

Prayer Journal 40 DAYS OF PRAYER

The Hebrew writer makes a proclamation that changes the dynamic between the created and the creator. We have no place in God's presence; we're too sinful and lowly. Yet Hebrews 4 proclaims that we have a "Great High Priest" in Jesus—one who goes before us and cleanses our iniquities, bringing us before our God! For that reason, Hebrews says we have the opportunity to do something incredible.

"Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need."

Hebrews 4:16

"...We do have such a high priest, who sat down at the right hand of the throne or the Majesty in heaven, and who serves in the sanctuary, the true tabernacle set up by the Lord, not by man. When we often think about the poor, we think about those who are poor in finances. And while God wants us to care for those poor in finances, I believe it also requires us to look at something we don't always consider: the inner person. Is this person poor in spirit? Lacking in hope? How can we help them have more hope? Are they poor in faith? How can we help their faith? How can we add to their joy? How can we add to their peace? Love? Kindness? We can give money or other needed items, and that seems easy to do because we can just give that portion and be done. We feel good that we've helped meet that need, but looking beyond the material needs to a person's spiritual or emotional needs sometimes requires us to walk alongside someone. We should be available emotionally, and it requires us to invest our time in them. While that can seem like a daunting task, like one more thing to add to our plate, we should look to Jesus. What did Jesus do? His actions were certainly not self-centered. Proverbs 19: 17 reminds us to look deeper. We are lending to God, and God is faithful.

"You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit – fruit that will last – and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you. This is my command: Love each other."

John 15:16-17

Jesus clearly states the purpose for which we have been chosen in this scripture, "I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit." The idea of bearing fruit is used throughout the Bible and is often used synonymously with good works. In John 15, Jesus uses the analogy of the vine and the branches to describe our relationship the Him. Jesus describes himself as the vine, we are the branches. The vine provides everything the branches need for bearing fruit. Apart from the vine, the branches can do nothing (verse 5).

I like to consider myself a gardener – I dabble – and I know from experience that if the branches of my crop are not receiving nutrients from the vine, the fruit will not produce. It may look pretty on the outside but be rotten in the core, or it may look as bad on the outside as it is on the inside. But, with a solid connection to the vine and the intake of good nutrients, the branch will produce abundant fruit, which in return provide nutrition for those who partake of it.

Spiritually speaking, we are told in Galatians 5 to walk in the way of the Spirit (in keeping with what the Spirit desires) and the fruit (good works) is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. When we are solidly connected to the vine (Jesus), He provides for the branches (us) all our needs to produce healthy, beneficial fruit for us to share with all who are in need.
