk with Him. We do this by learning His word and learning to trust Him with our lives.

Growing in Jesus

What do you think Paul means by "equip you with all that is good to do His will?".




Growing in Jesus

How does this apply to your family and friends?



How is this benifitial for your family?


Day 7 Living Like Jesus

What do you think Paul means by "released from the law so that we serve..."?




When you love someone, you naturally do things to make them happy. As a born again believer in Jesus we want to please Him and He loves others through us causing us to desire to serve others as well.
