Reflection and Preparation

“Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be long in the land that the Lord your God is giving you.” —**Exodus 20:12**

Q. 124. Who are meant by father and mother in the fifth commandment?

A. By father and mother, in the fifth commandment, are meant, not only natural parents, but all superiors in age and gifts; and especially those who, by God’s ordinance, are over us in place of authority, whether in family, church, or state.

Q. 125. Why are superiors called father and mother?

A. Superiors are called father and mother, both to teach them in all duties toward their inferiors, like natural parents, to express love and tenderness to them, according to their several relations; and to move inferiors to a greater willingness and cheerfulness in performing their duties to their superiors, as to their parents.

Q. 127. What is the honor that inferiors owe to their superiors?

A. The honor that inferiors owe to their superiors is, all due reverence in heart, word, and behavior; prayer and thanksgiving for them; imitation of their virtues and graces; willing obedience to their lawful commands and counsels; due submission to their corrections; fidelity to, defense, and maintenance of their persons and authority, according to their several ranks, and the nature of their places; bearing with their infirmities, and covering them in love, so that they may be an honor to them and to their government.

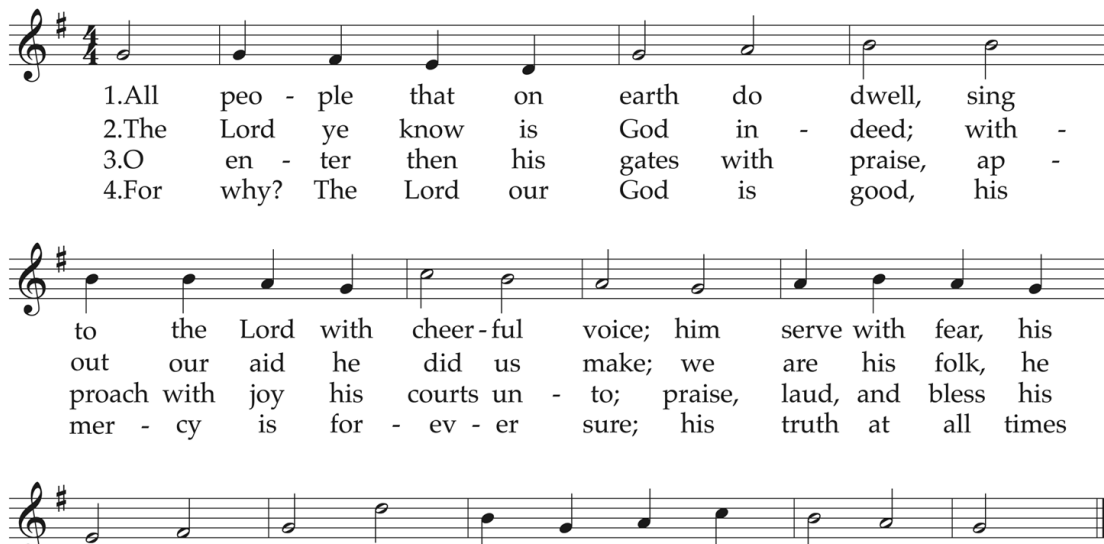

"Hope Under Authority"

1 Peter 2:13-25

Continuing the Series: 1 Peter: God's Letter of Hope

¹³Be subject for the Lord's sake to every human institution, whether it be to the emperor as supreme, ¹⁴or to governors as sent by him to punish those who do evil and to praise those who do good. ¹⁵For this is the will of God, that by doing good you should put to silence the ignorance of foolish people. ¹⁶Live as people who are free, not using your freedom as a cover-up for evil, but living as servants of God. ¹⁷Honor everyone. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the emperor.

¹⁸Servants, be subject to your masters with all respect, not only to the good and gentle but also to the unjust. ¹⁹For this is a gracious thing, when, mindful of God, one endures sorrows while suffering unjustly. ²⁰For what credit is it if, when you sin and are beaten for it, you endure? But if when you do good and suffer for it you endure, this is a gracious thing in the sight of God.

²¹For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example,

so that you might follow in his steps. ²²He committed no sin, neither was deceit found in his mouth. ²³When he was reviled, he did not revile in return; when he suffered, he did not threaten, but continued entrusting himself to him who judges justly. ²⁴He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed. ²⁵For you were straying like sheep, but have now returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls. — **1 Peter 2:13-25**

Introduction: When Jesus marvels at something, we do well to stop and wonder at it, too. We find him marveling at the faith of a Roman centurion, who was willing to place himself under the authority of Jesus for the healing of one of his servants, even as he himself lived under authority within the system of the Roman legions. Jesus celebrated the centurion's faith, saying that he had not seen faith like this in all of Israel. (Luke 7:1-10) The marveling for us includes the hope (sure confidence in God's perfect care for us now, as we move assuredly toward a perfected future together with Christ and his people) that as we live under authority, blessings will come to us. Key Idea: **Hope comes to us from God as we live under the authorities he places over us. Here's how...**

- **Hope from God as we are subject to authority.**

- **Hope from God when we suffer under authority.**

A Word About Communion at Redeemer:

This is a time for all people to seek the Lord. For Christians, Communion (also called The Lord's Supper or The Eucharist, which means 'thanksgiving') is a time to meet with their Savior by faith, to be strengthened and renewed by him as they eat bread and drink wine. All baptized Christians who trust in Christ alone as their Savior and Lord, belong to a church that embraces the gospel, are at peace with their fellow neighbor, and seek strength and grace to live more faithfully with Christ, are invited to participate. If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer and to consider more deeply your relationship to Jesus Christ. We also ask that children who have not yet publicly professed their faith in Christ refrain from partaking until doing so.
