The Sermon

“David and His Community”

1 Samuel 22:1-2; 27:1-12

Continuing the Series: The Life of David

^{22:1} David departed from there and escaped to the cave of Adullam. And when his brothers and all his father's house heard it, they went down there to him. ² And everyone who was in distress, and everyone who was in debt, and everyone who was bitter in soul, gathered to him. And he became commander over them. And there were with him about four hundred men.

^{27:1} Then David said in his heart, “Now I shall perish one day by the hand of Saul. There is nothing better for me than that I should escape to the land of the Philistines. Then Saul will despair of seeking me any longer within the borders of Israel, and I shall escape out of his

hand.”² So David arose and went over, he and the six hundred men who were with him, to Achish the son of Maach, king of Gath.³ And David lived with Achish at Gath, he and his men, every man with his household, and David with his two wives, Ahinoam of Jezreel, and Abigail of Carmel, Nabal's widow.⁴ And when it was told Saul that David had fled to Gath, he no longer sought him.⁵ Then David said to Achish, “If I have found favor in your eyes, let a place be given me in one of the country towns, that I may dwell there. For why should your servant dwell in the royal city with you?”⁶ So that day Achish gave him Ziklag. Therefore Ziklag has belonged to the kings of Judah to this day.⁷ And the number of the days that David lived in the country of the Philistines was a year and four months.⁸ Now David and his men went up and made raids against the Geshurites, the Girzites, and the Amalekites, for these were the inhabitants of the land from of old, as far as Shur, to the land of Egypt.⁹ And David would strike the land and would leave neither man nor woman alive, but would take away the sheep, the oxen, the donkeys, the camels, and the garments, and come back to Achish.¹⁰ When Achish asked, “Where have you made a raid today?” David would say, “Against the Negeb of Judah,” or, “Against the Negeb of the Jerahmeelites,” or, “Against the Negeb of the Kenites.”¹¹ And David would leave neither man nor woman alive to bring news to Gath, thinking, “lest they should tell about us and say, ‘So David has done.’” Such was his custom all the while he lived in the country of the Philistines.¹² And Achish trusted David, thinking, “He has made himself an utter stench to his people Israel; therefore he shall always be my servant.” —1 Samuel 22:1-2, 27:1-12

Introduction: Christians leaders of the past have said things like this about the church: “You cannot have God for your Father without having the church as your mother.” (Cyprian of Carthage, 3rd century AD) And this: “Ordinarily, there is no salvation outside the church.” (Westminster Confession of Faith, 17th century AD) We, on the other hand, can be heard to say things like: “Give me Jesus, but take the church!” or “I love God, but I am done with church!” To be fair, it seems that many Christians have struggled with being the church from early days, for the writer of Hebrews felt compelled to say: *Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.* (Hebrews 10:23-25) David, as anointed and rising king of Israel, together with his band of six hundred in the wilderness, in caves and forests and towns of the edges of the desert have much to teach us about being and doing church. Key Idea: **We are the church of the Christ the King! Here’s how we live and flourish as his church.**

A Word About Communion at Redeemer:

This is a time for all people to seek the Lord. For Christians, Communion (also called The Lord's Supper or The Eucharist, which means 'thanksgiving') is a time to meet with their Savior by faith, to be strengthened and renewed by him as they eat bread and drink wine. All baptized Christians who trust in Christ alone as their Savior and Lord, belong to a church that embraces the gospel, are at peace with their fellow neighbor, and seek strength and grace to live more faithfully with Christ, are invited to participate. If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer and to consider more deeply your relationship to Jesus Christ. We also ask that children who have not yet publicly professed their faith in Christ refrain from partaking until doing so.
