6 Themes for effective mentoring (think of this related to your group):

- select your people carefully, be there, know your people, affirm them often, provide coaching and teaching, encourage and support them, offer counsel in difficult times, provide correction when necessary, be an intentional model of dependability
- exude warmth, listen actively, respect privacy and keep confidentiality, embrace humor, do not expect perfection, be trustworthy, respect values
- clarify expectations, establish measurable goals, define relationship boundaries, be sensitive to gender, race and ethnicity, plan for change at the beginning
- be aware of the rigors of leading, engage in self-care, be productive, ensure that you are competent, hold yourself accountable, practice humility, respect the power of attraction
- above all do no harm, tell the truth, seek consultation, challenge your own thinking
- welcome change and growth, accept endings, think of mentoring as a way of life
