PASTOR'S BLOG

In looking back, I will reflect on some of the events that have happened in our parish and then looking forward becomes a "Save the Date" for you, the reader. Looking Back on the Month of September

September came and went like the blink of an eye. Every weekend there was something happening at the parish and it was a nice jump into the water after a pretty calm summer.

One of the highlights for September was the partnership that we have formed with Canadian Food for Children (CFFC). At the beginning of the month and the beginning of the school year, we had our second annual Backpack drive and blessing of the backpacks. The backpacks that we collected were donated to CFFC. Many thanks for all your support in this endeavour. As we were told at the warehouse, these backpacks will be divided with half going to the local need in the community and the other half going to the international need. A couple weekends later we were blessed to have Dr Andrew Simone, the founder of the CFFC, speak to us at all Masses. He is a wonderful witness to authentic stewardship and makes real the poverty that is in our midst. For me, it was nice to put a face to the name. And with his testimony, it gives us a better understanding of why we collect certain items like soap and salt.

The other highlight was our Parish Family Potluck. As I was walking around and greeting the faithful as they were eating, I heard a lot of compliments to the chefs! So much excellent food was prepared and shared amongst parishioners. It was also great to see so many new faces! Our parish community is slowly changing and to have our parish as a place of refuge and beacon of hope with these changes happening around us is a blessing. Many thanks to all those who provided food from your abundance to share with us. And thank you to all those who stayed for the fellowship! It is a grace filled moment seeing parishioners from different Masses interact, and for those who do not get to talk to each other after Mass because of other commitments catching up. Life goes by so quickly, so we should savour these moments when we can slow down and just be with one another.

Finally, on September 13th we celebrated our annual Mass at St. Mary's Port Credit Cemetery. While the attendance has slowly dropped over the last few years, its always a nice to offer the Mass and then take a walk through the cemetery, seeing the names of those who built the community. Within a week, I would be back at the cemetery burying one of those pillars, John Holland. It was a week to look back on the history of our parish, where we have come from and now, where we are going.

Looking Ahead into the Month of October
