
What Child is This? is a family devotional, designed to help your family to wait with great anticipation and orient your hearts toward Jesus this advent season. Advent simply means "coming" or "waiting." Included is a Jesse Tree ornament activity. Each day you will spend time in the Old Testament prophecies and then turn to the New Testament to read of the fulfillment in Jesus. You may then use the ornaments provided to color and string on the burlap as garland to hang on your tree, or in your home.

In this season, we remember how the Hebrews waited for God's promised one, Jesus. Like the Hebrews we also are waiting, only now we wait for Jesus to return in full glory, at His promised second coming!

Jesse or Jesus Tree

There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit. And the Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD. Isaiah 11:1-2a.

Isaiah's prophecy of a stump shows how the family of David had been "cut down." Jesus would be like a new growth and a new hope for the kingdom that was once strong and worshiped God as one. As we consider the prophecy in Isaiah, of Jesse, we will be reminded "What Child is This?" that came from the root of Jesse! That child is Jesus!



Day One: Light

Old Testament - Genesis 1:1-4 New Testament - John 1:1-5, 9-10

Did you know that in the beginning, God created the heavens and earth? He had an incredibly special plan when He created the world, and you are part of His great plan! We learn in our New City Catechisms that there are three persons in one God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. They were all there in the beginning during creation. Jesus was there in the beginning! Jesus created light from darkness. Jesus is the light of the world!


Jesus is the Light!

But, Jesus, who is sinless, offers us forgiveness when we repent and follow Him.


Jesus is Sinless!

Have you ever been angry? Unlike us, God's anger is always righteous and good. Well, God was very angry with the people he created because they were sinning and would not come back to God! So, he sent a flood! God told a righteous man, Noah, to build an ark and God saved him and his family from the flood. He made a covenant with Noah, promising never to flood the earth again. When we see a rainbow, we can be reminded of this promise. God offers the same salvation to us through faith in Jesus! Jesus is the greater Noah when we follow him by faith, we will be saved from the flood of God's anger.

Abraham was a faithful servant of God! He trusted God! God tested that faith and told Abraham to take his only son, Isaac, and offer him as a burnt offering. Can you imagine? Even though he didn't fully understand God's command, Abraham obeyed the word of the Lord. When God saw his faith on display, he provided a ram for the sacrifice instead of Isaac. Does this remind you of someone else? God sacrificed his one and only Son, our perfect substitute, so that whoever believes and has faith in Jesus will have everlasting life!

Song: This Is My Father's World


This is my Father's world, and to my listening ears All nature sings, and round me rings the music of the spheres. This is my Father's world,

Song: O Come, O Come Emmanuel



Noel, Noel, Noel, Born is the King of Israel!


And by the light of that same star, Three Wise men came from country far, To seek for a King was their intent



Can you imagine being an heir of a kingdom? Isaiah the prophet tells us of the virgin who would one day bear a son and call his name Immanuel--God with us. Over 700 years later, an angel appeared to Mary, a virgin who was soon to marry Joseph. This angel told Mary how she would conceive a son and call his name Jesus and he would be the Son of the Most High. We are like sons and daughters of the Most High which means we are heirs of God and his kingdom!

Jesus is Son of the Most High!


Song: Silent Night


Jesus is the Good News!


