***Affirmation of Faith**

The Westminster Shorter Catechism[‡], Q/A #4, 5, 6

Minister: [Who] is God?

[‡]The Westminster Shorter Catechism, along with the Westminster Confession of Faith and the Westminster Larger Catechism, serve together as the statement of faith for Redeemer Presbyterian Church and the PCA. Formulated in the 17th century England, they are a second level of authority under the Scriptures and serve to explain the system of doctrine revealed in the Bible. A Modern English version is used here.

The Sermon

"An Open Door"

Revelation 3:7-13

Continuing the Series: Letters from Jesus to His Church

⁷ "And to the angel of the church in Philadelphia write: 'The words of the holy one, the true one, who has the key of David, who opens and no one will shut, who shuts and no one opens. ⁸ I know your works. Behold, I have set before you an open door, which no one is able to shut. I know that you have but little power, and yet you have kept my word and have not denied my name. ⁹ Behold, I will make those of the synagogue of Satan who say that they are Jews and are not, but lie—behold, I will make them come and bow down before your feet, and they will learn that I have loved you. ¹⁰ Because you have kept my word about patient endurance, I will keep you from the hour of trial that is coming on the whole world, to try those who dwell on the earth. ¹¹ I am coming soon. Hold fast what you have, so that no one may seize your crown. ¹² The one who conquers, I will make him a pillar in the temple of my God. Never shall he go out of it, and I will write on him the name of my God, and the name of the city of my God, the new Jerusalem, which comes down from my God out of heaven, and my own new name. ¹³ He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches.'" —**Revelation 3:7-13**

Introduction: We spend a lot of our lives worrying about, fretting over, and banging against doors that are locked to us. Yet, the longer we have walked with Jesus, the more we see how those closed doors can lead to great blessings, as we are protected, redirected, and reoriented toward Jesus' best course for our lives. Closed doors are an important part of the Christian life. And so are open ones! Here, Jesus, writing to the first century church in Philadelphia, speaks of an open door that he has set before them, a door which no one would be able to shut. (v.7) And Jesus has the same sort of door open for us today. Key Idea: **Jesus opens a door to us as his people. Here's how we may walk through and find great blessings....**

- **Walking through an Open Door – For Jesus holds the Key**
- **Walking through an Open Door – For Jesus is the Way**
- **Walking through an Open Door – For Jesus brings the Increase**
- **Walking through an Open Door – For Jesus gives the Victory**

A Word About Communion at Redeemer:

This is a time for all people to seek the Lord. For Christians, Communion (also called The Lord's Supper or The Eucharist, which means 'thanksgiving') is a time to meet with their Savior by faith, to be strengthened and renewed by him as they eat bread and drink wine. All baptized Christians who trust in Christ alone as their Savior and Lord, belong to a church that embraces the gospel, are at peace with their fellow neighbor, and seek strength and grace to live more faithfully with Christ, are invited to participate. If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer and to consider more deeply your relationship to Jesus Christ. We also ask that children who have not yet publicly professed their faith in Christ refrain from partaking until doing so.

Please use our communion time to sing and/or meditate as communion is being served.

A Gluten-Free option is available for anyone who requests it from a communion server. The GF bread has been carefully and individually packaged. Redeemer serves wine for communion. The outer circle of the tray contains grape juice for those desiring it and the other circles contain wine.
