He commissioned the preparation of a new catechism for guiding ministers and teachers in instructing people in the Christian faith. A Modern English version is used here.

The Sermon

#### “David’s Shepherd”

*Psalm 23*

*Beginning the Series: The Life of David*

<sup>1</sup> The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want. <sup>2</sup> He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters. <sup>3</sup> He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. <sup>4</sup> Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. <sup>5</sup> You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. <sup>6</sup> Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord forever. —**Psalm 23**

Introduction: We will spend our spring and summer together around the life of David, as recorded in 1 and 2 Samuel. No life, in terms of the extent of personal detail or the exposure of interior being, gets more play in Scripture than David's. Not the story of Abraham, Moses, or Elijah; not the lives of Peter or Paul; not even the life of Jesus! We know more about David's personal journey with God than anyone else's. And it is full of brokenness, failure, and sin, as well as faith, hope, and love. Oliver Cromwell, the Lord Protector of England during the British Interregnum, said to his court painter Peter Lely: *I desire you would use all your skill to paint my picture truly like me, and not flatter me at all, [with] roughness, pimples, warts, and everything.* David is painted by the writer of Samuel "warts and all." David walked and ran with God, he stumbled and fell before God, and quite badly on more than one occasion, then got up again, all the while being utterly dependent upon the grace of the Lord. He became a man after God's own heart because he was a man fully dependent upon God's mercies being new to him morning by morning, year by year, decade by decade.

We begin our look at David's life by listening to some of David's music, his most famous song among the many he wrote or had written in his honor. (About half of the Psalter is attributed to David. He is a prolific poet/song writer!) David sings in Psalm 23 about God his Shepherd. And we can sing along with him. Key Idea: **With the Lord as our Shepherd, we will boast in his great care for us.**

## A Word About Communion at Redeemer:

This is a time for all people to seek the Lord. For Christians, Communion (also called The Lord's Supper or The Eucharist, which means 'thanksgiving') is a time to meet with their Savior by faith, to be strengthened and renewed by him as they eat bread and drink wine. All baptized Christians who trust in Christ alone as their Savior and Lord, belong to a church that embraces the gospel, are at peace with their fellow neighbor, and seek strength and grace to live more faithfully with Christ, are invited to participate. If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer and to consider more deeply your relationship to Jesus Christ. We also ask that children who have not yet publicly professed their faith in Christ refrain from partaking until doing so.

## The Great Thanksgiving

Minister: The Lord be with you.

People: **And also with you.**

Minister: Lift up your hearts.

People: **We lift them up to the Lord.**

Minister: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth and the life. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and leads to the life that you promise. Amen. **Prayer of Searching for Truth**

Lord, Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever before believed, but through you, I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared to hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross and offering forgiveness and new life. 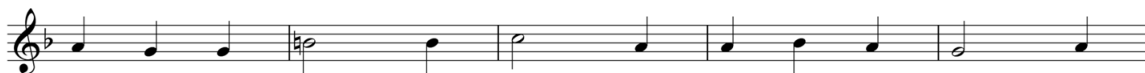
