DEACON'S BLOG

Last week, our Pastor introduced a wonderful initiative that is the commencement of a Prayer Ministry at our Parish. My Brothers and Sisters, great is the mystery of our faith. The Church professes this mystery in the Apostles' Creed and celebrates it in the sacramental liturgy, so that the life of the faithful may be conformed to Christ in the Holy Spirit to the glory of God the Father. This mystery, then, requires that the faithful believe in it, that they celebrate it, and that they live from it in a vital and personal relationship with the living and true God. This relationship is Prayer.

Saint Therese of the Little Flower once said. "For me, prayer is a surge of the heart, it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy."

Whether prayer is expressed in words or gestures, it is the whole person who prays. But in naming the source of prayer, Scripture speaks sometimes of the soul or the spirit, but most often of the heart (more than a thousand times). According to Scripture, it is the heart that prays. The wonder of prayer is revealed beside the well where we come seeking water: there, Christ comes to meet every human being. It is he who first seeks us and asks us for a drink. Jesus thirsts; his asking arises from the depths of God's desire for us. Whether we realize it or not, prayer is the encounter of God's thirst with ours. God thirsts that we may thirst for him.

Prayer is the living relationship of the children of God with their Father who is good beyond measure, with his Son Jesus Christ and with the Holy Spirit. Thus, the life of prayer is the habit of being in the presence of the thrice-holy God and in communion with him. This communion of life is always possible because, through Baptism, we have already been united with Christ.

Why is prayer important?

- ❖ It helps us focus on what is important—God, Heaven
- ❖ It helps us to stay hopeful in dark times
- ❖ It helps us feel connected to God on a deeper level
- ❖ It helps us deal with difficult emotions and situations
- ❖ It helps us find comfort and peace—puts us in a position to receive God's peace
- ❖ It helps us develop a stronger relationship with God—we open our hearts to him, he works in us and through us to become closer to him
- ❖ It helps us become more compassionate people—we become more like Jesus
- ❖ It gives us strength—a source of courage especially during difficult times
- ❖ It helps keep our minds and hearts clear—prayer can give clarity
- ❖ It is a way to communicate with Jesus for support and guidance
- ❖ Allows the Holy Spirit to mold us and make us more like Jesus
- ❖ It shows us the heart of God because we become one with Him
- ❖ The Lord commands us to pray—he says “When you pray....” not if you pray...
- ❖ It brings about change—change in the circumstances of our hearts

“Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you, do not worry about anything, rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer.”
