1. On a scale from 1 to 10, how much do you fear death—and why did you choose that number?
(1 the least, 10 the most)
2. How has our culture (or even the church as a whole) become desensitized to death? Why do you think that is?
3. Can you recall a time when death or loss made you truly pause and reflect? What came up for you?
4. Based on Luke 7:11–17, Genesis 1:27, and Genesis 3:19—what does it look like to see God's presence in both life and death?
5. Read Luke 8:40–42. What stands out about Jairus and his approach to Jesus? What can we learn from him?
6. Now read Luke 8:49–56. What's your personal takeaway from this moment between Jesus, Jairus, and his daughter?
7. Take some time with 1 Corinthians 15:12–22 and 15:50–58. What is God revealing to you about life, death, and hope through these verses?
