- God created us to be relational human beings who need others, and the importance of community is emphasized throughout Scripture.
- We see the following biblical principles of community life in the teachings of Jesus:
 - he chose the twelve disciples to be with him and learn from him (Mark 3:14)
 - he showed and taught the importance of outreach to others (Matt. 9:37-38)
 - he taught how to have healthy community by engaging in godly confrontation and avoiding gossip in conflict situations (Matt. 18)
 - he demonstrated true selfless servanthood and challenged his disciples to do likewise in service to one another (John 13)
 - in restoring Peter, Jesus taught that love for him is expressed in caring for and nurturing other disciples (John 21)
- Paul expressed biblical principles of community life in his letters:
 - show devotion to one another in love (Romans 12:10)
 - in community with one another, seek harmony (Romans 12:16)
 - do not pass judgment on another (Romans 14:13)
 - show interest in one another (1 Corinth. 12:25)
 - serve one another humbly in love (Galatians 5:13)
 - confront and restore one another with gentleness (Galatians 6:1)
 - support one another by carrying one another's burdens in tangible and emotional ways (Galatians 6:2)
 - build one another up by using spiritual means (Ephesians 5:19)
 - be willing to submit to one another (Ephesians 5:21)
 - and so on
