PASTOR'S BLOG – SEPTEMBER 29, 2024

Last week in the blog I reminisced about the life of the parish community...110 years of pastoral ministry in beautiful downtown Port Credit. The pilgrimage of faith that this community has walked through many generations being led by both the clergy with their pastoral vision and the faithful who worked tirelessly to help achieve that vision truly gives glory to God.

On this particular weekend I was reminded by a photo album in my office of my small part played in the 110 years as I was "installed" as your parish priest 6 years ago in 2019. It was an event that brought our parish family together with a potluck reception that truly humbled me with the generosity of this community. (Another reason to celebrate with our parish family potluck this weekend!) So, this 6 year anniversary, what did I do? I went back into the archives of my messages, at that time with the paper bulletin, and re-read my reflection following the special event. Here is what I wrote:

In his homily at the Mass of installation, His Excellency Bishop Boissonneau spoke about this event in the life of the parish. All of us, as children of the Heavenly Father through Baptism, are called by him to assist in building up the kingdom of God here in this small portion of the Kingdom in Port Credit Mississauga. Remember, as I was escorted to the various places in the Church where I exercise my ministry of Baptizing, hearing Confessions and absolving sins, sanctifying, preaching, praying and offering the Holy Sacrifice, you also made a promise, with the help of God, to assist me in these areas.

Each of you belong to this parish community and each of you are entrusted, as stewards, to give of your time, talent and treasure to help the community grow in faith and become other Christ's to the world.

As the parish embarks in these next years of pastoral ministry...as I embark in these next years as your parish priest, we still have the same missionary mandate that was given 2000 years ago by Jesus *to go and make disciples*. This has not changed and cannot change despite the many changes that have happened and will happen in our world. So, we boldly enter into this future with a vision that is both inspirational and hopeful. You have probably heard this vision in statement form:

The vision of St. Mary Star of the Sea parish is to invite the parish family to know and receive the love and fullness of life that is offered by Jesus Christ and to share His love and life with others as His disciples.

But as they say a picture is worth 1000 words. So, in prayer, I received that picture: a lighthouse. But not any lighthouse the one by Snug Harbour and is a landmark of Port Credit. It is a place where people gather and take pictures. But then I asked: "Shouldn't this be St. Mary's?" And then a word came to describe the picture: *A harbour of refuge, a beacon of hope*.

Where we are going as a parish requires us to become the lighthouse of Port Credit. Where we, a broken people in a broken world can come and find refuge - in prayer, in the sacraments, in a community that is hospitable and where people feel safe and belong. But to also radiate hope to those who are searching, maybe lost to find a way home back to the Church, our Mother.

Each of us are being invited to that vision: a lighthouse. Every time you walk, drive or go past that lighthouse, think of St. Mary's and how we are to become a harbour of refuge and beacon of hope in Port Credit. We know that the light is not ours, it is Christ who came into the world to enlighten the hearts of men and women. And he invites us to Come and See, to walk with him, to receive that light and let it shine forth.

SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL FEAST DAY – SEPTEMBER 27

When Blessed Frederic Ozanam began his work of assisting the poor in Paris, he decided to name his organization after another Frenchman he admired greatly, St. Vincent de Paul, whose feast day was this past Friday. St. Vincent founded a religious order known as the Vincentians (with 4,000 members in 86 countries), and co-founded the Daughters of Charity with Ste. Louise de Marillac. He dedicated his life to the service of the poor. St. Vincent is sometimes referred to as "the Apostle of Charity" and "the Father of the Poor". He is the patron saint of charitable societies.

TO HOPE AND ACT WITH CREATION SEASON OF CREATION 2024

October 4th, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, who is the patron saint of ecologists, brings the Season of Creation to an end. However, caring for all of God's creation is a yearlong endeavour. Hopefully, we can continue to look for ways to cut our consumption and live lives of simplicity, delighting in creation and consumed with love for Christ as St. Francis modeled for us.

On September 29, 2024 we celebrate the 110th World Day of Migrants and Refugees. Unfortunately, the world still experiences conflict, natural disasters and economic crises that displace millions of people from their homes, many of whom face oppression and exploitation. We are called to show love and compassion to migrants and refugees who are our sisters and brothers, and work towards a solution not only for their resettlement but also to improve conditions in their native land.

Our parish has previously sponsored 4 families from different parts of the world. It was a wonderful and spiritual experience for the members of St. Mary's Resettlement Committee. Most of the committee members have either moved to other parishes or have retired due to an increase in age. What a great opportunity to show Christ's love and compassion it would be for younger parishioners to continue this practice by forming a new Resettlement Committee, and contacting ORAT (Office for Refugees – Archdiocese of Toronto) to offer to sponsor a refugee family.

Let us pray:

God, Father Almighty, grant us the grace to work tirelessly for justice, solidarity and peace, so that all your children may enjoy the freedom to choose whether to migrate or to stay. Grant us the courage to denounce all the horrors of our world, and to combat every injustice that mars the beauty of your children and the harmony of our common home. Sustain us by the power of your Spirit, so that we can reflect your tender love to every migrant whom you place in our path, and to spread in hearts and in every situation the culture of encounter and of care. Amen. (Pope Francis)
