The Sermon

“Holding Fast”

Revelation 2:12-17

Continuing the Series: Letters from Jesus to His Church

¹² “And to the angel of the church in Pergamum write: ‘The words of him who has the sharp two-edged sword. ¹³ I know where you dwell, where Satan’s throne is. Yet you hold fast my name, and you did not deny my faith even in the days of Antipas my faithful witness, who was killed among you, where Satan dwells. ¹⁴ But I have a few things against you: you have some there who hold the teaching of Balaam, who taught Balak to put a stumbling block before the sons of Israel, so that they might eat food sacrificed to idols and practice sexual immorality. ¹⁵ So also you have some who hold the teaching of the Nicolaitans. ¹⁶ Therefore repent. If not, I will come to you soon and war against them with the sword of my mouth. ¹⁷ He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To the one who conquers I will give

some of the hidden manna, and I will give him a white stone, with a new name written on the stone that no one knows except the one who receives it.'” — **Revelation 2:12-17**

Introduction: Starting something is generally way easier than continuing and enduring in it, isn't it? (For instance, I announced to a group the other day that I was starting again my commitment to stay off all soft drinks. This lasted about three hours!) Enduring with Jesus, holding fast to his name, as John writes here on Jesus' behalf to the church at Pergamum, and to us, is not just commendable (like sticking to your New Year's resolutions). It is crucial. Jesus tells us elsewhere that we are saved as we endure to the end with him. (Matthew 24:13) This is the hardest of endurance tests. But, thanks be to God, forever and always, that we hold fast to Jesus because he and the Father are holding fast to us! (John 10:27-30) This is sheer grace! And that grace will cause us to hold fast to Jesus, to endure with him to the end and be saved as his people. Yet, endure with him we must. So how will Jesus' grace work endurance in us?

Key Idea: **The grace of Christ will cause us to hold fast to his name. Here's how....**

- **Holding fast to Jesus by his sword.**
- **Holding fast to Jesus through persecution.**
- **Holding fast to Jesus with exclusivity.**
- **Holding fast to Jesus in future hope.**

A Word About Communion at Redeemer:

This is a time for all people to seek the Lord. For Christians, Communion (also called The Lord's Supper or The Eucharist, which means 'thanksgiving') is a time to meet with their Savior by faith, to be strengthened and renewed by him as they eat bread and drink wine. All baptized Christians who trust in Christ alone as their Savior and Lord, belong to a church that embraces the gospel, are at peace with their fellow neighbor, and seek strength and grace to live more faithfully with Christ, are invited to participate. If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer and to consider more deeply your relationship to Jesus Christ. We also ask that children who have not yet publicly professed their faith in Christ refrain from partaking until doing so.

A Gluten-Free option is available for anyone who requests it from a communion server. The GF bread has been carefully and individually packaged. Redeemer serves wine for communion. The outer circle of the tray contains grape juice for those desiring it and the other circles contain wine.
