Corpus Christi

I hope you did not think that last week was the last time that I would write something about Corpus Christi! Gosh, what not to write? But the phrase that came up this week for me was *Quo Vadis* translated “Where are you going?” Or “Where are you marching?” To go along with that phrase was the unique passage found in the Gospel According to St. Luke as a resurrection account commonly known as the Road to Emmaus.

Pope Benedict XVI in 2008 had a beautiful answer to the first question in light of the Corpus Christi procession:

The Corpus Christi procession teaches us that the Eucharist seeks to free us from every kind of despondency and discouragement, wants to raise us, so that we can set out on the journey with the strength God gives us through Jesus Christ ... Each one can find his own way if he encounters the One who is the Word and the Bread of Life and lets himself be guided by his friendly presence. Without the God-with-us, the God who is close, how can we stand up to the pilgrimage through life, either on our own or as society and the family of peoples? The Eucharist is the Sacrament of the God who does not leave us alone on the journey but stays at our side and shows us the way. Indeed, it is not enough to move onwards, one must also see where one is going! “Progress” does not suffice, if there are no criteria as reference points. On the contrary, if one loses the way one risks coming to a precipice, or at any rate more rapidly distancing oneself from the goal. God created us free but he did not leave us alone: he made himself the “way” and came to walk together with us so that in our freedom we should also have the criterion we need to discern the right way and to take it.

As for the second image, the Road to Emmaus, I think it speaks to maybe how some might be feeling. Showing our faith in the public sphere is certainly daunting especially in these days. But like the two disciples who were falling into despair, afraid of the Jewish authorities and what they might do or say to them for being His disciples, Jesus comes to walk with them and gives them hope and courage. He makes himself known to them in the Breaking of the Bread, code for the Eucharist. Our take away: God is with us, He rose from the dead. There is nothing that we need to be afraid about. Rather, we should be joyful on the road and sing hymns and pray to the God who saves and calls us to himself, who becomes food for our journey.

Closing remarks go to Pope Benedict:

This is why gathering, walking and adoring together fills us with joy. In making our own the adoring attitude of Mary...let us pray for ourselves and for everyone; let us pray for every person who lives in this city, that he or she may know you, O Father and the One whom you sent, Jesus Christ and thus have life in abundance. Amen.
