[†]The Heidelberg Catechism originated in Germany in 1562 under the authority of Elector Frederick III, who ruled the most important German province, the Palatinate, from his castle in Heidelberg. He commissioned the preparation of a new catechism for guiding ministers and teachers in instructing people in the Christian faith.

"The Fruit of Gentleness"

Galatians 5:22-23; Matthew 11:25-30

Continuing the Series: The Fruit of the Spirit

^{5:22} But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness,
²³ gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. —**Galatians 5:22-23**

²⁵ At that time Jesus declared, "I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, that you have hidden these things from the wise and understanding and revealed them to little children;
²⁶ yes, Father, for such was your gracious will. ²⁷ All things have been handed over to me by my Father, and no one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him. ²⁸ Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰ For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." —**Matthew 11:25-30**

Introduction: If we are going to say only one thing about Jesus, it should be that he is gentle. *If we are asked to say only one thing about who Jesus is, we would be honoring Jesus's own teaching if our answer is, gentle and lowly.* (Dane Ortlund) There is only one point in all the gospel narrative where Jesus lets us directly inside his heart. It is right here, in Matthew 11. And he tells us his heart is full of gentleness. The Father's heart overflows with gentleness as well: David cries to God in Psalm 18: "Your gentleness has made me great." Near the end of Isaiah's prophecies, God describes himself as a gentle, tender, comforting mother toward his people. (Isaiah 66:12-13) So, the Spirit, is a Spirit of Gentleness (Galatians 5:23), and we become gentle people as we are renewed by him.

Key Idea: **Gentleness grows in us as we experience God's gentleness toward us in Christ. Here's how...**

- **Experiencing God's Gentleness in Christ: Lowliness and Gentleness Grow Together in Us.**

- **Experiencing God's Gentleness in Christ: Gentleness brings Ease of Burdens and Rest for Souls.**

A Word About Communion at Redeemer:

This is a time for all people to seek the Lord. For Christians, Communion (also called The Lord's Supper or The Eucharist, which means 'thanksgiving') is a time to meet with their Savior by faith, to be strengthened and renewed by him as they eat bread and drink wine. All baptized Christians who trust in Christ alone as their Savior and Lord, belong to a church that embraces the gospel, are at peace with their fellow neighbor, and seek strength and grace to live more faithfully to Christ, are invited to participate. If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer and to consider more deeply your relationship to Jesus Christ. We also ask that children who have not yet publicly professed their faith in Christ refrain from partaking until doing so.
