Youth Minister's Blog: A Day in the Life of a Youth Minister

Hello! Coming to you fresh off of our Christmas break, I will be taking over the blog this week and my partner in crime, Adriene, will be taking over the blog next week as our pastor takes off on (a well deserved) vacation!

Fun fact: whenever we get asked to take over the blog we basically get free rein over what we write about! So this time I'm taking you along with me for a regular day in my life as a full time Youth Minister!

Let me just preface this by saying - because of the nature of my job, my days never look the same... ever. Some days I am at my desk working logistics on my computer from 10am to 5pm and other days you can't catch me because I'm with the youth at their school or in planning meetings for future events! Then there are the weekends where I am almost never at my desk because weekends are what we like to call ministry days! Meaning that I am out and about with teens and middle schoolers (on Saturday and Sunday evenings) or with you, the people of the parish (at all of the Masses on Sunday)!

7:00am: Wake up - I'll admit, sometimes it's later than that but I do my best as an anti-morning person

7:00-7:30am: Morning prayer time! - Recently I have been listening to Ascension's new [Rosary in a Year podcast](#) with Fr. Mark-Mary, OH it's amazing and I cannot recommend it enough!

7:30-8:00am: Get ready for work - Usually I do this while listening to an audiobook, a different podcast or dancing around my house to music much to the rest of my family's dismay.

8:00am-8:20am: Breakfast! - The most important meal of the day! (And unfortunately the one that I skip most often)

8:20-8:45am: Commuting time - Again, I am usually playing a podcast, an audiobook or *really* loud music

8:45-9:00am: Prep for Mass - this usually means putting my lunch away and grabbing my journal, spiritual reading, rosary, veil etc.

9:00-10:00am: Holy Hour! - I like to call this my "Holy Hour" because Mass is 30 mins and I try to spend at least 30 mins in Adoration checking in with the Lord

10-5:30pm: WORK - Like I said before, this will look completely different depending on the liturgical season, whether I have school visits or not and whether I have meetings or not. I like it! It keeps me on my toes!

5:30-6:00pm: commuting time - *This time is also dependent on if I have an event in the evening or not*

6:00-10:00pm: Dinner + Hobbies and family time - This is my wind down time so I try and do something that I like and something that is relaxing, currently I have been embroidering, knitting and sewing and I will do this while listening to an audiobook (can you tell I like to read?) or watching a tv show.

10-10:30pm: Evening Prayer Time - Gotta check in with the Lord! Usually I take this time to do the [St. Ignatius of Loyola Examen](#)

10:30pm: Lights out - Again... I try but sometimes lights out is later than this...

And there you have it! A day in my life! I hope this was somewhat interesting to read about!

SSVP 2024 YEAR-END SUMMARIES

Throughout the year, our SSVP team made 290 visits, serving 79 households, consisting of 189 adults (including 17 seniors) and 37 children. We distributed \$29,795 in grocery gift cards and \$1,811.80 in bus tickets.

At Christmas, we assisted 57 households, consisting of 89 adults (including 11 seniors) and 34 children. We distributed \$11,829 in gift cards and bus tickets.

I read this powerful quote from Jimmy Carter the other day: "My faith demands — this is not optional — my faith demands that I do whatever I can, wherever I am, whenever I can, for as long as I can, with whatever I have to try to make a difference." It's good for each of us to ask what our faith demands of us. Thank you for making a difference through your generosity and in the various ways in which you minister to others. May we be grateful for God's blessings as we enter this New Year and continue to share them generously.
