Pastor's Blog - May 25/26 2024

With the Confirmation of 12 young people from our parish family, we officially conclude our Sacramental year for 2024. It is always a blessing to administer the Sacraments but a grace filled and privileged place to accompany these families and young people through Sacramental Preparation. As a parish staff, we will take a short break, reflect and discuss in order to plan for the 2025 Sacramental season. For those families who have a child in grade 1 or grade 6, look out in the coming weeks (before the end of school) for scheduled dates.

But the excitement does not end here at St. Mary's! Next weekend we have our *Corpus Christi* procession. Last week I provided some Q&A from the Archdiocese. This week, I will continue with those Frequently Asked Questions, this time a bit more specific for *Corpus Christi*.

Why are there Eucharistic processions on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ?

Expressions of public piety and devotion to Christ present in the Eucharist reach back through centuries of Church history. Eucharistic processions on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ developed as a public witness to the truth of Christ present in the Eucharist. The Latin Church has formally celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (*Corpus Christi*) since the year 1264. In the 16th and 17th centuries, public acts of piety and devotion to the Most Blessed Sacrament grew in response to challenges to the Real Presence (Directory on Popular Piety, 160-162, 246).

Processions on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ continue today: "When it can be done in the judgment of the diocesan bishop, a procession through the public streets is to be held as a public witness of veneration toward the Most Holy Eucharist, especially on the solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ." (Code of Canon Law 944.1)

How can participation in a Eucharistic procession on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ help me to grow in faith?

St. Pope John Paul II taught that "The devout participation of the faithful in the Eucharistic procession on the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ is a grace from the Lord which yearly brings joy to those who take part in it." (Ecclesia de Eucharistia, 10) In this act of public worship, we experience being on pilgrimage, which is the Church's condition. The People of God walks "with Christ and after Christ, aware that in this world it has no lasting dwelling. Through the streets of this earth it moves towards the heavenly Jerusalem." (Directory on Popular Piety, 247) It is an opportunity to prayerfully walk with Christ, and to grow more deeply in love for Him.

Because the celebration of *Corpus Christi* coincides with the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops initiative for a Eucharistic Revival, there are a lot of resources on FORMED to deepen your understanding of the Eucharist which will help you grow in your faith.
