PASTOR'S BLOG

First Week of Advent complete! The week began with our (Pre)-Advent retreat on Saturday December 2nd with Dr Josephine Lombardi. I did my best to hype up the retreat and speaker. I am so very grateful that she delivered what we needed to hear. It was a beautiful and blessed day. Amazing talks, great discussion, a time of prayer in Adoration of Our Blessed Lord...what more could one ask for in a half day retreat! To organize such a retreat, it takes many hours in prayer, in planning and in executing. My thanks to Adriene, Sam and the hospitality team for their dedication and commitment. Over the next couple of weeks of Advent you will get to hear from Sam and Adriene on their experience of the retreat.

The next event that we hosted was our combined school Advent Mass with the blessing of our outdoor creche. We began this custom last year with the idea coming from one of our principals who had seen it done at one of the former schools where she was an administrator. I figured, let's give it a try. While last year's attendance at the Mass was okay, this year we more than doubled that attendance. We made some adjustments, brought in a combined school children choir, and had the blessing of the creche. It was family oriented and everyone who came was grateful for having the opportunity to worship God as a parish family and for the fellowship in the hall. My sincere thanks goes to Mrs McCann and Mr Gibson for their support and encouragement, the teachers who organized the children's choir and those who were present at the Mass, and to the parent councils of both schools who organized the light refreshments in the hall.

In the spirit of Advent of looking back and looking forward to situate us in our present, we now look forward to our Rorate Mass on December 16th at 7am, Bambinelli Sunday and then Christmas. I figure I would spend the rest of my blog trying to explain how we can meet our Sunday and Christmas obligations this year with Christmas falling on a Monday. I know we will be getting a lot of phone calls and questions about this anyways, but here we go. Option 1: Two for two

Many, maybe most Catholics will opt for simply going to their usual morning Mass on successive days — first on December 24 for the Fourth Sunday of Advent and then again the next day for Christmas. It's easy to remember, simple to plan around, and the no-nonsense solution. Two obligations, two Masses, two days, Sunday and Monday.

At St. Mary's, the Mass times for Sunday December 24th are 9am and 11am and Monday December 25th are 9am and 11am.

Option 2: 'Vigil' all the way

There is, of course, more than one way to go to Mass twice in two days — especially at Christmas when a lot of people prefer to go to the Mass in the night. Anticipatory Masses can take place the day before a Sunday — and "vigil" Masses the day before a feast.

At St. Mary's, the Mass times for the "vigils" are Saturday December 23rd at 5pm and Sunday December 24th at 5pm and 10pm.

Option 3: The long weekend

If you want to take Sunday December 24th to relax, meal preparation, or travel long distance for family functions, you can attend a Saturday anticipated Mass for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, and then go for morning Mass on Christmas Day, essentially giving yourself a day off in between celebrations.

At St. Mary's, this option is going to Mass on Saturday December 23rd at 5pm and then going to Mass on Monday December 25th at 9am or 11am.

Option 4: Super Sunday

Not for the faint-hearted, but instead of spreading your Eucharistic obligations across three days, you could opt to pack them all into one Super Sunday. To do that, you would go to Sunday morning Mass for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, and then to Mass again, later that afternoon or evening, for a Christmas vigil Mass.

At St. Mary's this option is going to Mass on Sunday December 24th for the 4th Sunday of Advent at 9am or 11am and then coming to Mass in the evening for the 5pm or 10pm Christmas vigil Mass.

Option 5: Double Christmas

If you really want to maximize your carol singing chances, and double down on nativity narratives for the Gospel reading, you could opt for two Christmas Masses.

The Sunday obligation — that Catholics attend weekly Masses on the Lord's Day — is one of those cases in which “liturgical time” and of-the-clock-time don't exactly overlap, at least sometimes.

Catholics are obliged to attend Mass every Sunday, including the Fourth Sunday of Advent. And they are obliged to go to Mass for the feast of Christmas. Those two obligations are distinct and have to be met separately — but there's no rule mandating that the Mass Catholics attend for their Sunday obligation actually be celebrated liturgically for the Fourth Sunday of Advent.

So you could attend back-to-back vigil Masses for Christmas on Sunday evening, or a vigil Mass in the evening, followed by another Mass in the evening or Mass on Christmas Day, and have satisfied both your Sunday and Christmas Day obligations.

At St. Mary's this option will have you attending Mass on Sunday December 24th at 5pm and then coming to Mass again at 10pm or going to Mass on Monday December 25th at 9am or 11am.

Now that was a lot. To help those who learn better with visual aids, here is a diagram (this is not the smile of the week!):
