***Affirmation of Faith**

The Westminster Larger Catechism[‡], Q/A #36, 37

Minister: Who is the Mediator of the covenant of grace?

All: The only Mediator of the covenant of grace is the Lord Jesus Christ, who, being the eternal Son of God, of one substance and equal with the Father, in the fullness of time became man, and so was and continues to be God and man, in two entire, distinct natures, and one person, forever.

Minister: How did Christ, being the Son of God, become man?

All: Christ the Son of God became man, by taking to himself a true body, and a reasonable soul, being conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit in the womb of the virgin Mary, of her substance, and born of her, yet without sin.

[‡] The Westminster Larger Catechism, along with the Westminster Shorter Catechism and the Westminster Confession of Faith, serve together as the statement of faith for the Presbyterian Church in America (PCA). Formulated in the 17th century England, they are a second level of authority under the Scriptures and serve to explain the system of doctrine revealed in the Bible. A modern version is used here.

“The Rock That Reaches You”

2 Samuel 22: 1-4, 17-20, 47-51

Continuing the Series: The Life of David

¹ And David spoke to the LORD the words of this song on the day when the LORD delivered him from the hand of all his enemies, and from the hand of Saul. ² He said, “The LORD is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer, ³ my God, my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield, and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold and my refuge, my savior; you save me from violence. ⁴ I call upon the LORD, who is worthy to be praised, and I am saved from my enemies.

¹⁷ “He sent from on high, he took me; he drew me out of many waters. ¹⁸ He rescued me from my strong enemy, from those who hated me, for they were too mighty for me. ¹⁹ They confronted me in the day of my calamity, but the LORD was my support. ²⁰ He brought me out into a broad place; he rescued me, because he delighted in me.

⁴⁷ “The LORD lives, and blessed be my rock, and exalted be my God, the rock of my salvation, ⁴⁸ the God who gave me vengeance and brought down peoples under me, ⁴⁹ who brought me out from my enemies; you exalted me above those who rose against me; you delivered me from men of violence. ⁵⁰ “For this I will praise you, O LORD, among the nations, and sing praises

Big idea: David does not interpret his life by what he built. He interprets it by the Rock that came down into the water and pulled him out, and by the steadfast love sworn to his Offspring forever.

1. The Fortress You Cannot Build (vv. 1-4)

2. The Rock That Came Down (vv. 5-20)

3. The Forever Rock (vv. 21-25, 38-43, 47-51)

Conclusion: We are saved by the Rock that came down to save us from the waters of death and drew us out. And it does not end with our rescue but with a love sworn forever, a horn of salvation raised up in the House of David, who is Christ. So we are free now to go down into our city, with nothing to defend, with open hands, held by the One we could never have reached.

A Word About Communion at Redeemer:

This is a time for all people to seek the Lord. For Christians, Communion (also called The Lord's Supper or The Eucharist, which means 'thanksgiving') is a time to meet with their Savior by faith, to be strengthened and renewed by him as they eat bread and drink wine. All baptized Christians who trust in Christ alone as their Savior and Lord, belong to a church that embraces the gospel, are at peace with their fellow neighbor, and seek strength and grace to live more faithfully with Christ, are invited to participate. If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer and to consider more deeply your relationship to Jesus Christ. We also ask that children who have not yet publicly professed their faith in Christ refrain from partaking until doing so.

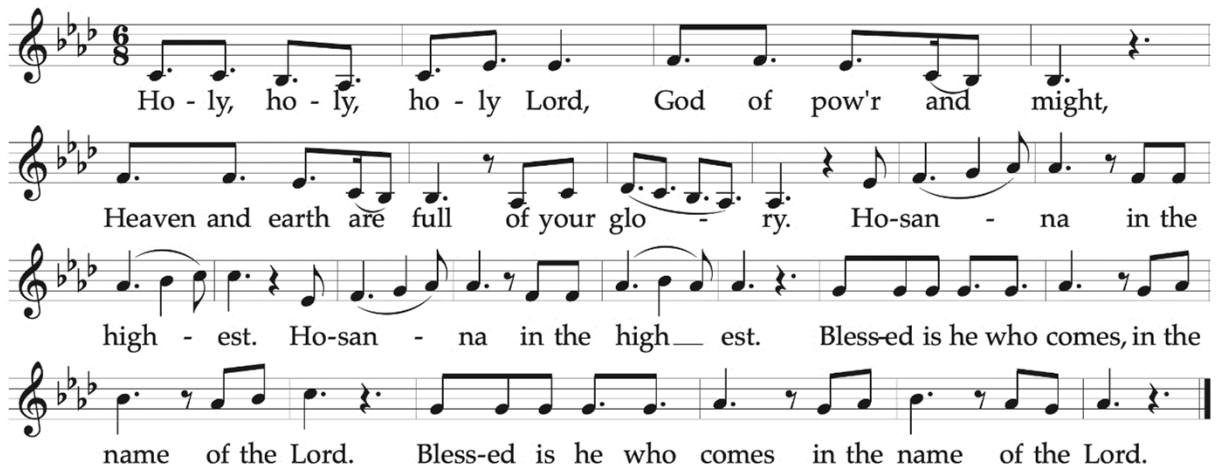
