PASTOR'S BLOG – SEPTEMBER 8, 2024

To give us a little break with all the excitement happening at the parish as we get to the midpoint of September, I figure we take a little break from the activities of the parish and give a couple of updates.

Construction Update

The renewal and restoration of the front steps of the parish hit the ground running at the beginning of July. However, we always knew that the timeline of the project was dependent on the ordering and delivery of the new granite stones to replace the stair treads and risers. Unfortunately, we put the order out at a time when the quarry was busy with other orders and we won't have the granite until mid October. While this does put us back on time, we are grateful that the project will be complete before the temperatures enter into a range when the work cannot be done due to manufacturers specifications on install. Once again, thank you for your patience with this project and we hope, once complete, will bring a fresh look for our parish.

Pilgrimage Update

2025 is a Jubilee Year for the Universal Church. What is a Jubilee Year?

The tradition of the Jubilee has its roots in ancient Jewish customs, particularly the concept of the Jubilee Year outlined in the Old Testament. The Book of Leviticus states that a Jubilee Year should occur every 50 years, during which enslaved people would be freed, debts are forgiven, and the land returned to its original owners. This concept was later embraced by Christianity and incorporated into the Roman Catholic tradition. The first Christian Jubilee was officially declared by Pope Boniface VIII in 1300, making Rome the focal point for pilgrims seeking spiritual renewal.

The idea behind the Jubilee is to offer a time of forgiveness, mercy, and spiritual renewal. Pilgrims worldwide journey to Rome during the Jubilee Year, engaging in acts of devotion and seeking the remission of their sins. The pilgrimage is a profound spiritual experience, allowing participants to reflect on their lives, seek forgiveness, and strengthen their faith.

Over the centuries, the Jubilee has evolved, with subsequent popes declaring Jubilee Years to mark significant events or anniversaries in the Catholic Church. The tradition has expanded to include local Jubilees in dioceses worldwide. Each Jubilee brings a unique theme, emphasizing spiritual growth, mercy, and solidarity. While the frequency of Jubilees has varied, their core purpose remains deeply connected to the ancient traditions of forgiveness, renewal, and pilgrimage.

Pope Francis has given a theme to this jubilee year, "Pilgrims of Hope" and invites us to embark on pilgrimages and receive special indulgences sanctioned by the Church. So, if you have not put together any travel plans for 2025, here are two pilgrimages that I would like to bring to your attention.

Pilgrimage Tour to Italy

The first is joining me, Fr Michael Simoes, on a 12 day pilgrimage to Italy. The highlight of this pilgrimage is going to be our time in Rome where there are plenty of spiritual activities that are only available in Rome during a jubilee year. We will also be visiting Assisi, Siena, Florence, Milan and Orvieto. The pilgrimage will depart on February 20th and return on March 3rd. The cost of the pilgrimage is \$4,390 (tax and tip included based on double occupancy). Pilgrimage Tour to Poland, Hungary, Austria, and Czech Republic

See breathtaking landscapes with palaces, historical sights, and cruise along the most scenic section of the Danube River. SOCIETY OF SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL – REMEMBERING OUR FOUNDER AND PATRON

In 1833, Frederic Ozanam and a group of students from the Sorbonne University in France formed the St Vincent de Paul Society to take up the challenge of working with the desperately poor in Paris. They adopted St Vincent de Paul, a 16th century cleric renowned for his work with the poor, as their patron. The Society went on to become an international organization found in 130 countries with over a million members. The first Canadian conference began in Quebec in 1846 and in 1850 Toronto founded its first Conference at St Michael's Cathedral. The feast day of Blessed Frederic Ozanam is September 9. He died in 1853. The members of our Society look to him as a model of service as we go about our visits to the poor in their homes.

Frédéric Ozanam always respected the poor while offering whatever service he could. Each man, woman, and child was too precious to live in poverty. Serving the poor taught Frédéric something about God that he could not have learned elsewhere. (Franciscan media)
