 - c. Expect to fail. Failure is not fatal. Learn the lessons, then get back up and try again.
 - d. Look after your health — physical, mental, and spiritual.
 - e. You don't need to have it all figured out. Tomorrow is another day.
 - f. Be of service to others. Be interested in others. People will remember what you did for them.
 - g. Be willing to show that you are vulnerable. It is in fact the greatest act of courage.
 - h. Don't worry about what other people think. They think about you a lot less than you imagine.
