

What's The Point Of Reach?

When we talk about reach we are talking about connecting with others in such a way as to build a genuine friendship with them. Hopefully most of us have many friends. However, the reality is that few of those friendships will last over an extended period of time.

The friendships that last are typically those that go beyond personal interest. Rather, they develop an interest in the other person such that genuine care can be given. These are the friends that rejoice when things go well for you and are saddened when things go bad. These are the friendships that strengthen in times of difficulty rather than break down.

When we reach out to others, we are seeking to establish a foundation upon which a genuine friendship can grow. True friends can become like family to us. These are the people we love, these are the people we are prepared to make sacrifices for (John 15:13).
