Pastor's Blog

Well, it has been a few weeks since I last wrote to you in a pastor's blog. The reason for that is well, not much is going on in the life of the pastor. But, given this weekend's readings I wanted to take this opportunity to thank all those who are living out their vocation to marriage in good times and bad, in sickness and in health. In these weeks, I have celebrated the anniversary of a couple celebrating 60 years of marriage, and prayed with a couple who are celebrating 50 years of marriage. In the midst of these milestones, we also remember all the couples who are just recently married and living out heroically their vows. This really is a true testament and witness to God's love in this crazy, chaotic world.

We know statistics about getting married these days...and the more tragic statistics about getting married in the Church. In times like these, it takes a great intention to swim up the stream and get married in the Church. Over the last few years, it has been a grace to see LPA Adriene and her fiance Adrian live out this intentionality. And so, I figured, you have heard a lot about the feminine genius from Adriene...I would like to turn over to the masculine genius and let Adrian share about his journey and vocation to marriage.

LPA's Fiancee's Blog

Hello everyone!

You're probably used to receiving reflections from Fr. Michael Simoes or wedding updates from your lovely LPA Adriene. But today, you're hearing from the other Adrian—the guy Adrian (Adriene's fiancé)! I'm honoured to have this opportunity, given by Fr. Michael, to share a bit of my own personal reflection as I prepare to enter into marriage, and share a part of my heart with you all during this exciting time!

Twenty. More. Days.

In just twenty days, Adriene and I will become husband and wife. It's surreal to think this is actually happening, and to be completely honest, it hasn't fully hit me yet! Maybe it's the whirlwind of wedding planning, preparing our future home, or just the busyness of work. But as the days go by, I am increasingly aware of the gravity of this decision, this union, and I am more and more affirmed that Adriene is truly my vocation.

As a young Catholic man, I, of course, contemplated Holy Orders and whether that was my vocation. My heart has always been drawn to serving Christ in any capacity—whether through youth ministry, music, hospitality at my local parish, or even being drawn to lend a helping hand to those I see in need. This desire to serve led me to seriously consider if the Lord was calling me to priesthood. At a different season in my life, I believed God was preparing me for this, a greater act of service to Him. Naturally, my thoughts turned to the priesthood. However, it soon became clear that He was, in fact, preparing me for the vocation I am so sure of now, the vocation of marriage, and more specifically, being married to Adriene.

Marriage and Holy Orders are both sacraments of service, each designed to reflect and extend Christ's love in unique ways. While Holy Orders calls a man to serve the Church through priestly ministry, marriage calls a man and a woman to serve each other, their family, and the broader community through the love they share. In marriage, a husband and wife enter into a covenant that

mirrors Christ's relationship with the Church. Just as a priest offers his life in service to the Church, spouses offer their lives to one another. This mutual self-giving is a living testament to the love of Christ, who laid down His life for His bride, the Church. In this way, marriage becomes a sacramental sign of God's love—not only for the couple but for the world.

As Adriene and I prepare to enter the sacrament of marriage, I find myself reflecting more and more on the feast day of our wedding, The Exaltation of the Cross, September 14th, and how the cross is the perfect example of sacrificial love and service, the perfect example of love poured out without reservation. The cross teaches me that true love is not about self-interest, but about giving oneself entirely for the good of the other. As I reflect on this in these final days before marriage, I am striving to imitate that same self-giving love and service within my own relationship. Just as Christ gave everything for His bride, the Church, I am called to give everything for my future wife—not just in these moments leading up to our wedding, but throughout all the years that follow, to serve her, to provide for her, to love her and honour her all the days of my life. This is the love that sustains a marriage, and I pray for the grace to live it out daily.

With that being said, As we prepare to begin this new chapter, I ask you to keep us in your prayers. Please pray for Adriene as she steps into her role as a wife, and for me as I embrace my role as a husband. May we both uplift each other and keep Christ at the center of our lives and our marriage. Your prayers mean the world to us as we embark on this journey together.


ST. MARY STAR OF THE SEA PARISH VISION
