PASTOR'S BLOG

As we enter the month of May, one of the two months dedicated to our Blessed Mother Mary, I am reminded of the Marian pilgrimage from October 2023. After landing in Lisbon and visiting the Church where St. Anthony of Padua was born and raised, we made the journey to the shrine at Fatima. It was not very pleasant as it was raining and windy yet it was spiritually uplifting because we were able to participate in the candlelight vigils, celebrate Mass, learn a bit more about the shrine and learn about the significance of the apparitions to the three young children. With the message that Our Lady gave to the children, given the backdrop of the horrific First World War, to "Say the rosary every day, to bring peace to the world and end to the war", the shrine had the same sense of peace that I had felt when I visited Assisi.

There is much that can be said about the visit, but I would like to share with you two. The first has to do with the "Angel of Peace" that prepared the children before the apparitions of Mary. The angel taught them five prayers, and one of them was very powerful, especially in these times:

"Most Holy Trinity—Father, Son and Holy Spirit—I adore Thee profoundly. I offer Thee the most precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all the tabernacles of the world, in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges, and indifferences whereby He is offended. And through the infinite merits of His Most Sacred Heart and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I beg of Thee the conversion of poor sinners."

The second has to do with Our Lady saying, "My Immaculate Heart will Triumph". When I was ordained, one of the gifts I received was a picture of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and the lady who gave it to me said, say this prayer every year, consecrating your priesthood to her Immaculate Heart. Sure enough, I listened to the piety and devotion of my elders and it is truly a blessing in my life. What gives the assist to saying this particular prayer are the words of Cardinal Ratzinger's interpretation of the saying:

"The Heart open to God, purified by contemplation of God, is stronger than guns and weapons of every kind. The fiat of Mary, the word of her heart, has changed the history of the world, because it brought the Saviour into the world—because, thanks to her Yes, God could become man in our world and remains so for all time. The Evil One has power in this world, as we see and experience continually; he has power because our freedom continually lets itself be led away from God. But since God himself took a human heart and has thus steered human freedom towards what is good, the freedom to choose evil no longer has the last word. From that time forth, the word that prevails is this: "In the world you will have tribulation, but take heart; I have overcome the world" (Jn 16:33). The message of Fatima invites us to trust in this promise."


