## PASTOR'S BLOG

### The Conclave

We received news on Monday that the College of Cardinals have decided, following the nine days of mourning (*Novendiales*) for the Pope, to schedule the beginning of the [Conclave on May 7th](#). While we continue to pray for the repose of the soul of Pope Francis, we should also begin to pray for the Cardinals gathered as they discuss, discern and decide on the next Pope:

Heavenly Father, we pray in union with the whole Church for the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Cardinals. May the Princes of the Church listen attentively to Your Spirit during the conclave.

Almighty God, we pray that the conclave brings us a Pope who pleases You by guiding Your Church to grow in faithfulness to You. We pray together with the intercession of our Mother Mary and all the Saints. Please Lord, protect and guide your Church during this time of transition.

Amen.

On Wednesday May 7th, I will offer the Mass for the election of a Pope for the Cardinals as they gather in Conclave.

### Rome: Day 4 - St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major and St. Peter in Chains

Watching bits and pieces of the coverage of the death of Pope Francis, from the visitation in St. Peter's Basilica, his funeral in St. Peter's Square to his burial in St. Mary Major, brought back fond memories of the pilgrimage in Rome. This penultimate blog on the pilgrimage definitely aligns with the events of last week.

Because we spent 4 days in Rome, our last day was not rushed, trying to get to see the last items on the agenda. It was a nice easy pace that allowed us to receive what the Lord wanted us to receive. We began the day by going back to St. John Lateran for a guided tour with our local guide. This time, we were more intentional about going through the Holy Door and realized, once we entered, there was a Mass being celebrated in the nave of the Church. Once again, this hindered our movement to walk around and see the beautiful statues and art that were around us. I have seen on film many times the statues of the apostles that are at the pillars of the Church, but to see them in person, their size and detail was inspiring. Other than St. John, we know that each of the Apostles suffered and died for the proclamation of the Good News, and each of the statues has the means in which they suffered and died for the faith. Once again, they tell the story of these "ordinary, uneducated" men and how their experience of the Resurrection transformed them and transformed the world around them.

After our tour, we went across the street to the [Scala Sancta](#) and climbed the steps that Jesus climbed in his trial before Pontius Pilate. Because it is a very holy site, great reverence is required - silence and no photos. As I walked up the stairs (the passage to do it on your knees was full), I offered up a decade of the Rosary, meditating on the sorrowful mysteries, for all those who suffer religious persecution in our world today. As I have noted, we have more martyrs for the faith today than the early Church, and much of that persecution is not physical violence but political in nature - the restriction of religious freedom. In our own country, this type of persecution is against conscience rights of physicians and doctors when it comes to abortion and euthanasia. Moreover, Frank Cardinal Leo - while we were in Rome - [wrote two letters](#), one with regard to the expansion of MAID and the other with regard to removing charitable status for charities that speak out against abortion. [The Catholic Register](#) (you can pick one up at the church if there are any left) has an article of what the effect of removing charitable status for charities will mean for the Catholic Church. After this election cycle, we must continue to pray for our elected officials to protect the most vulnerable in our society, both the unborn and the elderly and to defend religious freedom.

After our prayerful visit to the sanctuary of the holy steps was complete, we made our way over to St. Mary Major and walked through the last of the 4 Holy Doors of Rome. Our local guide provided us with the historical commentary on the major basilica of Rome, but I wandered off and started exploring alone. There was one item I wanted to see while visiting this Basilica and that was the icon of [Salus Populi Romani](#). The link gives the details of the icon and the reason why I wanted to visit and spend some time in prayer before it. Before Pope Francis died, I knew that this was an important basilica for him. Now with his testament, and his place of burial, it really rings home of the importance of this basilica in the life of the Church.

It was really crowded with a concert being sung and then a Mass with the Syro-Malabar community following, so I was able to sneak in and say my prayers.

It was nice, at this leg of the pilgrimage, to entrust the pilgrimage into Our Lady's hands and that she might intercede for a safe journey home.



Once we completed our visit of the Basilica, we said goodbye to our local guide and had some free time before Mass at St. Peter in Chains. During this time, I walked and found a nice restaurant to eat another pasta that is famous in Rome, *Cacio e Pepe*. Effectively, its a pasta that is covered lightly in a cheese and pepper sauce. Its such a simple recipe, but very delicious. I think it is one of the reasons why I enjoyed the meals...simple yet flavourful. After eating some pasta paired with a nice glass of wine, I wandered around some more to find a gelato spot. I could not come to Rome and not have gelato. It was not one of the spots that was recommended to me during my stay, but it hit the spot.

After a light lunch and walk, I found a nice Church to say my afternoon prayers. There was a saint buried in this obscure Church (I didn't take a picture and record who this was) and it speaks to life in Rome and Italy. You never know what surprise is in many of the Churches.

Our final spot for Rome before was celebrating Mass in St. Peter in Chains. In this Church, it was the experience of celebrating Mass in the side altar, where the Blessed Sacrament is reposed, and on the other side is the famous [Michelangelo's Moses](#) where tourists are walking, taking pictures and shows the distinction between tourist and pilgrims. In between the two spots, under the high altar, were the chains in which St. Peter was confined in before he was crucified upside down in Rome. But there was also something very obscure that gave me a great deal of joy: The sarcophagus of the 7 Maccabean martyrs.

There is one more blog to come on the pilgrimage, but you will have to wait until the end of the Easter season to read it - it will make sense when I release it why I chose to delay its publication...that and this one has reached a pretty good amount of words.


