## **\*Affirmation of Faith**

The Westminster Confession of Faith, 11.1<sup>‡</sup>

Minister: Christians, what do you believe about the gracious faithfulness of God in our salvation?

**All: Those whom God effectually calls he also freely justifies. He does not pour righteousness into them but pardons their sins and looks on them and accepts them as if they were righteous— not because of anything worked in them or done by them, but for Christ’s sake alone. He does not consider their faith itself, the act of believing, as their righteousness or any other obedient response to the gospel on their part. Rather, he imputes to them the obedience and judicial satisfaction earned by Christ. For their part, they receive and rest on Christ and his righteousness by faith (and this faith is not their own but is itself a gift of God).**

<sup>‡</sup> The Westminster Confession of Faith, along with the Westminster Shorter Catechism and the Westminster Larger Catechism, serve together as the statement of faith for the Presbyterian Church in America (PCA). Formulated in the 17<sup>th</sup> century England, they are a second level of authority under the Scriptures and serve to explain the system of doctrine revealed in the Bible. A Modern English Version is used here.

## The Fruit of Faithfulness

<sup>5:22</sup> But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, <sup>23</sup> gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. — **Galatians 5:22-23**

### Introduction:

**God's faithfulness:** Throughout the Bible, God's faithfulness is emphasized as a core attribute of His character. He keeps His promises and remains true to His word as He deals with His covenant people, even if that dealing is difficult and not what we expect.

**Our faithfulness:** Because faithfulness is a core attribute of Yahweh, we are called to reflect this attribute in our lives. This involves following God's commandments, trusting in His promises, and demonstrating reliability in our relationships.

**The Spirit's work:** Faithfulness is found in the list of the fruit of the Spirit in Galatians 2, indicating it is a quality cultivated through the Holy Spirit's work in our lives. Our faithfulness is a divine gift and work in progress.

Theme: Each of these fruits of the Spirit, God lives out toward us. By the Spirit's power within us, we now respond to that grace by living out these fruits as well. Today we look at **faithfulness** – our fidelity, loyalty, constancy, and devotion to God. **We are to bind faithfulness around our necks and write it on the tablet of our hearts.**

## A Word About Communion at Redeemer:

This is a time for all people to seek the Lord. For Christians, Communion (also called The Lord's Supper or The Eucharist, which means 'thanksgiving') is a time to meet with their Savior by faith, to be strengthened and renewed by him as they eat bread and drink wine. All baptized Christians who trust in Christ alone as their Savior and Lord, belong to a church that embraces the gospel, are at peace with their fellow neighbor, and seek strength and grace to live more faithfully to Christ, are invited to participate. If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer and to consider more deeply your relationship to Jesus Christ. We also ask that children who have not yet publicly professed their faith in Christ refrain from partaking until doing so.

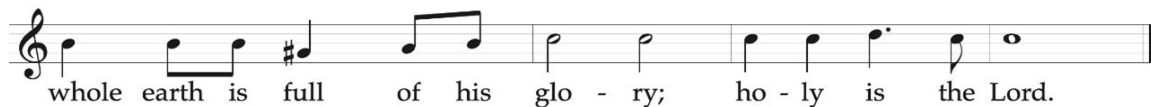
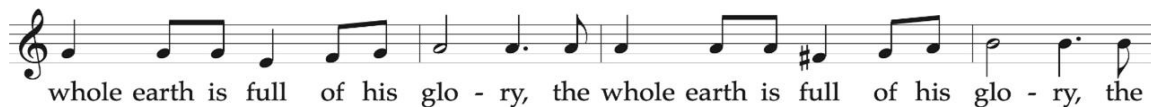
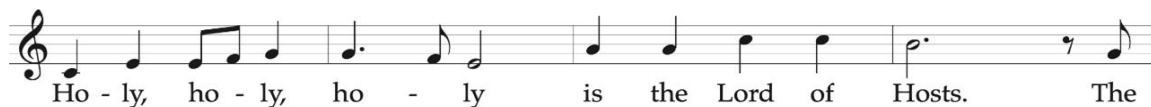
