Pilgrims Blog...the finale

Well, I never actually finished my pilgrimage blogs. On the weekend of May 3/4 (not to be confused May 2-4...HAHA...) I mentioned that there would be one more posting about the pilgrimage which would come at a time when it would be fitting. Well this Corpus Christi weekend is the most fitting weekend to talk about the last days of the pilgrimage to Italy because we visited Orvieto. The Eucharistic miracle of Bolsena that is conserved in the Cathedral of Orvieto led to the Feast of Corpus Christi.

So, a little history about the feast of Corpus Christi. This feast honours the Real Presence of Christ and was promoted by the visions of St. Juliana of Liege (in France), an Augustinian nun who understood from her visions that God wanted a feast to honour the Blessed Sacrament, in response to a controversy that had arisen which had made the presence of Christ in the Eucharist more symbolic than real. While that was happening in France, the Eucharistic miracle took place when a German priest, Fr Peter was having doubts about the Real Presence of the Eucharist was going to Rome on pilgrimage. He was in Bolsena – a city on a large lake about 18 kilometers (11 miles) southwest of Orvieto – to celebrate Mass. Just after the consecration, the Host began to bleed. Flabbergasted, the priest suspended the Mass and went straight to Orvieto. As part of the Papal States, Pope Urban IV was currently in residence there with his papal court.

After investigation, the miracle was found to be authentic. The feast was first celebrated locally. Pope Urban IV extended it to the Universal Church in 1264. The Mass and office for the feast of Corpus Christi was composed by Saint Thomas Aquinas while he was a member of the Papal court of Urban IV.

Our visit to the city was great. We had lovely weather, and found in the heart of the Umbria region, the scenery was very picturesque. Because the streets are small and the Church is found at the top of the hill, we had to make our pilgrimage walk up to get to the Church. It was bright and early because our first task of the day was celebrating Mass at the Cathedral. We were not able to celebrate Mass at the main altar, but we had a beautiful little crypt chapel. It was the last Mass that we would celebrate as a group of pilgrims. After Mass, we had some time before meeting our local guide, so our group coordinator, Agnes, was able to get us into the underground city tour of Orvieto. Once we climbed out of the underground city, we met our local guide for a tour of the Cathedral and the surrounding area of Orvieto. Sadly, the miraculous blood stained corporal was not exposed for veneration and adoration. It is only done selectively throughout the year like for the feast of Corpus Christi. After our tour, I found myself in the chapel praying. I was a bit upset that I could not see this miraculous corporal, but in that time of prayer realized, I don't need it for my faith. The Eucharistic miracles, of which there are many (Blessed Carlo Acutis made a whole website for them) were needed for me when I was growing up, wanting to defend the faith in the Real Presence and for my own faith to be strengthened. Now, with faith, as a priest a miracle happens in my hands when I celebrate Mass.

Once I finished my time of prayer, I caught up with some pilgrims and we went for lunch. After lunch was a lot of free time in which I walked around, sat around and enjoyed my time outdoors taking in the scenery. When the afternoon came around, we had to catch our bus and head back to Rome for departure to Toronto.

...and that is a wrap for the pilgrimage blogs. Not sure where the good Lord will take me next for a pilgrimage...I am sure it will be fun...I mean it is a pilgrimage with me! LOL
