Pastor's Corner: Third Sunday of Advent

This weekend, we light the third candle on our Advent wreath, the **rose** candle. This indicates that our time of waiting is almost complete, 11 days until Christmas. we are invited to rejoice amid our waiting and preparations for the coming of Jesus. Humility helps in our waiting, knowing that God is control, and His timing is the best for us. Repenting of our sins, this conversion of mind that St. John the Baptist was inviting the people by the Jordan river, helps in our preparations. Both humility and repentance should bear the fruit of the Holy Spirit, joy.

Christian joy is not a fleeting emotion but a deep gift of the Holy Spirit, enduring through trials and sufferings. As Pope John Paul II explains in Dies Domini, Sunday is especially a day to rediscover this joy, rooted in Christ's Resurrection, far beyond shallow pleasures. Christian joy consoles even in the "dark night of suffering." It is not superficial cheer but a confident trust in Emmanuel, "God-with-us." As Pope Benedict XVI reminds us, Advent awakens expectation, making the present meaningful as we await the eternal.

In our busy Advent preparations, let this joy fill your hearts. Go to confession, celebrate the Eucharist with gladness, serve the needy as the Psalmist praises God who frees prisoners and upholds the widow. Finally, trust in the Spirit's comfort against melancholy. May Mary, model of waiting, guide us to Bethlehem's light.
