

"Believing the Word"

John 4:46-54

Continuing the Series: Encountering Jesus

⁴⁶ So he came again to Cana in Galilee, where he had made the water wine. And at Capernaum there was an official whose son was ill. ⁴⁷ When this man heard that Jesus had come from Judea to Galilee, he went to him and asked him to come down and heal his son, for he was at the point of death. ⁴⁸ So Jesus said to him, "Unless you see signs and wonders you will not believe." ⁴⁹ The official said to him, "Sir, come down before my child dies." ⁵⁰ Jesus said to him, "Go; your son will live." The man believed the word that Jesus spoke to him and went on his way. ⁵¹ As he was going down, his servants met him and told him that his son was recovering. ⁵² So he asked them the hour when he began to get better, and they said to him, "Yesterday at the seventh hour the fever left him." ⁵³ The father knew that was the hour when Jesus had said to him, "Your son

will live." And he himself believed, and all his household. 54 This was now the second sign that Jesus did when he had come from Judea to Galilee. — John 4:46-54

Introduction: When John records the first of Jesus' miraculous signs in Cana in Galilee, at the

wedding of an unnamed bride and groom, who were somehow connected to Jesus' mother,				
it is to convince us that with Jesus there always is enough wine to go around, wine that				
brings joy, celebration, and even cleansing. Now, as Jesus comes back again to Cana, we				
discover that there is <u>always enough power and reach in his word</u> to heal and to bring life,				
	he performs his second great sign, the healing of an official's son at a distance. With			
jes	us, his word is always sufficient, even when not accompanied by miraculous signs.			
•	Crisis moments can drive us to Jesus, as we beg him to come down into our need.			
•	But sometimes Jesus won't come.			
•	Jesus may give only a word at a distance. Yet, this is more than enough!			
•	Faith grows out of and takes us back to the living Word of God.			
•	Our believing the Word brings life to us and to those around us!			

A Word About Communion at Redeemer:

This is a time for all people to seek the Lord. For Christians, Communion (also called The Lord's Supper or The Eucharist, which means 'thanksgiving') is a time to meet with their Savior by faith, to be strengthened and renewed by him as they eat bread and drink wine. All baptized Christians who trust in Christ alone as their Savior and Lord, belong to a church that embraces the gospel, are at peace with their fellow neighbor, and seek strength and grace to live more faithfully with Christ, are invited to participate. If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer and to consider more deeply your relationship to Jesus Christ. We also ask that children who have not yet publicly professed their faith in Christ refrain from partaking until doing so.


