
Summerhill Property

“Upside Down” Sermon Series

This sermon series explores Jesus’ radical teaching in the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5–7). At the center is the Golden Rule: “Do unto others as you would have them do unto you.” But living this way is far from easy. Jesus’ instructions often feel unnatural and completely upside down from how we instinctively want to respond. From loving our enemies to turning the other cheek, these teachings challenge our most basic impulses. 
