### Solemnities of Ordinary Time

The Easter season officially ends at the conclusion of 2nd Vespers for Pentecost. We started the season with a beautiful Easter Triduum and concluded with our parish mission, praying the Novena of Pentecost. But as we enter into the liturgical season of "Ordinary Time", I pray that we continue to have a forward focus, with the power of the Holy Spirit, in living the mission that Jesus gave to His Church in the ordinary circumstances of life. The Holy Spirit transforms the ordinary to the extraordinary!

But if you are expecting the green Ordinary Time vestments for the weekend Masses, we won't be seeing them yet. We have a very unique month of June with three Solemnities being celebrated - The Most Holy Trinity (this weekend), *Corpus Christi* (June 21/22, 2025), and the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul (June 28/29, 2025). Each one of these solemnities allows us to reflect on a different dimension to grow in our relationship with God thanks to the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

### The Most Holy Trinity

The solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity allows us to reflect on who is this God that I am entering into a relationship with: "The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is therefore the source of all other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the 'hierarchy of the truths of faith'. The whole history of salvation is identical with the history of the way and the means by which the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, reveals himself to men 'and reconciles and unites with himself those who turn away from sin'." (CCC 234)

### Corpus Christi

The solemnity of *Corpus Christi* allows us to reflect on the "Sacrament of Sacraments", our privileged encounter with the living God in the Eucharist: "In the Eucharist, Jesus gives us a share in God's divine life by giving us his own Blood so that we might share in his divine nature (see 2 Peter 1:4). What is this divine nature? Essentially, it is the inner life of the Trinity: three Persons eternally pouring themselves out in self-giving love for one another. This is agape, or charity (see 1 John 4:8). Drinking the precious Blood of the risen Jesus gives us an opportunity to have Christ's sacred heart beating in our breasts and the divine life of charity coursing through our veins." (What We Believe, 136)

Following the 11am Mass, we will be having our annual *Corpus Christi* procession throughout Port Credit. This year, we will be having three "Eucharistic Stations" to pray for our nation, our city and our parish. We look forward to having this time to call down the Holy Spirit and to go out into the world as joy filled disciples.

### Sts. Peter and Paul

The solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul allows us to reflect on our relationship with God through the Church and her apostolic foundations. Peter, the Rock, was the chief of the Apostles, their leader and our first Pope. Peter was executed by being crucified upside down in the reign of Nero sometime between A.D. 64 & 67. His tomb was believed, since before the time of Constantine, to have been under what we now call the Vatican. In 1968 Pope Paul VI announced that the skeletal remains of St. Peter had been found beneath the high altar.

Paul, the Pharisee who was converted on his trip to Damascus was also executed in the reign of Nero, in A.D. 67 or 68. Possibly at the same time as St. Peter. His tomb is the site of the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls. Since he was a Roman citizen, the mode of execution according to the same tradition was decapitation.
