LPA's Blog - Adriene's Updates

First Communion Preparation Updates

Over the past four weeks, Fr Michael walked us through the precepts of the Church. This week your friendly neighbourhood LPA takes her turn with the weekly blog. I'd like to use this time to give an update on how ministry has been going from my end over the last couple of months, particularly with First Holy Communion preparation.

This year we have 22 children preparing to receive their first communion. We began this preparation process back in the fall by offering weekly sessions for their parents to make our first communion program an experience for the entire family. In light of our parish vision, we wanted to invite our families into an experience to know Jesus Christ in a real and personal way. We also wanted to help equip parents in their role as primary educators of the faith for their children by taking them deeper in their faith. It was a beautiful six weeks spent watching parents build community and find a home within the St. Mary Star of the Sea parish family. Fast forward to January we began the classes for the children. We are more than half way through the sessions as we conclude in April! Over the past three months, the children have been learning about the sacrament of confession and who they truly encounter in the confessional. After they made their first confession, we began our sessions on the Eucharist. I wanted to share some of my highlights from teaching these classes alongside the team.

While playing a video of the Last Supper for the kids, I had one child in the middle of it randomly approach me to ask, "is the Eucharist more important than your birthday? Or is your birthday more important than the Eucharist?" This question came after I was teaching the kids that the Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith and that it is the best thing we could ever receive. Because the video was playing, I told her that I would answer her question later when we teach them about the celebration of Mass.

Another highlight was being asked by one of the children who my best friend is. My automatic reply was "Jesus!" To which her eyes widened and she responded, "okay but like I meant someone who is alive!" I replied, "He is. He is actually upstairs in the Church right now." It is awesome how these side conversations with the kids end up inspiring future lessons. In one of our lessons, I was teaching them about how the Church we are in is like a castle because Jesus, the King, is here. In their final session, we will be taking them through a "Church Tour" where they will learn where exactly the King is located.

The last highlight I wanted to share is just how endearing it is to see the children's love for Fr Michael. Many of you have seen the cartoon Fr Michaels I have crafted over time (I made trading cards just for fun which features "Confession Fr Michael", "Marian Fr Michael", and "Mario Fr Michael"), I like using these in my lessons to explain the role of the priest within the sacraments. What better way to explain this than using our own parish priest as they are used to seeing him on Sundays or during school visits.

At our last class, I read them a book called "Arthur the Clumsy Altar Server Rings the Bells" where one of the main characters is a priest. Midway through the story, one of the children asks, "can you change the name of the priest to Fr Michael instead?" And so we read the remainder of the story with Fr Michael as one of the main characters.

The children will be making their first communion on Sunday, April 28th at the 11am Mass. Please keep these little ones in your prayers as they come closer and closer to receiving our Lord for the first time in the Eucharist!


