PASTOR'S BLOG

This might seem like a trend and maybe it will become one but in my homily on the 4th Sunday of Easter, known as Good Shepherd Sunday, I preached about our need for God and our need for community. This need is revealed by the spiritual disease that plagues our time: loneliness and despair.

Now, you might be thinking, "Father is just saying what members in the Church are observing." But, the world also sees the human person's need for community. When I was first ordained and assigned to a parish in Pickering, St. Isaac Jogues, I went looking for a gym. There were many places to go and some with good incentives (cheaper, better amenities), but I found myself at a CrossFit gym which was more expensive with very little amenities. Why? Because they did a great job marketing and sold me on the community aspect of CrossFit. It is class based, you are with other like minded people having the same goals of becoming "the best version of yourself". And I enjoyed it. The workouts were challenging, the coaches were very welcoming, and the people I was working out with made me feel like I belonged. While it was difficult to leave St. Isaac's, my first assignment as a priest, it was also difficult to leave my CrossFit gym and the people that I had been training with for almost one and half years.

In reflecting on this experience, CrossFit is not the only brand that markets themselves as a community oriented experience. Pretty much every gym sells itself based on group class workouts. F45 gyms describe themselves as "a global fitness community specializing in innovative, high-intensity group workouts that are fast, fun, and results-driven." From the Orangetheory website we find: "Orangetheory is a total-body group workout that combines science, coaching and technology to guarantee maximum results from the inside out. Our workout is not HIIT. It is heart rate-based interval training, where you train through 5 heart rate zones designed to charge your metabolism for MORE caloric afterburn, MORE results, and MORE confidence, all to deliver you MORE LIFE. Orangetheory is more than a gym because the work you do here in our studio will make all the difference out there in your world."

The language, "global-fitness community" and "more than a gym...will make all the difference out there in your world" are the selling points for these gyms. People will pay more money for this experience. Why? Because of our need for community. And while the need for community is met, the rest of it is pretty empty because it becomes all about the self - personal bests, competing with your personal results.

Through these observations that I have been making over many years, I ask the question, why not the Church? The Church challenges me to grow in my relationship with God and with others and be "the best version of myself", we are a global community, and when we live out the obedience of faith, we will make a difference in the world. So what is lacking? Belonging.

Hospitality is not just the "ministry" of a group of people in the Church. Hospitality is to be the heart of everyone: To be open to God and open to one another by welcoming them. I heard a statistic recently that it takes 7 minutes for a new comer to a parish to make a decision if they will return to the parish...to feel like they belong. These 7 minutes are before the opening hymn begins, and before father preaches a homily.

Going back to my experience at the CrossFit gym, when I walked into my first class, I knew that even though I knew nothing about the lifts and the progression of the class, I knew that I was supported by the coaches and by all the other participants. I was warmly welcomed with a handshake, was given a high five and a word of support because I was nervous about the class and not knowing anything. They helped me get through that class and guess what, I went back for more.

So, something to think about especially as we come to the Sacramental season where we celebrate First Holy Communions (this Sunday April 28th at 11am) and Confirmations (Saturday May 18th at 5pm). Are we opening our lives and our hearts to God so that we are able to be warm and open to one another especially the stranger or the person we don't know? For us and for them, that one smile, that simple handshake, that word of welcome: Life sharing can be life changing.
