PASTOR'S BLOG DECEMBER 1, 2024

The Journey of Advent

As the saying goes, time certainly flies. It does not seem all too long ago that I was writing about getting back to school and all the events that we had in September. And now it is the beginning of December and the beginning of Advent. With only 4 weeks (25 days) left until Christmas (thank God for Advent calendars to keep me in the moment), there are many things that you probably have to do, as do I at the parish, to get prepared for Christmas. With all the noise of the world, especially in the commercial world that advertises for sales and other offers, it is wise to keep all of that in perspective with our focus on the reason for Christmas being the birth of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. Flowing from that perspective comes the family gatherings and other socials that celebrate the gift of Jesus in our hearts and lives. The love that He brings into our darkened world, should be brought into our families and to look for opportunities to share that love with members of the family that are in need of it during this time of year.

To help us keep focused on the reason for Christmas during the Advent season, there are a lot of resources to assist. One resource that you can access through the FORMED platform which the parish pays an annual subscription fee for, so that our parishioners can access all the materials for free? It is like Catholic "Netflix" with a tonne of great materials. Here is the link from our parish website that will show you how to access all the content on the FORMED platform for free:

The program that they have put together is called Rooted which is a 25 day daily devotional that uses the Jesse Tree model for reflections. It is great a resource for families that want to journey to Christmas through salvation history with activities for children each day.

Ascension Press has put together a resource with celebrity priest, Fr Mike Schmitz called Face to Face. For some Canadian content, this Advent season, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCCB) presents an online weekly video series titled "Journey through Advent." This year's English reflections will be led by Archbishop Leo.. The series is intended to help the faithful prepare for the Nativity of Our Lord by offering meaningful reflections on the Gospel readings during each of the four Sundays of Advent. "Journey through Advent" will be released weekly and will be available on the CCCC website and on their YouTube channel.

Also, the National Catholic Broadcasting Council has an Advent Retreat series, this year led by Archbishop Emeritus Cardinal Thomas Collins.

Preparing for Christmas through Advent

With your personal preparations for Christmas, the preparations at the parish continue to roll along. I would draw your attention to our schedule for Advent and Christmas so that you can connect with us during this season.

One area that I could use your support and help is with regards to our Christmas decorations. We want our Church to always look beautiful for Christmas as we welcome not only you but also your family members and guests. Our budget this year for decorating the Advent wreath, outdoor decorations, along with all the indoor decorations is \$1,500. In your box of envelopes, you will find an envelope that is for Christmas flowers. You can drop that off in the offertory bin at any Mass, bring it to the office, or speak to me. Many thanks for your generosity!

Liturgical Considerations for the New Year

With the season of Advent also begins a new liturgical year. With this change in time is also an opportunity to make a few liturgical changes. I have been praying about this for quite sometime and I figured this would be the best time to begin.

The first change effects all Masses and that is with regards to the singing of the psalm. We have become accustomed to the psalm being sung from the choir loft. But, because the psalm is integral to the Liturgy of the Word, the primary place for it to be sung is at the ambo, where the Word of God is proclaimed. And so, beginning this weekend, the psalm will be sung by our cantor at the ambo. My hope with this change is that by seeing the cantor sing the psalm, it will provide you with support to sing the psalm refrain with confidence and joy.

The next change effects the 5pm Saturday Vigil and the 9am Sunday Masses. In Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter, we have been using Latin parts of the Mass for all Masses and then in Ordinary Time, we shift to English. Beginning this 1st Sunday of Advent, the 5pm Saturday Vigil and 9am Sunday Masses will be singing the parts of the Mass in English year round. We will be using the ICEL chants that you can find in your Sunday Missal, pages 643-651 for Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter. We will continue to use the current English parts of the Mass for Ordinary Time. Once again, this is to encourage singing the parts of the Mass with the cantor and providing you with options that would suit your preference.

The last change effects the 11am Sunday Mass. Rather than shifting to English during Ordinary Time, we will be using Latin parts of the Mass year round. The laminated cards in the pews will help you to sing with the choir as you have become accustomed to over these many years. For Ordinary Time, we will be using the ICEL Latin chants that you can find in your Catholic Book of Worship, 299. The other change coming to the 11am Mass is that we will begin to chant the Our Father in English. The tone is fairly straight forward and you will easily be able to follow along. It will be an adjustment at first, but will help us in our worship as we sing the Mass.

Alright, that was a long one. Of course, if you have any questions, please, please, PLEASE do not be afraid to ask me.
