Youth Minister's Blog: The Waiting Game

First Week of Advent complete! The week began with our (Pre)-Advent retreat on Saturday December 2nd with Dr Josephine Lombardi. I did my best to hype up the retreat and speaker. I am so very grateful that she delivered what we needed. We are two weeks removed from our Advent retreat and I am still processing different things Dr. Josephine had said - I think a lot of us are. It's like the further removed from the retreat I get the more the Lord reveals in my time of prayer! So, I wanted to take my time with the blog while I have it, to share my perspective, thoughts, and a little bit of my heart ❤️

We are in a season of waiting, waiting on the Lord to make his humble and modest arrival into the world. Something I think you should know about me is that I am not the best at waiting :) I know this about myself, the Lord knows this about me too (because He gave me that personality). It works when I need to get things done - I am a goer and a doer but it doesn't work so well when God is asking me to be patient. So how funny is it that my two main takeaways from the retreat that stuck with me were:

1. "God's delays are not God's denial"
2. "God grant me peace in my waiting"

Okay Lord, I'm picking up on a running theme here. Wait and trust, wait and trust, wait on and trust in You. Easier said than done!

Let me dive a little deeper into these thoughts (they go hand and hand):

1. **God's delays are not God's denial.** So often my thought process is "Oh, if it's not happening the way I want it in the time I want it, it's not going to happen" Silly, silly, Sam. The Lord does not operate on my timeline and praise God for that! He knows me better than I know myself, so if I have to wait, I need to remember that it's not necessarily a "no" it's a "not right now" for my own good.
2. **God grant me peace in my waiting.** I need to ask the Lord to grant me the peace to know and understand that my time of waiting is not time wasted. The Lord uses our time of waiting to grow and stretch us so that when our waiting is over, we are prepared to receive, just like the time of Advent. Remembering that God's delays are not God's denial...when I mean prepared to receive I mean prepared to receive what we asked for but that also means preparing to not receive what we asked for but remembering that the Lord is good, merciful and faithful and that He has something far better for you than you could ever imagine.

For me, this waiting game will probably be a lifelong effort but I'm happy to have opportunities to grow in the virtue of patience and ultimately growing in my relationship with God!

Those are my thoughts for this weekend! Don't forget to bring your Baby Jesus' to get blessed this weekend as we get to light the third candle, (and my favourite candle) the rose candle!
