Reflection and Preparation

“Oh that my words were written! Oh that they were inscribed in a book! Oh that with an iron pen and lead they were engraved in the rock forever! For I know that my Redeemer lives, and at the last he will stand upon the earth. And after my skin has been thus destroyed, yet in my flesh I shall see God, whom I shall see for myself, and my eyes shall behold, and not another. My heart faints within me!” — **Job 19:23-27**

But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they went to the tomb, taking the spices they had prepared. And they found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. The Apostles' Creed¹

Minister: Christian, in whom do you believe?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. ¹ Although not written by the apostles, the Apostles' Creed is a concise summary of their teachings. It originated in the 2nd century and developed into its present form by the 6th century.

² By referring to Jesus' descent into hell, the Christian embraces two truths. Firstly, Jesus received the full sentence of hell on behalf of his people while on the cross. Secondly, Jesus experienced the reign of death by remaining in the tomb after the crucifixion.

³ The term catholic refers to the church universal, knowing no racial, economic, geographical, or language barriers.

The Sermon

"The King Rises"

Matthew 28:1-10

Continuing the Series: Easter with the King

¹Now after the Sabbath, toward the dawn of the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. ²And behold, there was a great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. ³His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. ⁴And for fear of him the guards trembled and became like dead men. ⁵But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. ⁶He is not here, for he has risen, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. ⁷Then go quickly and tell his disciples that he has risen from the dead, and behold, he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him. See, I have told you." ⁸So they departed quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy and ran to tell his disciples. ⁹And behold, Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they came up and took hold of his feet and worshiped him. ¹⁰Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee, and there they will see me."

Introduction: Jesus the Christ; Jesus the King. Everything about his reign is surprisingly different than that of any other ruler the world has known. His birth is announced by choirs of angels, but he is laid as a babe in a manger. While many other kings have claimed to be a son of the gods or a god themselves, he is truly the Son of God, fully God as well as fully human, making the way for us to come to God. His earthly family of origin has royal heritage, but his parents are peasants. He grows up a carpenter's son. He heals, he casts out demons, yet he doesn't want people to talk about these things. He shines with glory up on a mountain, but warns the three followers who saw this to tell no one of what they saw. He comes, he says, *"not to be served, but to serve"* others, even to *"give his life as a ransom for many."* (Mark 10:45) He keeps talking about a willing death to give life to the world. He lays down his life freely, so that he and all who look to him may win by his losing. Very surprising, all of this. And the greatest surprise of all is that the King rises from the dead! Not just that he did rise – which is quite surprising enough – but how he rises and what he calls his followers to become because of Easter. And the surprise in his resurrection is full of Christ's grace! Key Idea: **King Jesus wants to bless you with an Easter surprise. Here's how....**

A Word About Communion at Redeemer:

This is a time for all people to seek the Lord. For Christians, Communion (also called The Lord's Supper or The Eucharist, which means 'thanksgiving') is a time to meet with their Savior by faith, to be strengthened and renewed by him as they eat bread and drink wine. All baptized Christians who trust in Christ alone as their Savior and Lord, belong to a church that embraces the gospel, are at peace with their fellow neighbor, and seek strength and grace to live more faithfully with Christ, are invited to participate. If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer and to consider more deeply your relationship to Jesus Christ. We also ask that children who have not yet publicly professed their faith in Christ refrain from partaking until doing so.
